10 An Act relating to schools; permitting Adulting 101
11 to be taught as an elective in public schools as
12 funding becomes available; listing areas of
13 instruction; allowing school district to provide
14 instruction for certain grades; authorizing district
15 to determine timing for instruction; permitting
16 partnership to assist in Adulting 101 instruction;
17 providing for integration of instruction in existing
18 course, a separate course or independent study;
19 authorizing instruction in person, virtually or both;
20 allowing district to determine best courses for
21 integration; specifying specialized teaching
22 certification is not required; authorizing State
23 Department of Education to promulgate rules;
24 providing for codification; and providing an
 effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.12 of Title 70, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. Subject to the availability of funding and in addition to
2 personal financial literacy education required by the Passport to
3 Financial Literacy Act, Adulting 101 may be taught as an elective
4 course in the public schools of this state. Adulting 101 may
5 include, but is not limited to, the following areas of instruction:

- 6 1. Nutrition programs, including cooking;
- 7 2. Automobile maintenance;
- 8 3. Household repairs;
- 9 4. First aid;
- 10 5. Etiquette, social interaction and interpersonal skills;
- 11 6. Professional development, including applying and
12 interviewing for jobs, resume writing and college readiness;
- 13 7. Basic financial skills, including understanding credit
14 scores and the path to home ownership;
- 15 8. Career pathways, including college, trade schools,
16 vocational programs and licensing and certificate programs;
- 17 9. State and local government;
- 18 10. Self-discipline and time management; and
- 19 11. Basics of mental health, including stress management
20 techniques.

21 B. School districts may provide instruction in Adulting 101 to
22 students during grades six through twelve. School districts may
23 determine when each area of instruction listed in subsection A of
24 this section may be presented to students. The school district may

1 partner with the career and technology education system, nonprofit
2 or private organizations or other programs with relevant expertise
3 in the areas of instruction approved by the State Department of
4 Education or school district to assist in teaching Adulting 101.

5 C. Adulting 101 instruction may be integrated into one or more
6 existing courses of study, provided in a separate Adulting 101
7 course or completed through independent instruction. The
8 instruction may be offered to students attending school in person,
9 virtually or a hybrid of both. School districts may determine into
10 which course or courses each area of instruction listed in
11 subsection A of this section shall be integrated. Specialized
12 certification shall not be required for teachers who are providing
13 Adulting 101 instruction.

14 D. The State Department of Education may promulgate rules to
15 implement the provisions of this section.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
