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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 5-3.2, as
20	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 123, O.S.L. 2015 (2 O.S. Supp.
21	2020, Section 5-3.2), is amended to read as follows:
22	Section 5-3.2. A. The State Board of Agriculture is hereby
23	authorized to establish and administer the Oklahoma Agriculture
24	Enhancement and Diversification Program.

1 The purpose of the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and в. 2 Diversification Program is to promote and encourage the interests of agriculture through the allocation of funds, by grant or loan, to 3 individuals, cooperatives and other agricultural entities to: 4 5 1. Develop new or expanded uses of agricultural products; Develop new or expanded benefits of agricultural events; 6 2. 3. Increase agricultural productivity; 7 4. Provide added value to agricultural products or events; 8 9 5. Benefit the agricultural producer; and 10 6. Benefit the agricultural interests of Oklahoma this state. The Program shall consist of the following categories: 11 С. 12 1. Cooperative marketing Value-added agriculture grants and loans for entities or individuals intending to work together to 13 develop or establish production, processing or marketing of 14 agricultural products. The purpose of this category is to provide 15 funding for promoting productivity, providing added value to 16 agricultural products, stimulating and fostering agricultural 17 diversification and encouraging processing innovations; 18 2. Marketing and utilization grants and loans to assist in the 19 development or implementation of sound domestic or foreign marketing 20 plans for Oklahoma agricultural products, by-products, or new and 21 better uses for existing agricultural products through the financing 22 of marketing feasibility studies, business plans, and test 23 marketing; 24

Farm diversification grants or loans for projects dealing with the diversification of family farms or ranches to 2 nontraditional crops, livestock, agritourism, or on-farm, value-3 added processing of agricultural commodities; 4 5 4. Basic and applied 3. Product development and research grants and loans for agricultural business creation or expansion, or 6 research which will likely lead to a marketable agricultural product 7 through the focusing of research efforts on uses and processing of 8 9 Oklahoma agricultural products and by-products τ including but not 10 limited to: focused research which enhances the value of an 11 a. 12 agricultural product or by-product, feasibility studies, and 13 b. product development and test marketing costs, and с. 14 15 projects that are driven by an entrepreneur or the d. 16 industry; and 5. Agricultural event 4. Veteran or young farmer grants or 17 loans for veterans and young farmers that are engaged or will be 18 engaged in expansion or creation of events that benefit and further 19 the public interest in agriculture an agricultural business. 20

D. The State Board of Agriculture shall promulgate rules
governing the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification
Program.

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SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 5-3.4, as
 amended by Section 3, Chapter 123, O.S.L. 2015 (2 O.S. Supp. 2020,
 Section 5-3.4), is amended to read as follows:

Section 5-3.4. A. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture,
Food, and Forestry shall require eligible applicants to submit
information, forms and reports as are necessary to properly and
efficiently administer the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and
Diversification Program.

9 B. Persons may apply to the Department for grant or loan funds
10 in accordance with rules promulgated by the State Board of
11 Agriculture. Applications for grant or loan funds shall be approved
12 or denied by the Department in accordance with criteria promulgated
13 by the <u>State Board of Agriculture</u> pursuant to the Oklahoma
14 Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Program.

C. The State Board of Agriculture may also allocate monies from
the fund to eligible applicants on a matching basis.

17 D. Grant or loan funds may be made available to eligible 18 applicants pursuant to evaluation by the Department based on the 19 following criteria:

Preference may be given to the applicants whose:
 a. industrial and nonfood production processes utilize
 agricultural products,
 b. food, feed and fiber products and uses are innovative

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1 applications demonstrate a high probability of job с. creation and return-on-investment, 2 3 d. proposals feature research that is innovative as well as commercially plausible, 4 5 e. proposals demonstrate a high probability of rapid commercialization, 6 f. 7 projects demonstrate a shared commitment for funding from other private or public sources or from the 8 applicant, 9 proposals center efforts on nonurban locales, 10 g. principals are individuals, a group of individuals, an 11 h. individual on behalf of a group, or corporations which 12 13 meet the criteria set forth in Section 951 of Title 18 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to market a product or 14 15 formulate or implement a marketing plan for agricultural products which have not been marketed 16 through existing marketing cooperatives produced or 17 18 processed in this state, i. proposals contain the potential to create additional 19 income for the farm unit, and 20 j. proposals provide for new and innovative plans for 21 marketing the product, and 22 proposals for agricultural events benefit the entire 23 k. 24 state or a large geographic region of the state; and

Consideration shall not be given to applications for: 2 research or marketing plans which do not clearly meet a. 3 the stated objectives of the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Act, 4 5 b. proposals which are aimed solely at business expansion or creation without regard to agricultural products 6 utilization, or 7 research or marketing plans that cannot reasonably be 8 с. 9 expected to result in a viable commercial application, 10 or that are or have been duplicated by other research 11 efforts, or 12 d.___ proposals for agricultural events that do not result in expansion of the event or encourage additional 13 public interest in the event. 14 E. D. 1. Any information submitted to or compiled by the 15 Department with respect to the marketing plans, financial 16 17 statements, trade secrets, research concepts, methods or products, or any other proprietary information of persons, firms, 18 associations, partnerships, agencies, corporations, institutions of 19 higher education, nonprofit research institutions or other entities 20 pursuant to the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification 21 Program shall not be disclosed pursuant to the Oklahoma Open Records 22
- 23 Act or in public hearings and shall be kept confidential, except to
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the extent that the person or entity which provided such information or which is the subject of such information consents to disclosure. 2. Executive sessions may be held to discuss such materials if deemed necessary by the Board In the event an independent advisory group of reviewers are used to analyze and make recommendations for projects for approval by the Board, any meetings of such advisory groups shall be exempt from the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
