AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter 15 expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title, 16 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless 17 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of 18 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No 19 person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at 20 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 of subsection F of this 21 section. 22 B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor 23 vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and 24 holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in

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paragraph 5 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.
 Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

5 2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle 6 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a 7 valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph 5 8 of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class B 9 commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in 10 Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this 11 subsection.

12 3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle 13 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a 14 valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F 15 of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial 16 license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C 17 and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection. 18 4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be 19 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be 20 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, 21 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section; 22 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be 23 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded 24

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for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F,
 except as provided in subsection F of this section.

5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who successfully completes all examinations required by law may be issued by the Department:

a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or

b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall
grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a
Class D motor vehicle.

14 6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
15 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
16 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this
17 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
18 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

19 C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section 20 may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and 21 highways in this state.

D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant

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1 for an original driver license shall be required to successfully 2 complete a written examination, vision examination and driving examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of 3 4 Public Safety, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic rider 5 course approved by the Department if the applicant is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement 6 7 The written examination and driving examination for a thereon. motorcycle shall be waived by the Department of Public Safety upon 8 9 verification that the person has successfully completed a certified 10 Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the 11 Department.

12 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully 13 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for 14 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written 15 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a 16 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, and a certified state-17 approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the Department if 18 the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible 19 for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination and driving 20 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by the Department of 21 Public Safety upon verification that the person has successfully 22 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course 23 approved by the Department.

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1 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply 2 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. The Department, after the applicant has passed all parts of the 3 4 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all 5 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a 6 7 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having 8 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a 9 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant 10 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C 11 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules 12 13 promulgated by the Department.

14 This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period 2. 15 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty 16 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one 17 hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit 18 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the 19 discretion of the Department for violation of the restrictions, for 20 failing to give the required or correct information on the 21 application or for violation of any traffic laws of this state 22 pertaining to the operation of a motor vehicle. Except as otherwise 23 provided, the lawful possessor of a commercial learner permit who 24 has been issued a commercial learner permit for a minimum of

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fourteen (14) days may have the restriction requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited by law.

6 3. No person shall apply for and the Department shall not issue 7 an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for at least 8 9 fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class B or C 10 license and who wishes to apply for another class of commercial 11 driver license shall be required to apply for a commercial learner 12 permit and to hold the permit for at least fourteen (14) days before 13 applying for the Class A or B license, as applicable. Any person 14 who currently holds a Class A, B or C license and who wishes to add 15 an endorsement or remove a restriction for which a skills 16 examination is required shall be required to apply for a commercial 17 learner permit and to hold the permit for at least fourteen (14) 18 days before applying for the endorsement.

4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by the Department as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they

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have been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial
 motor vehicle as provided in this subsection.

5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as 3 4 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit 5 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal 6 7 period shall not be eligible for and the Department shall not issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may reapply for 8 9 a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this subsection. 10 G. 1. For purposes of this title:

11 "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification a. 12 Card" means a driver license or identification card 13 issued by the State of Oklahoma that has been 14 certified by the United States Department of Homeland 15 Security (USDHS) as compliant with the requirements of 16 the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13. Α 17 REAL ID Compliant Driver License or Identification 18 Card and the process through which it is issued 19 incorporate a variety of security measures designed to 20 protect the integrity and trustworthiness of the 21 license or card. A REAL ID Compliant Driver License 22 or Identification Card will be clearly marked on the 23 face indicating that it is a compliant document, and

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1 b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or 2 "Identification Card" means a driver license or identification card issued by the State of Oklahoma 3 that has not been certified by the United States 4 5 Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) as being 6 compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID Act. A 7 REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card will be clearly marked on the face indicating 8 9 that it is not compliant with the federal REAL ID Act 10 and is not acceptable for official federal purposes. The driver license or identification card will have a 11 12 unique design or color indicator that clearly 13 distinguishes it from a compliant license or card. 14 2. Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance: 15 Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL a. 16 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card 17 shall be made to the Department of Public Safety. 18 Department of Public Safety employees shall perform b. 19 all document recognition and other requirements needed 20 for approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL 21 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card 22 application. 23 Upon approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL с.

A temporary driver 10 license or identification card shall afford the holder 11 the privileges otherwise granted by the specific class 12 of driver license or identification card for the 13 period of time listed on the temporary driver license 14 or identification card or the period of time prior to 15 the applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID 16 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card, 17 whichever time period is shorter.

## REAL ID Compliant Driver License and Identification Card Renewal and Replacement:

e. For purposes of this title, an application for a REAL

an individual with a valid Oklahoma-issued driver

A motor license agent may 16 process the voluntary downgrade of a REAL ID 17 Noncompliant Commercial Driver License to any lower 18 class license upon request of the licensee; provided, 19 no additional endorsements or restrictions are added 20 to the license.
- 21 b. Department of Public Safety employees or motor license
   22 agents shall perform all document recognition and
   23 other requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
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replacement REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card application.

с. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID 3 4 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card 5 application, the applicant may receive a temporary driver license or identification card from the 6 7 Department of Public Safety or a motor license agent. d. A temporary driver license or identification card 8 9 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall 10 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by 11 the specific class of driver license or identification 12 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time 13 listed on the temporary driver license or 14 identification card or the period of time prior to the 15 applicant receiving a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver 16 License or Identification Card, whichever time period 17 is shorter.

H. 1. The fee charged for an approved application for an
original Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
License or an approved application for the addition of an
endorsement to a current valid Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
Noncompliant Driver License shall be assessed in accordance with the
following schedule:

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this title, all monies collected from such examination fees pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of this state.

J. In addition to any fee charged pursuant to the provisions of subsection H of this section, the fee charged for the issuance or renewal of a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License shall be in accordance with the following schedule; provided, that any applicant who has a CDL Learner Permit shall be charged only the replacement fee for the issuance of the license:

No person who has been honorably discharged from active 15 service in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States or 16 Oklahoma National Guard and who has been certified by the United 17 States Department of Veterans Affairs, its successor or the Armed 18 Forces of the United States to be a disabled veteran in receipt of 19 compensation at the one-hundred-percent rate for a permanent 20 disability sustained through military action or accident resulting 21 from disease contracted while in such active service and registered 22 with the veterans registry created by the Oklahoma Department of 23 Veterans Affairs shall be charged a fee for the issuance, 24 replacement or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license; provided, that

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1 if a veteran has been previously exempt from a fee pursuant to this 2 subsection, no registration with the veterans registry shall be 3 required.

4 In accordance with the provisions of subsection G of this Ο. 5 section, the Department of Public Safety and the Oklahoma Tax Commission are authorized to promulgate rules for the issuance and 6 7 renewal of driver licenses authorized pursuant to the provisions of Sections 6-101 through 6-309 of this title; provided, that no such 8 9 rules applicable to the issuance or renewal of REAL ID Noncompliant 10 Driver Licenses shall create more stringent standards than such 11 rules applicable as of January 1, 2017, unless directly related to a specific change in statutory law concerning standards for REAL ID 12 13 Noncompliant Driver Licenses. Applications, upon forms approved by 14 the Department of Public Safety, for such licenses shall be handled, 15 in accordance with the provisions of subsection G of this section, 16 by the motor license agents; provided, the Department of Public 17 Safety is authorized to assume these duties in any county of this 18 state. Each motor license agent accepting applications for driver licenses shall receive Six Dollars (\$6.00) for a 4-year REAL ID 19 20 Noncompliant Driver License or Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for an 8-year 21 REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for a 4-22 year REAL ID Compliant Driver License or Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for 23 an 8-year REAL ID Compliant Driver License to be deducted from the 24 total collected for each license or renewal application accepted.

1 Upon the effective date of this act, through May 31, 2023, each 2 motor license agent accepting driver license applications for onehundred-percent disabled veterans and for individuals sixty-five 3 4 (65) years of age or older shall receive Six Dollars (\$6.00) for a 5 4-year driver license or Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for an 8-year driver license to be deducted from the daily motor license agent 6 7 receipts. The fees received by the motor license agent, authorized by this subsection, shall be used for operating expenses. 8

9 R. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this title
10 and subsection Q of this section and except as provided in

7 1. By a law enforcement agency for purposes of criminal
8 investigations, missing person investigations or any law enforcement
9 purpose which is deemed necessary by the Commissioner of Public
10 Safety;

By the driver licensing agency of another state for its
 official purpose; and

13 3. As provided in Section 2-110 of this title.

All agencies approved by the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (OLETS) or the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS) to receive photographs or computerized images may obtain them through OLETS or through NLETS. Photographs or computerized images may be obtained by law enforcement one inquiry at a time.

The computer system and related equipment acquired for this purpose must conform to industry standards for interoperability and open architecture. The Department of Public Safety may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this subsection.

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1 T. No person may hold more than one state-issued or territory-2 issued REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID Compliant Identification Card from Oklahoma or any other state or territory. 3 4 The Department shall not issue a REAL ID Compliant Driver License to 5 a person who has been previously issued a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID Compliant Identification Card until such license 6 7 or identification card has been surrendered to the Department by the The Department may promulgate rules related to the 8 applicant. 9 issuance of replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver Licenses in the 10 event of loss or theft.

11 U. Upon the effective date of this act and ending on April 30, 12 2023, in addition to the amounts provided in subsection Q of this 13 section, a motor license agent shall receive Five Dollars (\$5.00) 14 for each processed application for a REAL ID Compliant 4-year Driver 15 License and Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each processed application for 16 a REAL ID Compliant 8-year Driver License. Any additional amounts 17 provided pursuant to this subsection shall not be retained by the 18 Department of Public Safety.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.

20 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 21 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 22 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 23 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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1	SECTION 4. The provisions of this act shall be contingent upon
2	the enactment of the provisions of House Bill No. 3419 or Senate
3	Bill No. 1605 of the 2nd Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature
4	and shall not become operative as law otherwise.
