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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.65, as
15	amended by Section 1, Chapter 123, O.S.L. 2012 (19 O.S. Supp. 2020,
16	Section 180.65), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 180.65. A. The officers named in paragraph 1 of
18	Section 180.61 of this title shall have such number of regular or
19	technical deputies, assistants, investigators, evidence persons,
20	aides, stenographers or reporters, technicians, undersheriffs,
21	jailers, matrons, handwriting and fingerprint experts, probation
22	officers, juvenile officers, bailiffs $_{ au}$ or other help, whatever title
23	the principal officer may ascribe to the duties or functions to be
24	performed as authorized by law and clearly related to the proper

1 accomplishment of lawful functions, whether on whole or part-time basis, at such rates of salary or pay, subject to the provisions of 2 3 this section as hereinafter set forth, as the principal officer may propose and establish the need of and which the county excise board 4 5 may approve, for the adequate accomplishment of the functions of the office and the performance of the duties imposed thereon by law, 6 7 with due weight being given to employment on whole or part-time basis. However, no such employments shall exceed the amount of 8 9 lawful funds appropriated for such purpose.

10 Β. Each principal officer named in paragraph 1 of Section 180.61 of this title, except judges, shall designate of record in 11 12 the office of the county clerk a first or chief deputy, undersheriff, or assistant who shall be chargeable with all the 13 duties of such principal officer, while subject to the direction of 14 The first or chief deputy, undersheriff_{τ} or assistant 15 the same. shall carry on the duties of the office during the absence of the 16 principal officer or, in the event of the death, removal or 17 resignation of said principal officer, until a successor shall have 18 qualified. During periods of vacancy of the principal office, 19 resulting from the death, removal or resignation of the principal 20 officer, the chief deputy, undersheriff τ or assistant shall be 21 bonded in the same manner and in the same sum as required for the 22 principal officer. 23

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1 C. No deputy shall receive a salary in excess of the principal officer. The salaries set forth in this subsection within the 2 3 limitations shall be such amounts as the principal officer may propose and establish the need for and which the county excise board 4 5 may approve within salary and staffing requirements as may be prescribed by law. The numerical rank of any deputy or assistant to 6 be effective must be by designation of the principal officer by the 7 signature of the principal officer and filed with the county clerk. 8 9 The numerical rank of any deputy or assistant shall be within the 10 sole discretion of the principal officer.

D. The board of county commissioners shall continue to have the authority to recommend the total amount of funds that can be used for the combined salaries in each of the county offices covered by this act <u>title</u>. However, the approval of the funding for such offices shall continue to be the responsibility of the county excise board. County officers shall have no authority to make salary commitments beyond the amount of the funding so provided.

E. The county excise board shall meet with each of the principal officers of the county in budget planning conference or conferences, before July 1 of each year, to discuss personnel needs for each office for the succeeding fiscal year. The excise board shall provide the principal officers a tentative estimate of anticipated revenues for the next fiscal year prior to the budget planning conferences.

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1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.67, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 180.67. <u>A.</u> It is hereby declared to be the intent of 4 the Legislature that this act shall be the comprehensive salary code 5 for all counties of the state and no county officer in paragraph 1 6 of Section 180.61 of this title, or their assistants, deputies, or 7 other employees by whatever title designated, shall receive any 8 salary or wages except as provided in this act <u>Section 180.58 et</u> 9 seq. of this title.

10 <u>B. Counties may opt to utilize the appropriate State of</u> 11 <u>Oklahoma pay structure in lieu of the salary code referenced in</u> 12 subsection A of this section.

13SECTION 3.AMENDATORY19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.81, is14amended to read as follows:

Section 180.81. A. The officers named in paragraph 1 of 15 Section 180.73 of this title shall have such number of regular or 16 technical deputies, assistants, investigators, evidence persons, 17 aides, stenographers or reporters, technicians, undersheriffs, 18 jailers, matrons, handwriting and fingerprint experts, probation 19 officers, juvenile officers, bailiffs, or other help, whatever title 20 the principal officer may ascribe to the duties or functions to be 21 performed as authorized by law and clearly related to the proper 22 accomplishment of lawful functions, whether on whole or part-time 23 basis, at such rates of salary or pay, subject to the provisions of 24

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this section as hereinafter set forth, as the principal officer may propose and establish the need of and which the county excise board may approve, for the adequate accomplishment of the functions of the office and the performance of the duties imposed thereon by law, with due weight being given to employment on whole or part-time basis. However, no such employments shall exceed the amount of lawful funds appropriated for such purpose.

B. Each principal officer named in paragraph 1 of Section 8 9 180.73 of this title, except judges, shall designate of record in 10 the office of the county clerk a first or chief deputy or assistant who shall be chargeable with all the duties of such principal 11 officer, while subject to the direction of the same. The first or 12 chief deputy or assistant shall carry on the duties of the office 13 during the absence of the principal officer or, in the event of the 14 death, removal or resignation of said principal officer, until a 15 successor shall have qualified. During periods of vacancy of the 16 principal office, resulting from the death, removal or resignation 17 of the principal officer, the chief deputy or assistant shall be 18 bonded in the same manner and in the same sum as required for the 19 principal officer. 20

C. No deputy shall receive a salary in excess of the principal officer. The salaries set forth in this subsection within the limitations shall be such amounts as the principal officer may propose and establish the need for and which the county excise board

may approve within salary and staffing requirements as may be
prescribed by law. The numerical rank of any deputy or assistant to
be effective must be by designation of the principal officer by the
signature of the principal officer and filed with the county clerk.
The numerical rank of any deputy or assistant shall be within the
sole discretion of the principal officer.

D. The board of county commissioners shall continue to have the authority to recommend the total amount of funds that can be used for the combined salaries in each of the county offices covered by this act title. However, the approval of the funding for such offices shall continue to be the responsibility of the county excise board. County officers shall have no authority to make salary commitments beyond the amount of the funding so provided.

E. The county excise board shall meet with each of the principal officers of the county in budget planning conference or conferences, before July 1 of each year, to discuss personnel needs for each office for the succeeding fiscal year. The excise board shall provide the principal officers a tentative estimate of anticipated revenues for the next fiscal year prior to the budget planning conferences.

21 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 180.82, is 22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 180.82. <u>A.</u> It is hereby declared to be the intent of 24 the Legislature that this act shall be the comprehensive salary code

1	for all counties of the state which have approved an exemption of
2	household goods of the heads of families and livestock employed in
3	support of the family pursuant to the provisions of Section 6 of
4	Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution, and no county officer in
5	paragraph 1 of Section 180.73 of this title, or their assistants,
6	deputies, or other employees by whatever title designated, shall
7	receive any salary or wages except as provided in this act Section
8	180.71 et seq. of this title.
9	B. Counties may opt to utilize the appropriate State of
10	Oklahoma pay structure in lieu of the salary code referenced in
11	subsection A of this section.
12	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
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
