COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to the Grand River Dam Authority;
amending 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, which relates
to Grand River Dam Authority exemptions; providing
for certain Oklahoma Open Records Act exemptions; and
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 862.1 In addition to the powers, rights and privileges
enumerated in Section 862 of this title, the Grand River Dam
Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of ~~the~~:

1. The Oklahoma Open Records Act, exclusively limited to:

a. customer proprietary information the Authority is
contractually obligated to keep confidential, and

b. security plans and procedures in its role as an
electric utility regulated by the federal government,

- 1 c. information related to the security of electrical or
2 dam infrastructure and related information systems
3 that, if misused, could facilitate actual, potential,
4 or threatened interference with, attack on, compromise
5 of, or incapacitation of such infrastructure or
6 information systems, including information related to
7 the ability of such infrastructure or information
8 systems to resist such interference, compromise, or
9 incapacitation, including any planned or past
10 assessment, projection, or estimate of the
11 vulnerability of critical infrastructure or
12 information system, security testing, risk evaluation
13 thereto, risk management planning, operational plans,
14 structural schematics, recovery of response plans or
15 risk audits, and
16 d. proprietary or commercial information received subject
17 to a nondisclosure agreement or confidentiality
18 agreement;

19 2. The Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, exclusively limited to
20 authorizing the Grand River Dam Authority Board of Directors to
21 confer on:

- 22 a. coal or gas fuel supply and transportation contracts,
23 b. power purchase agreements, and

1 c. security plans and procedures in its role as an
2 electric utility regulated by the federal government;

4 3. Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

5 4. The Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination
6 Act;

7 5. The State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

8 6. The Surplus Property Act; provided that the district may, on
9 a transactional basis, elect to make itself subject to the
10 requirements of the Surplus Property Act.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
