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7 An Act relating to awards for meritorious service;  
8 amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-108.5, which relates  
9 to the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma  
10 Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal and related  
11 awards; modifying terminology; providing for creation  
12 of Oklahoma Red Heart and Oklahoma Blue Heart Awards;  
specifying persons eligible for Oklahoma Red Heart or  
Oklahoma Blue Heart; and providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-108.5, is  
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 2-108.5 A. 1. There is hereby created the Oklahoma  
17 State Award Program Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to  
18 create, establish eligibility requirements and make recommendation  
19 for awarding the Oklahoma Medal of Valor for meritorious service,  
20 the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal for extended  
21 exemplary service to the state and the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or  
22 Oklahoma Blue Heart for serious line of duty injuries for law  
23 enforcement and public safety members employed by municipal, county,  
24 state and employees of federal agencies working in Oklahoma.

1        2. There is hereby established the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the  
2 Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal and the Oklahoma  
3 ~~Purple Red Heart~~ and Oklahoma Blue Heart, along with authorized  
4 appurtenances, for award by the Governor, in the name of the state,  
5 to any person who has demonstrated meritorious achievement, or a  
6 distinct act of courage, shown distinguished meritorious service to  
7 the state over an extended period of service or who has incurred  
8 injury or wounds, while performing or actively engaged in public  
9 service activities. The Oklahoma ~~Purple Red Heart~~ is limited to ~~law~~  
10 ~~enforcement and public safety members~~ municipal firefighters  
11 employed by cities and towns. The Oklahoma Blue Heart is limited to  
12 law enforcement and public safety members employed by municipal,  
13 county, state and employees of federal agencies working in Oklahoma.

14        3. The purpose of each award is to formally recognize  
15 extraordinary acts of valor by public safety members and citizens of  
16 Oklahoma who engage in extraordinary acts of bravery and valor and  
17 to formally recognize public safety members in Oklahoma who have  
18 been seriously injured in the line of duty and to acknowledge the  
19 distinguished meritorious service of citizens to the state.

20        B. The members of the Oklahoma State Award Program (OSAP)  
21 Committee shall have experience in the field of public safety and  
22 public service. The OSAP Committee shall be composed of nine (9)  
23 members as follows:

24        1. The Lieutenant Governor, who shall serve as chair;

2. The Adjutant General of the Oklahoma National Guard;
3. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety;
4. The Director of the Department of Corrections;
5. The Director of the Department of Transportation;
6. The President of the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association;
7. The President of the Oklahoma Association of Chiefs of Police;
8. The President of the Oklahoma State Firefighters Association; and
9. The President of the Oklahoma Sheriffs and Peace Officers Association.

C. Except at any meeting to select recipients of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal, the Oklahoma Red Heart or the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Blue Heart, each member, other than the chair, may be represented by a designee; provided, the designee must be an active member in good standing with the agency or association to which the appointed member belongs. The Chairman reserves the right to appoint an advisory board to collect, review and make initial award recommendations to the OSAP Committee. The advisory board will be comprised of designees from the nine-member OSAP Committee.

D. The Committee shall conduct its first meeting no later than ninety (90) calendar days after the appointment of the last member. The Committee shall meet at the direction of the chair, and shall

1 normally meet not less than once each year and not more than three  
2 times each year.

3 E. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum to  
4 conduct business.

5 F. The members of the Committee shall serve without  
6 compensation, except that the members may be reimbursed for  
7 reasonable and necessary expenses arising from Committee activities  
8 or business. Such expenses shall be paid by the respective agencies  
9 at which the member is employed at the time the expense is incurred.

10 G. No member of the OSAP Committee shall solicit, seek or  
11 request individuals to submit individuals for awards. OSAP  
12 Committee members may explain the program to interested individuals.  
13 The Committee may secure directly from any department or agency such  
14 information as the Committee deems necessary to carry out its  
15 duties.

16 H. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety shall  
17 promulgate rules to establish the following:

18 1. Design of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma  
19 Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal and the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red  
20 Heart or the Oklahoma Blue Heart and any authorized appurtenances  
21 proposed by the Adjutant General;

22 2. Criteria for eligibility for award of the Oklahoma Medal of  
23 Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal or the  
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1 Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue Heart proposed by the  
2 Adjutant General;

3 3. Criteria for the proper wear of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor,  
4 the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal or the Oklahoma  
5 ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or the Oklahoma Blue Heart proposed by the Adjutant  
6 General;

7 4. Method of purchasing the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the  
8 Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal or the Oklahoma  
9 ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue Heart;

10 5. Order of precedence relating to other state awards; and

11 6. Other rules deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of  
12 this section.

13 I. The Committee shall consider candidates for award for the  
14 Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious  
15 Service Medal or the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue  
16 Heart only from the applications received. The OSAP Committee may  
17 go into executive session to deliberate and select recommended  
18 recipients. The Chair shall present to the Governor the names of  
19 recommendations as Medal recipients.

20 J. The Committee shall not disclose any information which may  
21 compromise an ongoing law enforcement investigation or information  
22 that is otherwise required by law to be kept confidential. Only the  
23 final recommendation for receipt of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the  
24 Oklahoma Distinguished Service Medal and the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red

1 Heart or Oklahoma Blue Heart shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open  
2 Records Act.

3 K. The Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished  
4 Service Medal and the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue  
5 Heart may not be awarded to any person who was not selected by the  
6 Committee.

7 L. The award of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma  
8 Distinguished Service Medal and the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or  
9 Oklahoma Blue Heart may be rescinded for suitable cause. The Chair,  
10 with the consent of the Committee, shall forward the recommendation  
11 for rescission to the Governor. The final decision to rescind must  
12 be approved by the Governor.

13 M. The Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished  
14 Service Medal or the Oklahoma ~~Purple~~ Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue  
15 Heart may be awarded posthumously and may be presented to such  
16 representative of the deceased's family as may be deemed appropriate  
17 by the Governor.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
