9	An Act relating to professions and occupations;
10	amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 396.3 and 396.8, which relate to the Funeral Services Licensing Act;
11	modifying qualifications and examination requirements; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 396.3, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 396.3 A. The Oklahoma Funeral Board shall determine
18	the qualifications necessary to enable any person to practice as a
19	funeral director or embalmer, and prescribe the requirements for a
20	funeral establishment or commercial embalming establishment. The
21	Board shall examine all applicants for licenses to practice as a
22	funeral director or embalmer. The Board shall issue the proper
23	licenses to applicants who successfully pass such examination and
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1 qualify pursuant to any additional requirements the Board may 2 prescribe.

B. 1. Except as provided in subsection C of this section, the minimum requirements for a license to practice funeral directing or embalming, or both, are as follows:

6 An applicant for a license to practice funeral directing or 7 embalming shall be at least twenty (20) years of age, a legal resident of this state, and a citizen or permanent resident of the 8 9 United States. In addition, an applicant shall have at least sixty 10 (60) semester hours of study earned, measured in quarter or clock 11 hours, from a regionally accredited college or university, shall be 12 a graduate of a program of mortuary science accredited by the 13 American Board of Funeral Service Education, and have served one (1) 14 year as a registered apprentice. The applicant may serve as a 15 registered apprentice prior to enrollment in an approved school of 16 mortuary science, or subsequent to graduation from the school, and 17 pass the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Board 18 National Board Science Examination and/or Arts Examination with a 19 seventy-five (75) or higher score on each exam.

20 2. Curriculum of study for an embalmer and/or funeral director
21 is a program of mortuary science which shall be that prescribed by
22 the American Board of Funeral Service Education.

C. 1. If a person chooses not to meet the qualifications in
 subsection B of this section for a funeral director, the person may

1 alternatively qualify for a license to practice funeral directing, but not embalming, upon meeting the eligibility requirements of this 2 subsection as follows: An applicant for a license to practice 3 funeral directing shall be at least twenty (20) years of age, a 4 5 legal resident of this state, and a citizen or permanent resident of the United States. An applicant is required to complete a funeral 6 7 director course of study approved by the Oklahoma Funeral Board and that is administered by a program of funeral service/mortuary 8 9 science accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service 10 Education (ABFSE). The funeral director course of study shall 11 include at least thirty (30) semester hours or equivalent closely 12 following the ABFSE curriculum standard, limited to only: Business 13 Management, Cremation, Social Sciences/Humanities, Legal, Ethical, 14 Regulatory, plus essential elements of embalming, restorative art, 15 general concerns when dealing with human remains, a practicum 16 experience, and preparation for the required board exams. In 17 addition to the funeral director course of study the applicant is 18 required to complete at least sixty (60) additional semester hours 19 of study earned, measured in quarter or clock hours, from a 20 regionally accredited college or university and must complete a 21 twelve-month minimum term as a registered apprentice with employment 22 at a licensed establishment and must have assisted with twenty-five 23 arrangement conferences and assisted with twenty-five separate 24 funeral or memorial services under the supervision of a licensed

1 funeral director in this state. The applicant may serve as a 2 registered apprentice prior to enrollment in an approved school of mortuary science, concurrently while in mortuary school, or 3 4 subsequent to completion of the funeral director course of study. 5 2. Curriculum of study for a funeral director license shall be in a program of mortuary science which shall be that prescribed by 6 7 the Oklahoma Funeral Board. An applicant must pay all fees as provided in Section 396.4 of this title and pass an exam provided by 8 9 the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Board with 10 a seventy-five (75) or higher as well as pass a law exam provided by 11 the Oklahoma Funeral Board, with a seventy-five (75) or higher. A 12 license to practice as a funeral director issued pursuant to this 13 subsection shall be restricted to funeral director, and the licensee 14 shall not be eligible to practice as the funeral director in charge 15 as defined in Section 396.2 of this title.

