FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to coordination of services; amending 56 O.S. 2011, Section 3021, which relates to the 2-1-1 Oklahoma Coordinating Council; modifying name of entity; designating the Oklahoma 2-1-1 Collaborative as state lead entity of 2-1-1 call centers; modifying duties and responsibilities; providing for membership, meetings and adoption of by-laws; precluding and authorizing certain compensation; authorizing compliance with certain federal requirements; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 56 O.S. 2011, Section 3021, is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 3021. A. Beginning on January 1, 2011, the Oklahoma 2-
2 1-1 Advisory Collaborative shall be renamed the 2-1-1 Oklahoma
3 Coordinating Council. Beginning on July 1, 2021, the 2-1-1 Oklahoma
4 Coordinating Council shall be renamed the Oklahoma 2-1-1
5 Collaborative. The Oklahoma 2-1-1 Collaborative is hereby
6 designated as the state lead entity of all 2-1-1 call centers in
7 this state.

8 B. The Oklahoma 2-1-1 ~~Coordinating Council~~ Collaborative shall
9 have the following duties and responsibilities:

10 1. Develop and maintain a statewide coordinated approach for
11 the promotion of a 2-1-1 system;

12 2. Develop and maintain an integrated statewide 2-1-1 service
13 that avoids overlap of 2-1-1 call centers in the state;

14 3. Certify information and referral providers who wish to
15 become 2-1-1 call centers;

16 4. Develop and maintain certification standards for providers
17 that operate as a 2-1-1 call center in the state in compliance with
18 the Alliance for Information and Referral Systems;

19 ~~4.~~ 5. Assure that each 2-1-1 call center is accountable and
20 maintains compliance with Corporation Commission standards;

21 ~~5.~~ 6. Develop and maintain a process for 2-1-1 call center
22 accountability and compliance with state and national standards for
23 any contractual obligations;

1 ~~6.~~ 7. Provide leadership and coordination for 2-1-1 call
2 centers as it relates to large-scale emergencies and homeland
3 security needs;

4 ~~7.~~ 8. Develop and implement a statewide, outcome-driven
5 strategic plan for 2-1-1 Oklahoma;

6 ~~8.~~ 9. Advocate for funding to support and sustain 2-1-1 system
7 delivery;

8 ~~9.~~ 10. Coordinate with national, state, and local partners in
9 the provision of 2-1-1 services; and

10 ~~10.~~ Using an established formula, provide

11 11. Collaborate with such entities as may be required and to
12 the extent required under federal law or to receive federal funding;

13 12. Provide funding formula recommendations to the
14 administering entity responsible for the allocation of state and
15 federal funds appropriated for 2-1-1 Oklahoma; and

16 13. Submit an annual report no later than September 1 of each
17 year to the cabinet Secretary for the cabinet area consisting of the
18 Department of Human Services, of the services rendered in the past
19 fiscal year by the 2-1-1 system. The report may also include
20 recommendations of the Oklahoma 2-1-1 Collaborative.

21 C. 1. The membership of the Oklahoma 2-1-1 Collaborative shall
22 be comprised of fifteen (15) members, five of whom shall be public
23 sector representatives and ten of whom shall be private sector
24 representatives. The initial members shall be selected by the

1 current 2-1-1 call centers in this state as of the effective date of
2 this act. Vacancies that occur after the selection of the initial
3 members shall be filled by the Oklahoma 2-1-1 Collaborative.

4 2. The Oklahoma 2-1-1 Collaborative shall meet not less than
5 two (2) times per year for the purpose of reviewing and carrying out
6 its duties and responsibilities.

7 3. The members of the Oklahoma 2-1-1 ~~Advisory~~ Collaborative
8 shall ~~develop~~ adopt by-laws for the 2-1-1 Oklahoma Coordinating
9 Council on or before December 31, 2010. Such by-laws shall specify
10 a process for selecting membership on the 2-1-1 Oklahoma
11 Coordinating Council, governing its operations including terms of
12 office, and procedures for replacing members, the conduct of
13 meetings and such other functions as the Oklahoma 2-1-1
14 Collaborative deems necessary to carry out its duties and
15 responsibilities.

16 4. Members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement
17 for expenses; provided, that members who are public officers may be
18 reimbursed for necessary expenses as provided by law.

19 D. If federal funding related to 2-1-1 services becomes
20 available to the state, the state may comply with any requirements
21 necessary to make application for and receive such federal funding.

22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

23 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
24 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
