11	An Act relating to roads and bridges; amending 69 O.S. 2011, Section 1521, as last amended by Section		
12	1, Chapter 17, O.S.L. 2020 (69 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1521), which relates to the Rebuilding		
13	Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund; clarifying language; requiring funds be authorized prior to		
14	budgeting and expenditure; updating references; eliminating obsolete references; eliminating certain		
15	exceptions; prioritizing certain apportionment amount; modifying apportionment calculations and		
16	amounts for certain fiscal years; prohibiting certain apportionment reduction; authorizing certain use of		
17	funds; prioritizing certain use of funds; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2011, Section 1521, as		
22	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 17, O.S.L. 2020 (69 O.S. Supp.		
23	2020, Section 1521), is amended to read as follows:		
24			

Section 1521. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury 1 2 a fund to be known as the "Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to 3 4 fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all appropriations and 5 transfers made by the Legislature. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and 6 7 expended each fiscal year by the Department of Transportation for the purposes authorized by subsection G F of this section in amounts 8 9 as authorized by the Oklahoma Legislature. Expenditures from the 10 fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 11 12 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and 13 payment.

14 Beginning July 1, 2019 2021, except for an amount equivalent В. 15 to the amount of revenue apportioned to the Rebuilding Oklahoma 16 Access and Driver Safety Fund pursuant to Section 6 of Enrolled 17 House Bill No. 1010 of the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the 56th 18 Oklahoma Legislature 500.4B of Title 68 and Section 1104 of Title 47 19 of the Oklahoma Statutes and from other sources apportioned to the 20 Fund by law, there shall be apportioned to the funds specified in 21 this subsection from the monies that would otherwise be apportioned 22 to the General Revenue Fund by Section 2352 of Title 68 of the 23 Oklahoma Statutes from the revenues derived pursuant to subsections 24

- b. the total amount apportioned to the Rebuilding
  Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund for the
  preceding fiscal year which, except for the amount
  prescribed by subparagraph a of this paragraph, shall
  be apportioned before any other amount is apportioned
  pursuant to Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma
  Statutes, plus
- c. an additional incremental amount which shall not be in
   excess of the amount prescribed by subparagraph a of
   this paragraph and that is required in order for the
   total apportionment to the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access
   and Driver Safety Fund from all sources for such
   fiscal year to equal:

All amounts apportioned pursuant to this paragraph shall be divided into twelve equal amounts to be apportioned each month

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during the fiscal year except the amount specified in subparagraph a of this paragraph which amount shall be allocated in its full amount in cash not later than July 30 each year or such later date as may be required in order for the amount to be allocated in cash; 2. For each fiscal year after the apportionments required by paragraph 1 of this subsection have been made:

- a. the next Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be
  apportioned to the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail
  Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 325 of
  Title 66 of the Oklahoma Statutes to be used for
  capital and operating costs for the "Heartland Flyer"
  rail project, and
- b. the next Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) shall
  be apportioned to the Public Transit Revolving Fund
  created pursuant to Section 4031 of this title to be
  used for purposes authorized by law other than the
  purpose described by subparagraph a of this paragraph.

18 All amounts apportioned pursuant to this paragraph shall be 19 divided into twelve equal amounts to be apportioned each month 20 during the fiscal year; and

21 3. a. Except as provided in subparagraph b of this
 22 paragraph, each fiscal year after the first fiscal
 23 year in which the total apportionment to the
 24 Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund as

1		provided by paragraph 1 of this subsection and from
2		other sources equals Five Hundred Seventy-five Million
3		Dollars (\$575,000,000.00), an amount in addition to
4		the amount prescribed by subparagraph a of paragraph 1
5		of this subsection collected pursuant to subsections
6		A, B and E of Section 2355 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma
7		Statutes and apportioned pursuant to Section 2352 of
8		Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes that would otherwise
9		be apportioned to the General Revenue Fund if needed
10		shall be apportioned to the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access
11		and Driver Safety Fund which in conjunction with all

16	until the total annual apportionment from such sources in addition
17	to the apportionments made pursuant to Section 6 of Enrolled House
18	Bill No. 1010 of the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the 56th Oklahoma
19	Legislature and Section 1104 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes to
20	the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund equals Five
21	Hundred Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$575,000,000.00). After such
22	annual apportionment level is reached, the apportionment to the fund
23	shall be governed by the provisions of paragraph 3 of subsection B
24	of this section; provided, that in no event shall the total amount

1 apportioned to the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund 2 in any fiscal year exceed Five Hundred Seventy-five Million Dollars 3 (\$575,000,000.00). Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall 4 be placed to the credit of the General Revenue Fund.

