11	An Act relating to the healing arts; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 725.1, 725.2, 731.2, 731.5, and
12	887.14, which relate to professions and occupations; authorizing certain physical therapists to use
13	certain titles; updating statutory references; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-116, which relates
14	to definitions used in the Oklahoma Health Care Information System Act; clarifying applicability of
15	certain definition; and providing an effective date.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 725.1, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	Section 725.1. A. Every person who writes or prints, or causes
22	to be written or printed, his or her name (whether or not the word
23	"Doctor", or an abbreviation thereof, is used in connection
24	therewith) in connection with, as engaging in, or holding himself or

herself out as engaging in, any of the branches of the healing art shall append to his or her name the letters or words set forth in Section 725.2 of this title if the person is one of the <u>nine ten</u> classes of persons listed in subsection A of Section 725.2 of this title.

B. If the person is not one of the nine ten classes of persons
listed in subsection A of Section 725.2 of this title and is engaged
in a branch of the healing art, the person shall write or print, in
the same size letters as his or her name, appropriate and generally
and easily understood words or letters, which clearly show and
indicate the branch of the healing art in which he or she is
licensed to practice and is engaged.

13SECTION 2.AMENDATORY59 O.S. 2021, Section 725.2, is14amended to read as follows:

15 Section 725.2. A. The following <u>nine ten</u> classes of persons 16 may use the word "Doctor", or an abbreviation thereof, and shall 17 have the right to use, whether or not in conjunction with the word 18 "Doctor", or any abbreviation thereof, the following designations:

The letters "D.P.M." or the words podiatrist, doctor of
 podiatry, podiatric surgeon, or doctor of podiatric medicine by a
 person licensed to practice podiatry under the Podiatric Medicine
 Practice Act;

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2. The letters "D.C." or the words chiropractor or doctor of
 chiropractic by a person licensed to practice chiropractic under the
 Oklahoma Chiropractic Practice Act;

3. The letters "D.D.S." or "D.M.D.", as appropriate, or the
words dentist, doctor of dental surgery, or doctor of dental
medicine, as appropriate, by a person licensed to practice dentistry
under the State Dental Act;

8 4. The letters "M.D." or the words surgeon, medical doctor, or 9 doctor of medicine by a person licensed to practice medicine and 10 surgery under the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure 11 and Supervision Act;

12 5. The letters "O.D." or the words optometrist or doctor of 13 optometry by a person licensed to practice optometry under Sections 14 581 through 606 of this title;

15 6. The letters "D.O." or the words surgeon, osteopathic
16 surgeon, osteopath, doctor of osteopathy, or doctor of osteopathic
17 medicine by a person licensed to practice osteopathy under the
18 Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act;

19 7. The letters "Ph.D.", "Ed.D.", or "Psy.D." or the words 20 psychologist, therapist, or counselor by a person licensed as a 21 health service psychologist pursuant to the Psychologists Licensing 22 Act;

8. The letters "Ph.D.", "Ed.D.", or other letters representing
a doctoral degree or the words language pathologist, speech

pathologist, or speech and language pathologist by a person licensed as a speech and language pathologist pursuant to the Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology Licensing Act and who has earned a doctoral degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning in the field of speech and language pathology; and

9. The letters "Ph.D.", "Ed.D.", or other letters representing
a doctoral degree or the word audiologist by a person licensed as an
audiologist pursuant to the Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology
Licensing Act and who has earned a doctoral degree from a regionally
accredited institution of higher learning in the field of audiology;
and

12 <u>10. The letters "D.P.T." or the title Doctor of Physical</u>
 13 <u>Therapy by a person licensed to practice physical therapy under the</u>
 14 <u>Physical Therapy Practice Act who has earned a Doctor of Physical</u>
 15 <u>Therapy degree from a program approved by a national accrediting</u>
 16 <u>body recognized by the State Board of Medical Licensure and</u>
 17 Supervision.

