It is unlawful for any person to willfully and with fraudulent intent obtain the name, address, Social Security 16 number, date of birth, place of business or employment, debit, 17 credit or account numbers, driver license number τ or any other 18 personal identifying information of another person, living or dead, 19 with intent to use, sell, or allow any other person to use or sell 20 such personal identifying information to obtain or attempt to obtain 21 money, credit, goods, property, or service in the name of the other 22 23 person without the consent of that person.

B. It is unlawful for any person to use with fraudulent intent
the personal identity of another person, living or dead, or any
information relating to the personal identity of another person,
living or dead, to obtain or attempt to obtain credit or anything of
value.

C. It is unlawful for any person with fraudulent intent to
lend, sell, or otherwise offer the use of such person's own name,
address, Social Security number, date of birth, or any other
personal identifying information or document to any other person
with the intent to allow such other person to use the personal
identifying information or document to obtain or attempt to obtain
any identifying document in the name of such other person.

D. It is unlawful for any person to willfully create, modify, alter or change any personal identifying information of another person with fraudulent intent to obtain any money, credit, goods, property, service or any benefit or thing of value, or to control, use, waste, hinder or encumber another person's credit, accounts, goods, property, title, interests, benefits or entitlements without the consent of that person.

E. Any person convicted of violating any provision of this section shall be guilty of identity theft. Any person who violates the provisions of subsection A, B or D of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of not less than

1	one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or a fine not to exceed
2	One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), or by both such fine and
3	imprisonment. Any person who violates the provisions of subsection
4	A, B or D of this section, and the victim is an individual who is
5	less than eighteen (18) years of age, shall, upon conviction, be
6	guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the
7	Department of Corrections for a term of not less than two (2) years
8	nor more than ten (10) years, or a fine not to exceed One Hundred
9	Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), or by both such fine and
10	imprisonment. Any person who violates the provisions of subsection
11	C of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor
