10 FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

11 An Act relating to daylight saving time; establishing
12 standard time in this state; specifying effect on
13 certain actions; exempting Oklahoma from the federal
14 daylight saving time provision; authorizing future
15 action; providing that act shall take effect on
16 certain authorization; providing for codification;
17 and providing an effective date.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.24 of Title 25, unless there
21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. The standard time in Oklahoma shall be known as Central
23 Daylight Time (CDT).

24 B. This section shall not be construed to affect the standard
time established by United States law governing the movements of
common carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for

1 performance of an act by an officer or department of the United
2 States, as established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or
3 regulation of the United States or an agency thereof.

4 C. As authorized by the Uniform Time Act of 1966, as amended,
5 and notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary by
6 the United States government relating to adoption of daylight saving
7 time by all of the states, this state elects to adopt such time and
8 elects to continue in force the terms of subsection A of this
9 section relating to the year-round standard time in Oklahoma.

10 D. The adopting of daylight saving time as provided for in this
11 section may be changed by future legislative action.

12 E. This act shall take effect only if the United States
13 Congress amends federal law that permits states to enter upon and
14 permanently observe daylight saving time.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
