[work zone safety - creating the Operation Work Zone
Awareness Act - establishment of Operation Work Zone
Awareness - effective date]

~~BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:~~

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Operation Work
Zone Awareness Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-1304 of Title 47, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to establish
Operation Work Zone Awareness. Operation Work Zone Awareness is a
program designed to educate the motoring public on the dangers of

1 committing moving violations while traveling in highway construction
2 work zones. The Department is authorized to develop and house on
3 its website an online work zone awareness presentation that may
4 include, but not be limited to, facts and figures representing the
5 dangers of motorists committing work zone moving violations,
6 testimonials from highway construction workers and their families,
7 information on the importance of awareness and slowing down in work
8 zones, and a question-and-answer section to ensure participants
9 understand and retain the information presented. The Department is
10 authorized to contract for the production, development, and
11 maintenance of the webpage through a vendor. The Department shall
12 maintain in its database a record of those completing the program.

13 B. Motorists receiving a citation for committing moving
14 violations within a work zone may receive information regarding an
15 invitation to participate in the Operation Work Zone Awareness
16 program. A motorist who participates in and completes the online
17 program shall receive a certificate designed and issued by the
18 Department. Any person producing the certificate as proof in court
19 that the program was successfully completed shall be entitled to
20 dismissal of the fine. If proof of successful completion of the
21 program is presented to the court in person or electronically, no
22 later than the business day preceding the first scheduled court
23 appearance date, the dismissal shall be without payment of court
24 costs. The court may access information from the Department's

1 system to confirm completion of the program. Offenders may
2 participate in and complete the program a maximum of one time.
3 After completing the program, a motorist who receives another
4 citation in a work zone will be disqualified from utilizing the
5 program benefits a second time. If a motorist so chooses, he or she
6 may not participate in the program and instead pay the fine imposed
7 on the issued citation. Holders of commercial driver licenses cited
8 while driving a commercial motor vehicle are not eligible to
9 participate in the program.

10 C. Moving violations that qualify an offender to participate in
11 the Operation Work Zone Awareness program shall include, but not be
12 limited to, speeding, distracted driving, failure to move over,
13 failure to obey flagger, and failure to obey traffic control
14 devices. Motorists committing impaired driving offenses, as defined
15 in Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in work zones including
16 driving under the influence, driving while intoxicated, driving
17 under the influence under twenty-one (21) years of age, or a
18 commercial driver license holder refusing a chemical test while
19 driving any vehicle, shall be disqualified from the program.

20 D. The fee paid by a motorist for his or her participation in
21 the Operation Work Zone Awareness program shall be Seventy-five
22 Dollars (\$75.00) and shall be apportioned as follows:

23 1. Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) to be deposited in the
24 Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund, created in Section 2-

1 144.1 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to be used for
2 maintenance of the Operation Work Zone Awareness program;

3 2. Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) which shall be deposited in the
4 Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Revolving Fund created in
5 Section 2-143 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

6 3. Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) to be deposited in the Oklahoma
7 Court Information System Revolving Fund, created in Section 1315 of
8 Title 20 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to be used to offset expenses
9 related to this program.

10 The Department is authorized to determine the manner in which fees
11 may be paid.

12 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
