15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 713, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 713. A. All gross proceeds shall be the property of
19	the Oklahoma Lottery Commission. From its gross proceeds, the
20	Commission shall pay the operating expenses of the Commission. At
21	least forty-five percent (45%) of gross proceeds shall be made
22	available as prize money. However, the provisions of this
23	subsection shall be deemed not to create any lien, entitlement,
24	cause of action, or other private right, and any rights of holders

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of tickets or shares shall be determined by the Commission in
 setting the terms of its lottery or lotteries.

B. The Oklahoma Lottery Commission shall submit a written
report of its findings and any recommendations regarding the impact
of removing the requirement that net proceeds shall equal at least
thirty-five percent (35%) of the gross proceeds. The report shall
be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State
Senate not later than October 1, 2020, and annually thereafter.

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to be 10 С. designated the "Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund". Except as 11 12 otherwise provided in subsections  $\pm$  H and  $\pm$  I of this section, on or 13 before the fifteenth day of each calendar quarter, the Commission shall transfer to the State Treasurer, for credit to the Oklahoma 14 Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of all net proceeds 15 accruing during the preceding calendar quarter. Expenditures from 16 17 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 18 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and 19 payment. 20

D. Upon their deposit into the State Treasury, any monies representing a deposit of net proceeds shall then become the unencumbered property of this state, and neither the Commission nor the board of trustees shall have the power to agree or undertake

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otherwise. The monies shall be invested by the State Treasurer in
 accordance with state investment practices. All earnings
 attributable to such investments shall likewise be the unencumbered
 property of the state and shall accrue to the credit of the fund
 provided for in subsection C of this section.

E. Monies in <u>1. The first Seventy-five Million Dollars</u>
<u>(\$75,000,000.00) of monies contributed annually to</u> the Oklahoma
Education Lottery Trust Fund shall only be appropriated as follows:

- a. forty-five percent (45%) for the following:
- 11 a. (1) kindergarten through twelfth grade public 12 education, including but not limited to 13 compensation and benefits for public school 14 teachers and support employees, and

1 and universities are owned or operated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, or 2 to attend institutions operated under the 3 authority of the Oklahoma Department of Career 4 5 and Technology Education; provided, such tuition grants, loans and scholarships shall not be made 6 to a citizen of this state to attend a college or 7 university which is not accredited by the 8 9 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, (2) construction of educational facilities for 10 b. elementary school districts, independent school 11 12 districts, The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, and career and technology education, 13 capital outlay projects for elementary school (3) 14 <del>C.</del> districts, independent school districts, The 15 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, and 16 career and technology education, 17 technology for public elementary school district, (4) 18 <del>d.</del> independent school district, state higher 19 education, and career and technology education 20 facilities, which shall include but not be 21 limited to costs of providing to teachers at 22 accredited public institutions who teach levels 23 kindergarten through twelfth grade, personnel at 24

1 technology centers under the authority of the Oklahoma State Department of Career and 2 Technology Education, and professors and 3 instructors within The Oklahoma State System of 4 5 Higher Education, the necessary training in the use and application of computers and advanced 6 electronic instructional technology to implement 7 interactive learning environments in the 8 9 classroom and to access the statewide distance learning network and costs associated with 10 repairing and maintaining advanced electronic 11 instructional technology, 12

e. (5) endowed chairs for professors at institutions of
 higher education operated by The Oklahoma State
 System of Higher Education, and

16 <u>f. (6)</u> programs and personnel of the Oklahoma School for 17 the Deaf and the Oklahoma School for the Blind<del>;</del>

19c.five percent (5%) to the School Consolidation and20Assistance Fund. When the total amount in the School21Consolidation and Assistance Fund from all sources22equals Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), all23monies appropriated pursuant to this paragraph24subparagraph which would otherwise be deposited in the

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1 School Consolidation and Assistance Fund in excess of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be 2 3 allocated by the State Department of Education to public schools based on the audited end-of-year 4 5 average daily membership in grades 8 through 12 during the preceding school year for the purpose of 6 purchasing technology equipment. If at any time the 7 total amount in the School Consolidation and 8 9 Assistance Fund drops below Five Million Dollars 10 (\$5,000,000.00), the monies appropriated pursuant to 11 this paragraph subparagraph shall be deposited in the School Consolidation and Assistance Fund until the 12 Fund again reaches Five Million Dollars 13 (\$5,000,000.00)÷, and 14

16 17 <u>d.</u> <u>five</u> percent (5%) to the Teachers' Retirement System Dedicated Revenue Revolving Fund.