B. Unless otherwise specifically provided in a particular section or chapter of the Oklahoma Statutes, the word "doctor" or "doctors" shall mean and include each of the <u>nine ten</u> classes of persons listed in subsection A and the word "physician" or "physicians", as provided in subsection C of this section. Any other person using the term doctor, or any abbreviation thereof,

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shall designate the authority under which the title is used or the
 college or honorary degree that gives rise to use of the title.

C. Unless otherwise specifically provided in a particular 3 section or chapter of the Oklahoma Statutes, the word "physician" or 4 5 "physicians" shall mean and include each of the classes of persons listed in paragraphs 1 through 6 of subsection A of this section and 6 the word "doctor" or "doctors" as provided in subsection B of this 7 The term "physician" shall not include any person 8 section. 9 specified in paragraphs 7 through 9 10 of subsection A of this section unless such person is otherwise authorized to use such 10 designation pursuant to this section. 11

D. For purposes of this section, "provider" means and includes: 13 1. Each of the <u>nine ten</u> classes of persons listed in subsection 14 A of this section and referred to in subsections B and C of this 15 section; and

Any other person using the term doctor or any abbreviation
 thereof.

E. Persons in each of the <u>nine ten</u> classes listed in subsection A <u>of this section</u>, and referred to in subsections B and C₇ of this section shall identify through written notice, which may include the wearing of a name tag, the type of license under which the doctor is practicing, utilizing the designations provided in subsections A, B and C of this section. Each applicable licensing board is

authorized by rule to determine how its license holders may comply
 with this disclosure requirement.

3 F. 1. Any advertisement for health care services naming a 4 provider shall:

- a. identify the type of license of the doctor utilizing
 the letters or words set forth in this section if the
 person is one of the classes of persons listed in
 subsection A of this section, and referred to in
 subsections B and C of this section, or
- b. utilize appropriate, accepted, and easily understood
 words or letters, which clearly show and indicate the
 branch of the healing art in which the person is
 licensed to practice and is engaged in, if the person
 is not one of the nine ten classes of persons listed
 in subsection A of this section, or referred to in
 subsections B and C of this section.

17 2. The term "advertisement" includes any printed document 18 including letterhead, video clip, or audio clip created by, for, or 19 at the direction of the provider or providers and advertised for the 20 purpose of promoting the services of the doctor or provider.

G. 1. It shall be unlawful for any medical doctor, doctor of osteopathic medicine, doctor of dental surgery, doctor of dental medicine, doctor of optometry, doctor of podiatry, or doctor of chiropractic to make any deceptive or misleading statement, or

engage in any deceptive or misleading act, that deceives or misleads the public or a prospective or current patient, regarding the training and the license under which the person is authorized to practice.

5 2. The term "deceptive or misleading statement or act"6 includes, but is not limited to:

such statement or act in any advertising medium, 7 a. b. making a false statement regarding the education, 8 9 skills, training, or licensure of a person, or с. in any other way describing the profession, skills, 10 training, expertise, education, or licensure of a 11 12 person in a fashion that causes the public, a potential patient, or current patient to believe that 13 the person is a medical doctor, doctor of osteopathic 14 medicine, doctor of dental surgery, doctor of dental 15 medicine, doctor of optometry, doctor of podiatry, or 16 doctor of chiropractic when that person does not hold 17 such credentials. 18

H. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a person licensed in this state to perform speech pathology or audiology services is designated to be a practitioner of the healing art for purposes of making a referral for speech pathology or audiology services pursuant to the provisions of the Individuals

with Disabilities Education Act, Amendment of 1997, Public Law 105 17, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 731.2, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 731.2. A. Proof that any class of persons identified in Section 725.2 of this title appends to their name the word 6 "Doctor", the abbreviation "Dr.", or any other word, abbreviation or 7 designation, which word, abbreviation or designation, indicate that 8 9 such person is qualified for diagnosis or treatment, as herein defined, shall constitute prima facie evidence that such person is 10 holding himself or herself out, within the meaning of this act 11 12 Sections 731.1 through 731.6 of this title, as qualified to engage in diagnosis or treatment. 13

B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a person specified in paragraphs 7 through 9 <u>10</u> of subsection A of Section 725.2 of this title from appending to such person's name the word "Doctor", so long as such person follows such name and designation with the letters signifying the recognized doctoral degrees specified in paragraphs 7 through 9 <u>10</u> of subsection A of Section 725.2 of this title.

