11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1743 of Title 21, unless there
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. Any person who shall receive, transport, or possess in this
16 state one or multiple stolen automotive catalytic converters or the
17 components thereof under such circumstances that the person knew or
18 should have known that the same was stolen shall, upon conviction,
19 be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment in the
20 custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of not less than
21 one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or confined in the county
22 jail for a term of not less than ninety (90) days nor more than two
23 hundred (200) days, or fined not less than One Hundred Dollars

1 (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both
2 such fine and imprisonment.

3 B. As provided for in subsection A of this section, all
4 surrounding facts and circumstances should be considered when
5 determining whether a person knew or should have known that the item
6 was stolen, including, but not be limited to, the lack of
7 documentation regarding the original sale, purchase, or ownership of
8 said automotive catalytic converter.

9 C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to automotive
10 catalytic converters in use and attached to a vehicle.

11 D. As used in this section, "automotive catalytic converter"
12 means the emission control device that is part of the exhaust system
13 located on gas- or diesel-powered motor vehicles.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
