B. As provided for in subsection A of this section, all
surrounding facts and circumstances should be considered when
determining whether a person knew or should have known that the item
was stolen, including, but not be limited to, the lack of
documentation regarding the original sale, purchase, or ownership of
said automotive catalytic converter.

9 C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to automotive 10 catalytic converters in use and attached to a vehicle.

D. As used in this section, "automotive catalytic converter" means the emission control device that is part of the exhaust system located on gas- or diesel-powered motor vehicles.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