21 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 731.5, is 22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 731.5. Nothing in this act Sections 731.1 through 731.6 24 of this title shall apply to:

Any commissioned officer in any of the healing arts licensed
 as such in the United States Army, Navy, Marines, Public Health
 Service, or Marine Hospital Service, in the discharge of the
 professional duties of such officer;

2. Any legally qualified person when engaged exclusively in the
practice of the particular profession of such person, as defined by
law;

8 3. Any licensed person practicing any of the healing arts from
9 another state or territory, when in actual consultation with a
10 licensed practitioner in this state;

Any physician's trained assistant who is assisting a
 licensed physician to render services within the licensed scope of
 practice of the physician, if the assistant is under the supervision
 and control of the physician;

15 5. Any student in any recognized school of the healing arts in 16 carrying out prescribed courses of study provided such school is a 17 recognized institution by the statutes of Oklahoma, and its 18 practitioners are duly licensed as prescribed by law;

The practice of those who endeavor to prevent, or cure,
 disease or suffering, by spiritual means or prayer; or

7. Any legally qualified person specified in paragraphs 7
through 9 10 of subsection A of Section 725.2 of this title in the
discharge of the professional duties of the person, so long as such

person is employed by any state or governmental agency, or any
 recognized college or university.

3 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 887.14, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 887.14. Any person holding a license pursuant to the provisions of the Physical Therapy Practice Act as a physical 6 therapist may use the title "Physical Therapist", "Registered 7 Physical Therapist", or "Licensed Physical Therapist", or the 8 9 letters "P.T.", "R.P.T.", or "L.P.T.", as authorized by the license 10 obtained from the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. 11 Any person holding a license pursuant to the provisions of the 12 Physical Therapy Practice Act as a physical therapist who has earned a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from a program approved by a 13 national accrediting body recognized by the Board may use the title 14 "Doctor of Physical Therapy" or the letters "D.P.T.". 15 AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-116, is SECTION 6. 16 amended to read as follows: 17 Section 1-116. When used in the Oklahoma Health Care 18 Information System Act: 19 "Board" means the State Board of Health; 1. 20 "Commissioner" means the State Commissioner of Health; 2. 21 3. "Department" means the State Department of Health; 22 "Health care providers" means a hospital or related 4. 23 institution licensed pursuant to Section 1-702 of this title, 24

nursing facilities licensed pursuant to Section 1-1903 of this title, physicians as specified in paragraphs 1 through 7 <u>6</u> of subsection A of Section 725.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, physical therapists, physician assistants, pharmacists, nurses and home health care providers licensed pursuant to the laws of this state;

7 5. "Third-party payor" means any entity, other than a
8 purchaser, which is responsible for payment either to the purchaser
9 or the health care provider for health care services rendered by the
10 health care provider;

11 6. "Public-supported provider" means any public or private 12 entity supported in whole or in part by federal or state funds, or 13 any health care provider contracting with the state for providing 14 health care services including, but not limited to, Medicaid;

15 7. "Identifying information" means a program identifying number 16 assigned for purposes of statistical and data analysis, which 17 protects and maintains patient and physician anonymity. Identifying 18 information shall remain confidential as provided in Section 1-120 19 of this title;

8. "Information providers" means and includes health care
 providers, third-party payors or public-supported providers required
 to report or submit information to the Division of Health Care
 Information pursuant to the Oklahoma Health Care Information System
 Act;

1	9. "Division" means the Division of Health Care Information;
2	and
3	10. "Health care information system" means the system for
4	receipt, collection, analysis, evaluation, processing, utilization
5	and dissemination of health care data established and maintained by
6	the Division of Health Care Information pursuant to the Oklahoma
7	Health Care Information System Act.
8	SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
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