In no instance shall the annual maximum percentage for administrative costs, not including marketing and advertising costs, funds set aside for prizes, commissions paid to retailers, contract fees paid to gaming system vendors and instant ticket providers or emergency-related capital expenses, exceed three percent (3%) of sales.

F. 2. The remaining portion of lottery annual net proceeds
 deposited to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund that exceeds
 Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00) shall be deposited to
 the credit of the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund created in
 Section 2 of this act.

<u>E.</u> The Legislature shall appropriate funds from the Oklahoma
Education Lottery Trust Fund only for the purposes specified in
subsection <u>E</u> <u>D</u> of this section. Even when funds from the trust fund
are used for these purposes, the Legislature shall not use funds
from the trust fund to supplant or replace other state funds
supporting common education, higher education, or career and
technology education.

G. F. In order to ensure that the funds from the trust fund are 13 used to enhance and not supplant funding for education, the State 14 Board of Equalization shall examine and investigate appropriations 15 from the trust fund each year. At the meeting of the State Board of 16 Equalization held within five (5) days after the monthly 17 apportionment in February of each year, the State Board of 18 Equalization shall issue a finding and report which shall state 19 whether appropriations from the trust fund were used to enhance or 20 supplant education funding. If the State Board of Equalization 21 finds that education funding was supplanted by funds from the trust 22 fund, the Board shall specify the amount by which education funding 23 was supplanted. In this event, the Legislature shall not make any 24

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appropriations for the ensuing fiscal year until an appropriation in
 that amount is made to replenish the trust fund.

H. G. Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, no 3 deficiency in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall be 4 5 replenished by reducing any nonlottery funds, including, specifically but without limitation, the General Revenue Fund, the 6 Constitutional Reserve Fund or the Education Reform Revolving Fund 7 of the State Department of Education. No program or project started 8 9 specifically from lottery proceeds shall be continued from the General Revenue Fund, the Constitutional Reserve Fund or the 10 Education Reform Revolving Fund of the State Department of 11 12 Education. Such programs must be adjusted or discontinued according 13 to available lottery proceeds unless the Legislature by general law establishes eligibility requirements and appropriates specific funds 14 therefor. No surplus in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund 15 shall be reduced or transferred to correct any nonlottery 16 17 deficiencies in sums available for general appropriations. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to bonds or other 18 obligations issued pursuant to or to the repayment of bonds or other 19 obligations issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Education Promise 20 of Excellence Act of 2005. 21

22 <del>I.</del> <u>H.</u> There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 23 fund to be designated the "Oklahoma Education Lottery Revolving 24 Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal

1 year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Commission. The Commission shall make payments of net proceeds from 2 the fund to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund on or before 3 the fifteenth day of each calendar quarter as provided in subsection 4 5 C of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of the Oklahoma Education Lottery Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated 6 and may be budgeted and expended for the payment of net proceeds, 7 prizes, commissions to retailers, administrative expenses and all 8 9 other expenses arising out of the operation of the education lottery, subject to the limitations provided in the Oklahoma 10 Education Lottery Act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made 11 12 upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 13 Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 14

The monies in the fund shall be invested by the State Treasurer in accordance with state investment practices. All earnings attributable to such investments shall likewise accrue to the credit of the fund.

19 J. I. When appropriations from the Oklahoma Education Lottery 20 Trust Fund are made to common education pursuant to the provisions 21 of <u>subparagraph a of</u> paragraph 1 of subsection  $\pm$  <u>D</u> of this section, 22 the appropriations shall be made available on a monthly basis. In 23 addition to the provisions of subsections C and D of this section, 24 the following process shall be used to ensure that the

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1 appropriations are made available to common education in a timely
2 manner:

Beginning in July of the fiscal year in which appropriations 3 1. are made to common education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery 4 5 Trust Fund, the Commission, on or before the ninth day of each month, shall transfer to the State Treasurer, for credit to the 6 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of net proceeds 7 accruing during the preceding month equal to the amount of total 8 9 monthly collections due to common education as required by subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection E D of this section; 10

11 2. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 12 Services shall allocate the transfers provided for in paragraph 1 of 13 this subsection to the State Department of Education on a monthly 14 basis, not to exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual apportionment 15 for the fiscal year; and

3. The total amount of transfers to the Oklahoma Education
Lottery Trust Fund of net lottery proceeds made pursuant to this
subsection shall not exceed the total appropriations made to common
education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund for the
specific fiscal year.

K. J. When appropriations from the Oklahoma Education Lottery
Trust Fund are made to The Oklahoma State System of Higher
Education, the appropriations shall be made available to the System
on a monthly basis. In addition to the provisions of subsections C

1 and D of this section, the following process shall be used to ensure 2 that the appropriations are made available to The Oklahoma State 3 System of Higher Education in a timely manner:

1. Beginning in July of the fiscal year in which appropriations 4 5 are made to The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the Commission, on or before 6 the ninth day of each month, shall transfer to the State Treasurer, 7 for credit to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount 8 9 of net proceeds accruing during the preceding month equal to the amount of total monthly collections due to the Oklahoma State 10 Regents for Higher Education as required by subparagraph b of 11 12 paragraph  $\frac{2}{2}$  1 of subsection  $\frac{1}{2}$  D of this section;

The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services shall allocate the transfers provided for in paragraph 1 of
 this subsection to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
 on a monthly basis, not to exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual
 apportionment for the fiscal year; and

The total amount of transfers to the Oklahoma Education
 Lottery Trust Fund of net lottery proceeds made pursuant to this
 subsection shall not exceed the total appropriations made to The
 Oklahoma State System for Higher Education from the Oklahoma
 Education Lottery Trust Fund for the specific fiscal year.

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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-190.2 of Title 70, unless
 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 4 Α. 5 fund for the State Department of Education to be designated the "Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund". The revolving fund shall be a 6 continuing fund, without legislative appropriation, not subject to 7 fiscal year limitations, and shall be under the control and 8 9 management of the State Department of Education. Expenditures from the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund shall be budgeted and 10 expended as provided for in subsection B of this section. 11

12 Β. The State Department of Education shall utilize the funds 13 for the program outlined in Section 6-190 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Funding shall go toward advanced, lead, and 14 master certificate holders on a first-come, first-served basis until 15 the cash is exhausted for the school year. Funds from the Teacher 16 Empowerment Revolving Fund shall serve as a state match to local 17 dollars each school district contributes to its advanced, lead, and 18 master teachers as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the 19 Oklahoma Statutes. 20

21 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, is 22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 6-190. A. The board of education of each school 24 district shall employ and contract in writing, as required in

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Section 6-101 of this title, only with persons certified to teach by
 the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher
 Preparation Act, except as otherwise provided for by Section 6-101
 of this title and by other law.

5 B. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person6 who:

7 1. Has successfully completed the teacher education program
8 required by the Commission for Educational Quality and
9 Accountability;

Has graduated from an accredited institution of higher
 education that has approval or accreditation for teacher education;

Has met all other requirements as may be established by the
 Board;

14 4. Has made the necessary application and paid the competency15 examination fee in an amount and as prescribed by the Commission;

16 5. Has successfully completed the competency examination 17 required in Section 6-187 of this title; and

6. Beginning November 1, 2001, has on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history

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record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible
 for the cost of the criminal history records.

3 C. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person 4 who:

5 1. Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements6 set forth in subsection G of this section;

7 2. Holds certification from the National Board for Professional
8 Teaching Standards;

9 3. Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the10 requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or

4. Has successfully completed a competency examination used in
the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets
the requirements set forth in subsection H of this section.

D. Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial 14 Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current 15 Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 16 17 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 18 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue 19 a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of 20 the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person 21 applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the 22 criminal history records. 23

E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.

F. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person
who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any
requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach
shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely
aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the outof-country certificate.