16 3. If a person chooses not to meet the qualifications in 17 subsection B of this section for an embalmer, the person may 18 alternatively qualify for a license to practice embalming, upon 19 meeting the eligibility requirements of this subsection as follows: 20 An applicant for a license of this state, a citizen or permanent 21 resident of the United States, and of good moral character. An 22 applicant is required to complete an embalmer course of study 23 approved by the Oklahoma Funeral Board and that is administered by a 24 program of funeral service/mortuary science accredited by the

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1	American Board of Funeral Service Education (ABFSE). The embalmer
2	course of study shall include at least thirty (30) semester hours or
3	equivalent closely following the ABFSE curriculum standard, limited
4	to only: Biology, Chemistry, Microbiology, Human Anatomy,
5	Pathology, Embalming, Embalming Chemistry, and Restorative Art, plus
6	essential elements of grief, communication, and preparation for the
7	required board examinations. The applicant must also complete a
8	twelve-month minimum term as a registered apprentice with full-time
9	employment at a licensed establishment or licensed commercial
10	embalming establishment and must have assisted with twenty-five
11	embalmings under the supervision of a licensed embalmer in this
12	state. The applicant may serve as a registered apprentice prior to
13	enrollment in an approved school of mortuary science, concurrently
14	while in mortuary school, or subsequent to completion of the
15	embalmer course of study.
16	4. Curriculum of study for an embalmer license shall be in a
17	program of funeral service/mortuary science which shall be that
18	prescribed by the Oklahoma Funeral Board. An applicant must pay all
19	fees as provided in Section 396.4 of this title and pass the
20	embalmer examination provided by the International Conference of
21	Funeral Service Examining Board with a seventy-five or higher as
22	well as pass a law exam provided by the Oklahoma Funeral Board with
23	a seventy-five or higher. A license to practice as an embalmer
24	issued pursuant to this subsection shall be restricted to embalmer,

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1 and the licensee shall not be eligible to practice as the funeral 2 director in charge as defined in Section 396.2 of this title.

D. The Board shall issue the appropriate license to any qualified applicant whose application has been approved by the Board, and who has paid the fees required by Section 396.4 of this title, has passed the required examinations with a seventy-five (75) or higher score and has demonstrated to the Board proficiency as an embalmer or funeral director.

9 E. The Board shall maintain for public inspection a list of all10 accredited schools of embalming and mortuary science.

11 Each funeral director in charge as defined in Section 396.2 F. 12 of this title shall have a current dual funeral director and 13 embalmer license. A funeral director in charge of a funeral service 14 establishment or crematory that does not have a current dual funeral 15 director and embalmer license on the effective date of this act 16 shall be considered to be grandfathered and may serve as funeral 17 director in charge of any funeral service establishment or crematory 18 in accordance with rules prescribed by the Board, but shall not 19 serve as funeral director in charge of a commercial embalming 20 establishment which shall require a current dual funeral director 21 and embalmer license.

G. Upon the effective date of this act, and for one (1) year thereafter, the Board may issue a temporary funeral director or embalmer license in the event a statewide state of emergency is

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1 declared by the Governor and during such time as the state of 2 emergency is in effect.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 396.8, is 4 amended to read as follows:

Section 396.8 A. The Oklahoma Funeral Board shall have the
power to issue reciprocal licenses to applicants licensed in other
states which have equal or like educational requirements as required
by this state or the Board.

B. A license as an embalmer or funeral director shall be issued
without examination to an out-of-state resident intending to become
a resident of this state, who submits to the Board satisfactory
evidence that said applicant has met all the requirements of the
Funeral Services Licensing Act and pays the fees required by Section
396.4 of this title.

15 C. The Board may issue an appropriate license without further 16 apprenticeship to a resident of a state which does not have the same 17 educational requirements necessary for reciprocity with this state, 18 if said applicant:

Has a current license to practice as an embalmer or funeral
 director in the state of residence of the person;

21 2. Has been an active embalmer or funeral director practicing
22 in the state of residence of the person for at least five (5) years;
23 3. Has never been convicted of a felony crime that
24 substantially relates to the occupation of an embalmer or funeral

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1	director and poses a reasonable threat to public safety, and has
2	never been convicted of a misdemeanor related to funeral service;
3	4. Has never had said license revoked or suspended;
4	5. Is not currently facing disciplinary action;
5	6. Intends to practice in this state;
6	7. Has filed such documents as are required by the Board;
7	8. Has paid the fees as required by Section 396.4 of this
8	title;
9	9. Is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;
10	10. Is a graduate of an accredited program of mortuary science;
11	11. Has passed the National Board Examination or State Board
12	Examination administered by the International Conference of Funeral
13	Service Examination Board; and
14	12. Has passed the Oklahoma State Law Examination.
15	D. As used in this section:
16	1. "Substantially relates" means the nature of criminal conduct
17	for which the person was convicted has a direct bearing on the
18	fitness or ability to perform one or more of the duties or
19	responsibilities necessarily related to the occupation; and
20	2. "Poses a reasonable threat" means the nature of criminal
21	conduct for which the person was convicted involved an act or threat
22	of harm against another and has a bearing on the fitness or ability
23	to serve the public or work with others in the occupation.
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1	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
