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7 An Act relating to driver licenses; amending 47 O.S.
8 2011, Section 6-110, as last amended by Section 1,
9 Chapter 395, O.S.L. 2019 (47 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section
10 6-110), which relates to examination of applicants
11 for driver licenses; allowing a public transit agency
12 to hire or employ certain examiners; requiring the
13 Department of Public Safety to approve at least one
14 public transit agency meeting certain criteria;
15 authorizing public transit agency to use third-party
16 examiners; modifying date for promulgation of rules;
17 amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-110.1, as amended by
18 Section 1, Chapter 137, O.S.L. 2020 (47 O.S. Supp.
19 2020, Section 6-110.1), which relates to
20 endorsements; allowing certain existing driver
21 license holders to test for only the new endorsement
22 sought; and providing an effective date.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-110, as
last amended by Section 1, Chapter 395, O.S.L. 2019 (47 O.S. Supp.
2020, Section 6-110), is amended to read as follows:

Section 6-110. A. 1. The Department of Public Safety shall
examine every applicant for an original Class A, B, C or D license
and for any endorsements thereon, except as otherwise provided in
Section 6-101 et seq. of this title or as provided in paragraph 2 of

1 this subsection or in subsections D and E of this section. The
2 examination shall include a test of the applicant's:

- 3 a. eyesight,
- 4 b. ability to read and understand highway signs
5 regulating, warning and directing traffic,
- 6 c. knowledge of the traffic laws of this state, including
7 a portion on bicycle and motorcycle safety, and
- 8 d. ability, by actual demonstration, to exercise ordinary
9 and reasonable control in the operation of a motor
10 vehicle. The actual demonstration shall be conducted
11 in the type of motor vehicle for the class of driver
12 license being applied for.

13 The Department may create a knowledge test that may be taken on the
14 Internet by an applicant applying for a Class D license.

15 Any licensee seeking to apply for a driver license of another class
16 which is not covered by the licensee's current driver license shall
17 be considered an applicant for an original license for that class.

18 2. The Department of Public Safety shall have the authority to
19 waive the requirement of any part of the examination required in
20 paragraph 1 of this subsection for those applicants whose driving
21 record meets the standards set by the Department of Public Safety
22 and ~~surrenders~~ surrender either of the following:

- 23 a. a valid unexpired driver license issued by any state
24 or country for the same type or types of vehicles, or

1 b. an expired driver license that:

2 (1) is not expired more than six (6) months past the
3 expiration date listed on the driver license, and

4 (2) is not a Class A, B or C commercial driver
5 license or commercial driver license permit.

6 3. The Department shall accept skills test results from another
7 state for Class A, B or C license applicants who have successfully
8 completed commercial motor vehicle driver training in that state and
9 successfully passed the skills test in that state; provided, the
10 Department shall not accept skills test results from another state
11 when the applicant has not successfully completed commercial motor
12 vehicle driver training in that state. Nothing in this section
13 shall be construed to prohibit the Department from administering the
14 skills test to any applicant who has successfully completed
15 commercial vehicle driver training in another state.

16 4. All applicants requiring a hazardous materials endorsement
17 shall be required, for the renewal of the endorsement, to
18 successfully complete the examination and to submit to a security
19 threat assessment performed by the Transportation Security
20 Administration of the Department of Homeland Security as required by
21 and pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 1572, which shall be used to
22 determine whether the applicant is eligible for renewal of the
23 endorsement pursuant to federal law and regulation.

1 5. The Department of Public Safety shall give the complete
2 examination as provided for in this section within thirty (30) days
3 from the date the application is received, and the examination shall
4 be given at a location within one hundred (100) miles of the
5 residence of the applicant. The Department shall make every effort
6 to make the examination locations and times convenient for
7 applicants. The Department shall consider giving the examination at
8 various school sites if the district board of education for the
9 district in which the site is located agrees and if economically
10 feasible and practicable.

11 B. Any person holding a valid Oklahoma Class D license or
12 provisional driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title
13 and applying for a Class A, B or C commercial license shall be
14 required to successfully complete all examinations as required for
15 the specified class. Failure to submit to the Department federally
16 required medical certification information pursuant to 49 C.F.R.,
17 Part 391.41 et seq. shall result in an automatic downgrade of a
18 commercial license to a Class D license. Provided, however, once
19 the required medical certification information has been received by
20 the Department, the license shall be reinstated to the
21 classification of the commercial license prior to the downgrade and
22 the holder of such a license shall not be required to reapply.

23 C. Except as provided in subsection E of Section 6-101 of this
24 title, any person holding a valid Oklahoma Class A, B or C

1 commercial license shall, upon time for renewal thereof, be entitled
2 to a Class D license without any type of testing or examination,
3 except for any endorsements thereon as otherwise provided for by
4 Section 6-110.1 of this title.

5 D. 1. Any certified driver education instructor who is
6 currently an operator or an employee of a commercial driver training
7 school in this state or any driver education instructor employed by
8 any school district in this state shall be eligible to apply to be a
9 designated examiner of the Department of Public Safety for the
10 purposes of administering the Class D driving skills portion of the
11 Oklahoma driving examination to any person who has not previously
12 been a student of the instructor.

13 2. The Department of Public Safety shall adopt a curriculum of
14 required courses and training to be offered to applicants who are
15 qualified to apply to be a designated examiner. The courses and
16 training for certification shall meet the same standards as required
17 for driver examiners of the Department of Public Safety.