12 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 13 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 14 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 15 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-country 16 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 17 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 18 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 19 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 20 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 21 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 22 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 23 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 24

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The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the
 cost of the criminal history record checks.

4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by
which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for
purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this
subsection.

G. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person
who holds a valid out-of-state certificate. The certificate to
teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most
closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on
the out-of-state certificate.

12 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 13 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 14 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 15 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state 16 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of this subsection shall 17 have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history 18 record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well 19 as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 20 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the 21 Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a 22 temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the 23 national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 24 The

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person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost
 of the criminal history record checks.

H. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person
who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority
of the other states. The certificate to teach shall only be for
those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a
certification area used in Oklahoma.

2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 8 9 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 10 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 11 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 12 13 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 14 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 15 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 16 17 cost of the criminal history record checks.

18 I. <u>1.</u> The Board shall issue a lead teaching certificate to any 19 person who upon application:

20 1. Has successfully completed the requirements of this
21 subsection;

22 2. Has a minimum of five (5) years of experience as a teacher; 23 24

1	3. Participates in a meaningful individualized program of
2	professional development, as provided for in Section 6-101.10 of
3	this title;
4	4. Has earned a "highly effective" or "superior" rating
5	pursuant to Section 6-101.16 of this title; and
6	5. May have a teaching load of not more than seventy-five
7	percent (75%) student instruction to allow the teacher to mentor
8	other teachers.
9	J. 1. The Board shall issue a master teaching certificate to
10	any person who upon application:
11	a. has successfully completed the requirements of this

13	b. has a minimum of seven (7) years of experience as a
14	teacher, and
15	c. (1) has carned a "superior" rating pursuant to
16	Section 6-101.16 of this title, or
17	(2) has earned a "highly effective" rating pursuant

9	3. Teachers with a master teaching certificate may have a

15	d. other duties mutually agreed upon by the
16	superintendent and the master teacher, and may be used
17	to satisfy the qualitative evaluation component for
18	teachers as required by Section 6-101.16 of this title
19	by performing the duties set forth in this paragraph
20	may establish new levels of teacher certificates: advanced, lead,
21	and master. Each level shall have a minimum salary increase
22	requirement paid by the school district and matched with state

1	a minimum salary increase of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), the
2	lead certificate shall include a minimum salary increase of Five

5	(\$10,000.00) and maximum salary increase of Forty Thousand Dollars
6	(\$40,000.00).
7	2. A teacher who works in a school with an enrollment of forty
8	percent (40%) or more of students who are economically disadvantaged
9	as defined in Section 18-109.5 of this title or a school district
10	with an enrollment of fewer than one thousand students shall be paid
11	a one-time award in addition to the salary increases provided in
12	paragraph 1 of this subsection:
13	a. One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for an
14	advanced certificate,
15	b. <u>Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for a</u>
16	lead certificate, and
17	<u>c.</u> <u>Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a master</u>
18	certificate.
19	3. School districts may identify and designate the highest
20	quality teachers for advanced, lead, and master certificates.
21	Participating districts shall submit designation plans to the State
22	Department of Education for evaluation and approval. Districts
23	shall have local control and flexibility in determining how to
24	evaluate teachers and assign designations, but, at a minimum, the

1 designation system shall include a teacher observation, out-of-2 classroom time, and a student performance component.

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3	<u>a.</u>	Teacher observation shall be based on the district's
4		selected Teacher and Leader Effectiveness Evaluation
5		System (TLE) evaluation tool or an alternate method of
6		evaluation; provided, the method is evidenced based.
7		Alternate methods of evaluation shall not replace the
8		requirements of Section 6-101.16 of this title.
9	b.	Each school district that elects to participate in
10		assigning advanced, lead, and master teacher
11		certificates shall include an out-of-classroom
12		component for its assigned teachers to allow for
13		professional growth opportunities while staying in the
14		classroom. How out-of-classroom time is allotted and
15		managed shall be determined by the school district and
16		submitted as part of its designation plan to the State
17		Department of Education for review and approval.
18	<u>C.</u>	Student performance measures may be determined by the
19		district and may include, but shall not be limited to,
20		pre- and post-tests, summative or formative, and
21		portfolios. The school district application shall
22		show evidence of validity and reliability of the
23		measures.

