6 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and
7 Registration Act; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section
8 1104.1, which relates to the Adaptive Grant Program
9 for Oklahomans with Intellectual Disabilities;
10 directing the Department of Human Services to
11 contract with certain organizations for certain
12 purposes; providing exemption from the Central
13 Purchasing Act; and providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104.1, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 1104.1 A. Twenty-three Dollars (\$23.00) of the fee
18 authorized by Section 1135.5 of this title for university or college
19 supporter license plates which are received each year by the
20 Oklahoma Tax Commission or its motor license agents shall be
21 apportioned as follows:

22 1. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee for each license plate
23 designating a particular state university or college shall be
24 apportioned to the particular state university or college so
designated on the license plate. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee
for each license plate designating a particular private university

1 or college shall be apportioned to the particular private university
2 or college so designated on the license plate and may be used by the
3 private university or college as compensation for use of the
4 symbols, words, or letters authorized by the private university or
5 college for use on the license plate; and

6 2. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be deposited to the Adaptive
7 Grant Program for Oklahomans with Intellectual Disabilities
8 Revolving Fund created by this section to be used for educational
9 purposes.

10 B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
11 fund for the Department of Human Services to be designated the
12 "Adaptive Grant Program for Oklahomans with Intellectual
13 Disabilities Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund,
14 not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all
15 funds deposited therein pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 2 of
16 subsection A of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of
17 the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by
18 the Department of Human Services for the administration of the
19 Adaptive Grant Program for Oklahomans with Intellectual
20 Disabilities.

21 C. The Director of the Department of Human Services is hereby
22 directed to promulgate rules to create the Adaptive Grant Program
23 for Oklahomans with Intellectual Disabilities Program to provide
24 financial assistance in adaptation of furnishings, fixtures,

1 vehicles, equipment or structures in order to meet any special needs
2 of Oklahomans with intellectual disabilities; provided, recipients
3 of grants awarded pursuant to the program shall be limited to those
4 programs, projects or persons not otherwise qualifying for state or
5 federal funding. The Department of Human Services is authorized to
6 contract with a statewide private, nonprofit foundation certified to
7 be a 501(c)(3) organization by the Internal Revenue Service for
8 administration of the program. The Department of Human Services is
9 hereby directed to contract with the Oklahoma City Community
10 Foundation or other statewide, private 501(c)(3) nonprofit
11 organizations for the administration of this program. Any contract
12 entered into pursuant to this section shall be exempt from the
13 Central Purchasing Act.

14 D. The Director of Human Services shall prepare an annual
15 report on the program. Such report shall be submitted to the
16 Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of
17 the House of Representatives.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