5 D. The monies apportioned to the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and 6 Driver Safety Fund shall not be used to supplant or replace existing 7 state funds used for transportation purposes.

E. D. In order to ensure that the funds from the ROADS Fund are 8 9 used to enhance and not supplant state funding for the Department of 10 Transportation, the State Board of Equalization shall examine and 11 investigate expenditures from the fund each year. For purposes of 12 this examination, monies used to retire outstanding debt obligations 13 for which the Department of Transportation is responsible shall be 14 At the meeting of the State Board of Equalization held excluded. 15 within five (5) days after the monthly apportionment in February of 16 each year, the State Board of Equalization shall issue a finding and 17 report which shall state whether expenditures from the ROADS Fund 18 were used to enhance or supplant state funding for the Department of 19 Transportation. If the State Board of Equalization finds that state 20 funding for the Department of Transportation was supplanted by funds 21 from the ROADS Fund, the Board shall specify the amount by which 22 such funding was supplanted. In this event, the Legislature shall 23 not make any appropriations for the ensuing fiscal year until an

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appropriation in that amount is made to replenish state funding for
 the Department of Transportation.

3 F. E. In the event that the Director of the Office of
4 Management and Enterprise Services declares a General Revenue Fund
5 revenue failure pursuant to Section 34.49 of Title 62 of the
6 Oklahoma Statutes, and agency allocations are reduced pursuant to
7 the provisions of Section 34.49 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
8 Statutes, the amounts that would otherwise be apportioned to the
9 ROADS Fund by:

Subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of this
 section, only to the extent that the amount is not required for debt
 service related to the obligations authorized pursuant to Section
 341 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes and, Section 1 of Enrolled
 House Bill No. 2744 of the 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma
 Legislature and Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2896 of the 1st
 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature;

17 2. Subparagraphs b and c of paragraph 1 of subsection B of this18 section; and

Subparagraphs a and b of paragraph 2 of subsection B of this
 section,

shall be reduced by a percentage equal to that required of the General Revenue Fund appropriations to state agencies and such reductions shall occur during the entire fiscal year and for any month during which such reductions are required by the Office of

Management and Enterprise Services and by the same percentage as
 that required of the agencies for such General Revenue Fund
 appropriations.

4 G. F. The Department of Transportation shall use the monies in
5 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund for:

6 1. The construction and maintenance of state roads, bridges and7 highways;

8 2. The direct expenses of operating and maintaining the state9 highway system, including bridges;

3. Direct expenses incurred in constructing, repairing, and maintaining state highways, farm-to-market roads, county highways and bridges as authorized by law;

13 4. Matching federal funds;

14 5. The purchase of materials, tools, machinery, motor vehicles, 15 and equipment necessary or convenient for the construction and 16 maintenance of the state highway system and bridges;

17 6. Debt service incurred prior to January 1, 2006, for Capital
18 Improvement Program bonds sold pursuant to Section 2001 of this
19 title; and

7. Debt service incurred on or after July 1, 2009, with respect to obligations authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 341 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes and, Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2744 of the 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature

## 1 and Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2896 of the 1st Session of 2 the 58th Oklahoma Legislature.

3 H. G. From the monies allocated pursuant to the provisions of 4 subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of this section each 5 fiscal year, the Department of Transportation shall make payments required for the payment of principal, interest and other costs 6 7 related to the obligations issued by the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority as authorized by Section 341 of Title 73 of 8 9 the Oklahoma Statutes and, Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2744 10 of the 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature and Section 1 of 11 Enrolled House Bill No. 2896 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma 12 Legislature, and such payments shall be made by the Department each 13 fiscal year before such monies are used for any other purpose. 14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021. 15 SECTION 3.