1	Districts may use additional factors in determining which
2	teachers are eligible to receive a designation, such as student
3	surveys, teacher leadership responsibilities, teacher mentorship
4	responsibilities, family surveys, demonstration of district core
5	values, teacher peer surveys, and contributions to the broader
6	school community. No more than ten percent (10%) of each school
7	district's teachers may be designated as an advanced, lead, or
8	master teacher in any given school year.
9	4. If a school district chooses to participate in this program,
10	the state shall match the amount the district pays above base pay,
11	up to Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) per teacher.
12	5. School districts that designate teachers for advanced, lead,
13	and master certificates do not have to participate in annual TLE
14	evaluations for the designated teachers.
15	6. School districts may designate teachers for advanced, lead,
16	or master certificates two times per year, once prior to the
17	beginning of the school year, and once prior to the beginning of the
18	second semester. Teachers statewide who receive these designations
19	shall be placed in professional development cohorts and provided
20	additional training opportunities from the State Department of
21	Education.
22	7. After initial approval by the State Department of Education,
23	the Department shall review and validate each participating school
24	district's teacher evaluation system biennially.

1	8. The State Department of Education shall annually report the
2	school districts participating in the program, the number of
3	advanced, lead, and master certificates awarded, and the total
4	amount in state match funding that was distributed to teachers.

9	master teaching certificate to make application for the standard
10	teaching certificate.
11	$\frac{1}{1}$ K. The terms of the contracts issued to those holding
12	advanced, lead, and master teaching certificates shall include the
13	following:
14	1. Advanced: an additional five (5) days to be used to
15	strengthen instructional leadership. A person with an advanced
16	teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary increase of at
17	least Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or the district's daily
18	rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for
19	which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 of this
20	title. This increase shall be matched by state dollars from the
21	lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma
22	Statutes and shall be paid as regular annual compensation directly
23	to teachers through school districts;

1 2. Lead: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen 2 instructional leadership. A person with a lead teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary supplement increase of at least Three 3 Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or 4 5 the district's daily rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 6 18-114.14 of this title. This increase shall be matched by state 7 dollars from the lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 8 9 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall be paid as regular annual compensation directly to teachers through school districts; and 10 2. 3. Master: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to 11 12 strengthen leadership. A person with a master teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary supplement increase of at least Five 13 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or 14 the district's daily rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition 15 to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 16 18-114.14 of this title. This increase, up to Forty Thousand 17 Dollars (\$40,000.00), shall be matched by state dollars from the 18 lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma 19 Statutes and shall be paid as regular annual compensation directly 20 to teachers through school districts. 21 If a person with a an advanced, lead, or master teaching 22

23 certificate changes school districts during the life of the

certificate, the terms of the contracts required in this subsection
 shall be subject to approval by the new employing school district.

M. 1. Any person who is eligible for a lead or master teaching 3 certificate described in this section shall make application for the 4 5 following school year with the State Board of Education. The application shall include a recommendation from the local board of 6 education and determination that the applicant has met the statutory 7 criteria. In reviewing an application, the local school board of 8 9 education and the superintendent shall consider the ability of the 10 school district to fulfill the additional requirements described in subsections I and J of this section before making a recommendation 11 12 to the State Board of Education.

13 2. The State Department of Education shall develop an 14 application to implement the provisions of this subsection and make 15 it available to school districts.

N. L. Beginning in the 2021-2022 2022-2023 school year, the 16 Department shall make the teaching certificates provided for in this 17 section available for any person who has received a recommendation 18 from their local board of education his or her school district and 19 who meets the eligibility criteria as outlined in each school 20 district's teacher evaluation system provided for in subsection I of 21 this section. 22 O. For the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years, the Department 23

24 shall identify school districts to implement the teaching

1 certificates provided for in this section on a pilot program basis 2 with the assistance of public-private partnerships, funding from 3 philanthropic organizations or federal grants.

P. The Department shall seek funding M. The funding necessary
for the administration of this section shall be provided from the

If funding for the administration of the teaching certificates
