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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified		
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2129 of Title 70, unless there		
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:		
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- A. A student enrolled in and attending an institution within

  The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall be afforded the

  following rights:
- 1. The right to public and free expression of religion, speech and peaceable assembly including but not limited to:
  - a. the right to participate in religious student associations free from discrimination pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2119 through 2119.4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
  - b. the right to engage in expressive activity on campus pursuant to the provisions of Section 2120 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and
  - c. the right to an unbiased education that does not endorse, favor, promote, demean, show hostility toward or intentionally undermine any particular religion, nonreligious faith or religious perspective;
- 2. The right to an unbiased education that does not endorse, favor or promote socialism, communism or Marxism and that is free from anti-American bias; and
- 3. The right to an unbiased learning environment that is free from the display of flags or propaganda of any organization or symbol of socialism, communism, Marxism or anti-American sentiment.

B. Each institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall establish a Safe Campus Committee to be composed of seven (7) members. Each committee shall be composed of:

- 1. One student who is enrolled full time in the institution, appointed by the institution president or his or her designee;
- 2. One member of the institution's administration, appointed by the institution president or his or her designee;
- 3. One community representative who is not employed by the institution, who does not serve on the governing board for the institution and who has not donated to the institution, appointed by the Governor;
- 4. Two community representatives who are not employed by the institution, who are not serving on the governing board for the institution and who have not donated to the institution, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and
- 5. Two community representatives who are not employed by the institution, who are not serving on the governing board for the institution and who have not donated to the institution, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- C. Students enrolled in an institution of higher education and faculty employed by an institution of higher education may report violations of the rights provided for in subsection A of this section to the Safe Campus Committee. Reports may be made in a manner that protects the identity of the accuser from retribution.

D. The Safe Campus Committee shall create a due process plan for students and faculty to report an assignment or requirement that is believed to violate the rights provided for in subsection A of this section. The due process plan shall include, at a minimum, the following:

- 1. Designation of a hotline or email address to submit reports
  of violations of the rights provided for in subsection A of this
  section;
  - 2. Procedures for investigating and implementing punishment for false accusations;
  - 3. Procedures for reporting to law enforcement suspected violations that may constitute criminal activity or reasonably have the potential to endanger campus safety;
    - 4. A requirement that reported violations be investigated by the Safe Campus Committee in a timely manner and that individuals involved in the reported violations be notified of the committee's findings. The committee's findings may include but not be limited to exempting a student or faculty member from an assignment or requirement or recommending an alternative assignment or requirement; and
    - 5. A procedure for the Safe Campus Committee to hear appeals of the committee's findings.
- 23 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

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SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
