13	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
14	2ND SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
15	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
16	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
17	the following proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article V and to
18	Section 1 of Article XXIV of the Constitution of the State of
19	Oklahoma to read as follows:
20	Section 3. Referendum petitions shall be filed with the
21	Secretary of State not more than ninety (90) days after the final
22	adjournment of the session of the Legislature which passed the bill
23	on which the referendum is demanded. The veto power of the Governor
24	shall not extend to measures voted on by the people. All elections

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on measures referred to the people of the state shall be had at the next election held throughout the state, except when the Legislature or the Governor shall order a special election for the express purpose of making such reference. Any measure referred to the people by the initiative or referendum shall take effect and be in force when it shall have been approved by a majority of the votes cast thereon and not otherwise.

8 The style of all bills shall be: "Be it Enacted By the People 9 of the State of Oklahoma."

Petitions and orders for the initiative and for the referendum shall be filed with the Secretary of State and addressed to the Governor of the state, who shall submit the same to the people. The Legislature shall make suitable provisions for carrying into effect the provisions of this article.

15 Any initiative petition filed with the Secretary of State, 16 including an initiative petition to amend the Oklahoma Constitution, 17 and any measure referred to the ballot pursuant to action by the 18 Legislature, which is submitted to the ballot pursuant to the 19 provisions of this section shall have included in the ballot title a 20 statement which describes the specific fiscal impact, whether 21 positive, neutral, or negative, that the proposed amendment to 22 statutes or to the Constitution would have as determined by the 23 State Auditor and Inspector. The Legislature shall enact laws to 24 prescribe the procedure pursuant to which the fiscal analysis is

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1 conducted and the method for including the fiscal impact in the 2 ballot title of the measure.

Section 1. Any amendment or amendments to this Constitution may 3 4 be proposed in either branch of the Legislature, and if the same 5 shall be agreed to by a majority of all the members elected to each 6 of the two (2) houses, such proposed amendment or amendments shall, 7 with the yeas and nays thereon, be entered in their journals and referred by the Secretary of State to the people for their approval 8 9 or rejection, at the next regular general election, except when the 10 Legislature, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of each house, shall order a 11 special election for that purpose. If a majority of all the 12 electors voting on any proposed amendment at such election shall 13 vote in favor thereof, it shall thereby become a part of this 14 Constitution.

No proposal for the amendment or alteration of this Constitution which is submitted to the voters shall embrace more than one general subject and the voters shall vote separately for or against each proposal submitted; provided, however, that in the submission of proposals for the amendment of this Constitution by articles, which embrace one general subject, each proposed article shall be deemed a single proposal or proposition.

Any proposal to amend the Constitution submitted to the ballot pursuant to the provisions of this section shall have included in the ballot title a statement which describes the specific fiscal

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1 impact, whether positive, neutral, or negative, that the amendment 2 would have as determined by the State Auditor and Inspector. The Legislature shall enact laws to prescribe the procedure pursuant to 3 4 which the fiscal analysis is conducted and the method for including 5 the fiscal impact in the ballot title of the measure. 6 SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional 7 amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in 8 the following form: 9 BALLOT TITLE 10 Legislative Referendum No. State Question No. 11 THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS: 12 This measure would amend the Oklahoma Constitution. It would 13 amend Section 3 of Article 5 and it would also amend Section 1 14 of Article 24. This measure would require ballot titles to 15 contain a statement of fiscal impact. It would apply to ballot 16 titles for measures being voted upon as a result of an 17 initiative petition. The initiative petition could contain 18 changes to the Oklahoma Statutes or it could contain changes to the Oklahoma Constitution. The fiscal impact statement would be 19 20 required in both cases. The Legislature can refer measures to 21 the people. Those measures can contain changes to the Oklahoma 22 Statutes or changes to the Oklahoma Constitution. The fiscal 23 impact statement would be required for any of those measures 24 referred by the Legislature. The fiscal impact statement would

1	be prepared by the State Auditor and Inspector. The Legislature
2	would be required to write procedures so that the fiscal impact
3	statement was included in the ballot title for any of these
4	measures.

8	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,

12	Attorney General.
