13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.32, as
15	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 331, O.S.L. 2019 (62 O.S. Supp.
16	2020, Section 34.32), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 34.32. A. The Information Services Division of the
18	Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall create a standard
19	security risk assessment for state agency information technology
20	systems that complies with the International Organization for
21	Standardization (ISO) and the International Electrotechnical
22	Commission (IEC) Information Technology - Code of Practice for
23	Security Management (ISO/IEC 27002).

- B. Each state agency that has an information technology system shall obtain an information security risk assessment to identify vulnerabilities associated with the information system. The Information Services Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall approve not less than two firms which state agencies may choose from to conduct the information security risk assessment.
- C. A state agency with an information technology system that is 9 not consolidated under the Information Technology Consolidation and 10 Coordination Act or that is otherwise retained by the agency shall 11 additionally be required to have an information security audit 12 conducted by a firm approved by the Information Services Division that is based upon the most current version of the NIST Cyber-13 Security Framework, and shall submit a final report of the 14 15 information security risk assessment and information security audit findings to the Information Services Division each year on a 16 schedule set by the Information Services Division. Agencies shall 17 also submit a list of remedies and a timeline for the repair of any 18 deficiencies to the Information Services Division within ten (10) 19 days of the completion of the audit. The final information security 20 risk assessment report shall identify, prioritize, and document 21 information security vulnerabilities for each of the state agencies 22 assessed. The Information Services Division may assist agencies in 23

- 1 repairing any vulnerabilities to ensure compliance in a timely 2 manner.
 - D. Subject to the provisions of subsection C of Section 34.12 of this title, the Information Services Division shall report the results of the state agency assessments and information security audit findings required pursuant to this section to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate by the first day of January of each year. Any state agency with an information technology system that is not consolidated under the Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act that cannot comply with the provisions of this section shall consolidate under the Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act.
- This act section shall not apply to state agencies subject 14 15 to mandatory North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) cybersecurity standards and institutions within The Oklahoma State 16 System of Higher Education, the Social Security Disability 17 Determination Services Division of the Department of Rehabilitation 18 Services, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and 19 the telecommunications network known as OneNet that follow the 20 International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and the 21 International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) - Security techniques -22 Code of Practice for Information Security Controls or National 23 Institute of Standards and Technology. 24
