12	which relates to personnel records; exempting certain personal information of public employees from
13	mandatory disclosure; and providing an effective date.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 51 O.S. 2011, Section 24A.7, as
18	amended by Section 1, Chapter 130, O.S.L. 2014 (51 O.S. Supp. 2020,
19	Section 24A.7), is amended to read as follows:
20	Section 24A.7 A. A public body may keep personnel records
21	confidential:
22	1. Which relate to internal personnel investigations including
23	examination and selection material for employment, hiring,
24	appointment, promotion, demotion, discipline, or resignation; or

Where disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted 2 invasion of personal privacy such as employee evaluations, payroll deductions, employment applications submitted by persons not hired 3 4 by the public body, and transcripts from institutions of higher 5 education maintained in the personnel files of certified public school employees; provided, however, that nothing in this subsection 6 shall be construed to exempt from disclosure the degree obtained and 7 the curriculum on the transcripts of certified public school 8 9 employees.
 - B. All personnel records not specifically falling within the exceptions provided in subsection A $\underline{\text{or }D}$ of this section shall be available for public inspection and copying including, but not limited to, records of:
 - An employment application of a person who becomes a public official;
 - 2. The gross receipts of public funds;
 - 3. The dates of employment, title or position; and
 - 4. Any final disciplinary action resulting in loss of pay, suspension, demotion of position, or termination.
 - C. Except as may otherwise be made confidential by statute, an employee of a public body shall have a right of access to his own personnel file.
- D. Public bodies shall keep confidential the <u>The</u> home address, addresses, home telephone numbers and social security, Social

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1	Security numbers of any person employed or formerly employed by the
2	public body, private email addresses, and private mobile phone
3	numbers of current and former public employees shall not be open to
4	public inspection or disclosure; provided, however, that nothing in
5	this subsection shall be construed to exempt from disclosure public
6	records created using a private email address or private mobile
7	phone.
8	E. Except as otherwise required by Section 6-101.16 of Title 70
9	of the Oklahoma Statutes, public bodies shall keep confidential all
10	records created pursuant to the Oklahoma Teacher and Leader
11	Effectiveness Evaluation System (TLE) which identify a current or
12	former public employee and contain any evaluation, observation or
13	other TLE record of such employee.
14	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
