AMENDATORY 22 O.S. 2021, Section 1101, is 1.3 amended to read as follows: 14 Section 1101. A. Except as otherwise provided by law, bail, by 15 sufficient sureties, shall be admitted upon all arrests in criminal 16 cases where the offense is not punishable by death and in such cases 17 it may be taken by any of the persons or courts authorized by law to 18 arrest, to imprison offenders or to perform pretrial services, or by the clerk of the district court or his or her deputy, or by the 19 20 judge of such courts. 21 In criminal cases where the defendant is currently an 22 escaped prisoner from the Department of Corrections, the defendant 23 must be processed back into the Department of Corrections prior to

bail being set on new criminal charges.

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- C. All persons shall be bailable by sufficient sureties, except that bail may be denied for:
 - 1. Capital offenses when the proof of guilt is evident, or the presumption thereof is great;
 - 2. Violent offenses;
 - 3. Offenses where the maximum sentence may be life imprisonment or life imprisonment without parole;
 - 4. Felony offenses where the person charged with the offense has been convicted of two or more felony offenses arising out of different transactions; and
 - 5. Controlled dangerous substances offenses where the maximum sentence may be at least ten (10) years' imprisonment.

On all offenses specified in paragraphs 2 through 5 of this subsection, the proof of guilt must be evident, or the presumption must be great, and it must be on the grounds that no condition of release would assure the safety of the community or any person.

- D. There shall be a rebuttable presumption that no condition of release would assure the safety of the community if the state shows by clear and convincing evidence that the person was arrested for a violation of Section 741 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- E. If the person was arrested for any crime provided for in the Protection from Domestic Abuse Act or a violent crime provided for in Section 571 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the court shall

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1	be responsible for assessing prior patterns of abuse and shall
2	present written findings on the bail amount.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