18 3. Each person applying to be a designated examiner shall be
19 required to pay an initial designated examiner certification fee of
20 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Upon successful completion of
21 training prescribed by paragraph 2 of this subsection, the person
22 shall be required to pay an annual designated examiner certification
23 fee of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). If an applicant for the
24 designated examiner program is employed by an Oklahoma public school

1 system that offers driver education, and he or she administers the
2 skills test only to students enrolled in a public school driver
3 education program, the certification fee may be waived by the
4 Department. Each designated examiner certification shall expire on
5 the last day of the calendar year and may be renewed upon
6 application to the Department of Public Safety. The designated
7 examiner certification fees collected by the Department pursuant to
8 this subsection shall be deposited to the credit of the Department
9 of Public Safety Restricted Revolving Fund to be used for the
10 purposes of this subsection. No designated examiner certification
11 fee shall be refunded in the event that certification is denied,
12 suspended or revoked.

13 4. A designated examiner may charge a fee of no more than
14 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each Class D driving skills
15 examination given, whether the person being examined passes or fails
16 the examination.

17 5. The Department shall conduct an annual complete nationwide
18 criminal history background check on each designated examiner and a
19 complete nationwide criminal history background check on each
20 designated examiner applicant. The fees for the background check
21 shall be borne by the designated examiner or designated examiner
22 applicant.

23 6. The Department of Public Safety shall promulgate rules to
24 implement and administer the provisions of this subsection.

1 E. 1. Upon application and approval of the Commissioner of ~~the~~
2 ~~Department of~~ Public Safety, any public or private commercial truck
3 driving school that has or maintains a program instructing students
4 for a Class A, B or C license, public transit agency or state,
5 county or municipal government agency in the State of Oklahoma shall
6 be authorized to hire or employ designated examiners approved by the
7 Department of Public Safety to be third-party examiners of the Class
8 A, B or C driving skills portion of the Oklahoma driving
9 examination. All designated examiners must successfully have
10 completed the courses and training as outlined in paragraph 2 of
11 this subsection. The Department of Public Safety shall be required
12 to approve at least one public transit agency that has or maintains
13 a program instructing students for a Class A, B or C license to hire
14 or employ third-party examiners pursuant to this section. It shall
15 be permissible for any public transit agency operating in the State
16 of Oklahoma to utilize the third-party examiners hired or employed
17 by a public transit agency approved by the Department.

18 2. The Department of Public Safety shall adopt a curriculum of
19 required courses and training to be offered to third-party
20 examiners. The courses and training for certification shall meet
21 the same standards as required for commercial driver examiners of
22 the Department of Public Safety.

23 3. The Department shall conduct on an annual basis a complete
24 nationwide criminal history background check on each third-party

1 examiner and a complete nationwide criminal history background check
2 on each third-party examiner applicant. The fees for the background
3 check shall be borne by the third-party examiner or third-party
4 examiner applicant.

5 F. The Department of Public Safety shall promulgate rules no
6 later than December 15, ~~2019~~ 2021, to:

7 1. Implement and administer the provisions of this section
8 based on requirements set forth in Section 383.75 of Title 49 of the
9 Code of Federal Regulations;

10 2. Establish a process to inform any school ~~or~~, public transit
11 agency, examiner, or state, county or municipal government agency,
12 who has been denied, within forty-five (45) days from the denial;

13 3. Create an appeal process for any school ~~or~~, public transit
14 agency, examiner, or state, county or municipal government agency
15 denied; and

16 4. If the initial application for approval was denied, limit
17 the number of times an individual school ~~or~~, public transit agency,
18 individual examiner applicant, or state, county or municipal
19 government agency may reapply in a calendar year to two
20 reapplications.

21 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-110.1, as
22 amended by Section 1, Chapter 137, O.S.L. 2020 (47 O.S. Supp. 2020,
23 Section 6-110.1), is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 6-110.1 A. The following endorsements shall be placed
2 on an Oklahoma driver license to any person qualifying therefore as
3 determined by the Department of Public Safety. Any person having an
4 original Class A, B, C or D Oklahoma driver license shall only be
5 required to take the supporting written endorsement testing which is
6 required to endorse the original Class A, B, C or D Oklahoma driver
7 license.

8 Endorsement

 Authorizes the operation of:

9 "H"

A non-tank-type vehicle used to
transport hazardous materials in
placardable amounts pursuant to 49
C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F;

13 "M"

A motorcycle;

14 "N"

A tank vehicle as defined in Section
1-173.1 of this title;

16 "P"

A vehicle designed by the
manufacturer to transport sixteen or
more passengers, including the
driver;

20 "S"

A school bus;

21 "T"

A vehicle with double or triple
trailers;

23 "X"

A tank vehicle used to transport
hazardous materials in placardable

1 amounts pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part
2 172, subpart F.

3 B. The Department may also provide for additional endorsements
4 as may be needed or as otherwise provided for by law.

5 C. No person shall operate a motor vehicle requiring
6 endorsements as provided for in this section without having a valid
7 Class A, B, C or D license with the required endorsements.

8 D. All endorsements as provided for in this section must be
9 obtained prior to the operation of such vehicles. However, the
10 requirement for a hazardous materials endorsement is not required
11 for the operation of farm vehicles used to transport pesticides,
12 fertilizers, or other products integral to farming, but which are
13 defined as hazardous materials. If, after obtaining a hazardous
14 material endorsement, a person becomes ineligible for the hazardous
15 material endorsement pursuant to state or federal law, or both, or
16 any regulation, the Department of Public Safety shall provide notice
17 as provided in Section 2-116 of this title. A person will have
18 thirty (30) days from the date of the notice to appear at a
19 designated testing facility to apply and be issued a commercial
20 driver license without the endorsement. Failure to comply within
21 the required time shall be grounds for the Department of Public
22 Safety to disqualify the commercial driver license of the person
23 until compliance has been met.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
