AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 940, is amended to read as follows: 14 Section 940. A. All law enforcement officers and other state 15 and county officials shall cooperate with the Chief Medical Examiner 16 17 and all other medical examiners in making investigations required pursuant to the provisions of Sections 931 through 954 of this 18 title. Said The officials and the physician in attendance of the 19 deceased, or other persons when the deceased was unattended by a 20 physician, shall promptly notify the medical examiner of the 21 occurrence of all deaths coming to their attention which, pursuant 22 to the provisions of Sections 931 through 954 of this title, are 23 24

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subject to investigation, and shall assist in making dead bodies and
related evidence available for investigation.

Subject to the provisions of Sections 931 through 954 of this 3 title, bodies shall not be disturbed until authorized by the Chief 4 5 Medical Examiner or his or her designee and the representative of any law enforcement agency which has begun an investigation of the 6 cause of death. Said The authorization may be given by telephone. 7 Nothing in Sections 931 through 954 of this title shall prevent the 8 9 district attorney, or his or her designee, or the responding law 10 enforcement officer from authorizing the removal of a body when the removal is determined to be in the public interest and conditions at 11 12 the scene are adequately documented and preserved by photographs and 13 measurements.

B. The death of any patient, inmate, ward, or veteran in a state hospital or other institution shall be reported by the chief administrative officer of the hospital or institution or his or her designee to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner at the time of the death and prior to release of the body.

Within thirty-six (36) hours, a written report shall be
submitted and shall be accompanied by true and correct copies of all
medical records of the hospital or institution concerning the
deceased patient.

23 2. The Chief Medical Examiner shall have the authority to24 require production of any records, documents, or equipment or other

2	the death.
