10	An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.194, which relates to prohibiting child
11	with contagious disease or head lice from attending school; including children with a communicable
12	disease; striking prohibition for children with head lice; requiring compliance with certain public health
13	law; authorizing certain certification from a licensed doctor; and providing an effective date.

17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.194, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1210.194 A. Any child afflicted with a contagious <u>or</u>
20	communicable disease or head lice may be prohibited from attending a
21	public, private, or parochial school until such time as $\frac{1}{100}$ the child
22	is free from the contagious <u>or communicable</u> disease or head lice <u>in</u>
23	compliance with Section 1-505 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes

or upon certification from a licensed medical doctor or licensed
doctor of osteopathic medicine.

З	B. Any child prohibited from attending school due to head lice
4	shall present to the appropriate school authorities, before the
5	child may reenter school, certification from a health professional
6	as defined by Section 2601 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes or
7	an authorized representative of the State Department of Health that
8	the child is no longer afflicted with head lice.
9	C. School districts and county or city-county health
10	departments may enter into agreements under the Interlocal
11	Cooperation Act for the purpose of providing assistance to the
12	school district by inspecting children who are returning to school
13	after an absence due to head lice to ensure that the child is no
14	longer afflicted with head lice.
15	D. If a school district and county or city-county health
16	department has entered into an agreement as authorized in subsection
17	C of this section, upon written authorization of the parent or
18	guardian of a child, the county or city-county health department may
19	provide treatment to the child for head lice.
20	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
