1 which relates to the State Broadband Deployment Grant Program and Fund; providing for codification; 2 providing for recodification; and declaring an emergency. 3 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 6 SECTION 1. 17 O.S. 2021, Section 139.201, is AMENDATORY 7 amended to read as follows: 8 Section 139.201 This act shall be known and may be cited as the 9 "Oklahoma Rural Broadband Expansion Act". 10 SECTION 2. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9201 of Title 74, unless there 11 12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 13 As used in this act: 14 "Board" means the Broadband Governing Board; 1. 15 2. "Council" means the Broadband Expansion Council; "Director" means the Executive Director of the Oklahoma 16 3. 17 Broadband Office; 18 "FCC" means the Federal Communications Commission; 4. "Joint Committee" means the Legislature's Joint Committee on 19 5. 20 Pandemic Relief Funding, created by the Legislature to give 21 legislative oversight to the dispersal of the American Rescue Plan 22 Act's State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, Capital Projects Fund, 23 and any future federal recovery funds as identified by the 24 Legislature;

6. "Map" means the statewide map showing broadband access,
 adoption, speed capabilities, and all other information the Office
 deems necessary;

7. "Office" means the Oklahoma Broadband Office;
8. "Plan" means the Statewide Broadband Plan;
9. "Program" means the State Broadband Grant Program; and
10. "Revolving fund" means the State Broadband Grant Program
8 Revolving Fund.

9 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9202 of Title 74, unless there 11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. 1. There is hereby created until June 30, 2028, the
Broadband Governing Board. The Board shall oversee the Oklahoma
Broadband Office. Effective June 30, 2028, the Board shall
terminate. The Board shall utilize the year prior to the
termination date for the purpose of ceasing the Board's affairs.

The Board shall receive regular reports from the Office's
 Executive Director and the Executive Director's staff on the status
 of the Statewide Broadband Plan, the State Broadband Grant Program,
 other developed grant programs, and other projects the Office is
 undertaking, during regularly scheduled meetings.

B. The Board shall consist of nine (9) members. Two members
shall be appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
Representatives, two members shall be appointed by the President Pro

1 Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, three members shall be 2 appointed by the Governor, one member shall be the Lieutenant Governor, and one member shall be the State Treasurer. Except as 3 4 provided in subsection C of this section, appointees shall serve 5 until June 30, 2028. No individual with an official affiliation, paid or unpaid, with any potential recipient of a grant administered 6 7 under the provisions of this act, shall be appointed to or serve on the Board. 8

9 C. Each appointee shall serve at the pleasure of his or her 10 appointing authority and may be removed or replaced without cause. 11 The Board shall hold an organizational meeting not later D. 1. 12 than thirty (30) days from the effective date of this act. At such 13 meeting, the Board shall adopt qualifications and a salary range for 14 an Executive Director for the Oklahoma Broadband Office based on the 15 recommendations of the Human Capital Management Division of the 16 Office of Management and Enterprise Services, and provide for the 17 process of filling the position in a reasonable time in accordance 18 with the laws of this state.

19 2. The Board shall hold meetings as necessary at a place and 20 time to be fixed by the Board. The Board shall elect, at its first 21 meeting, one of its members to serve as chair and another of its 22 members to serve as vice-chair. At the first meeting in each 23 calendar year thereafter, the chair and vice-chair for the ensuing 24 year shall be elected. Special meetings may be called by the chair

or by five members of the Board by delivery of written notice to
 each member of the Board. A majority of members serving on the
 Board shall constitute a quorum of the Board.

E. If a Board member is unable to fulfill his or her term for any reason, the appointing authority of such member may appoint a replacement to complete the remainder of the term.

F. The Board shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act8 and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

9 G. The Board shall employ, evaluate, and maintain an Executive 10 Director of the Office who shall serve at the pleasure of the Board 11 and may be removed or replaced without cause.

H. The Board shall promulgate rules as necessary to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma Broadband Expansion Act and for the governance and operation of the Oklahoma Broadband Office.

I. The Board shall approve or disapprove all grant and incentive programs created by the Office under the provisions of this act or under law.

J. The Board shall oversee the annual budget for the Office, which shall be funded from the allowed administrative expenses of applicable federal programs and funds available for expenditure from the State Broadband Grant Program Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 10 of this act.

K. The Board shall approve the Statewide Broadband Plan andupdates to the Plan as necessary.

1SECTION 4.AMENDATORY17 O.S. 2021, Section 139.202, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 139.202 A. There is hereby created, until June 30,
<u>2028</u>, the Rural Broadband Expansion Council. Effective June 30,
<u>2028</u>, the Council shall terminate. The Council shall utilize the
<u>year prior to the termination date for the purpose of ceasing the</u>
Council's affairs.

8 B. The Council shall consist of sixteen (16) fourteen (14)
9 persons to be selected as follows:

10 Three members shall be appointed by the Governor, one of 1. 11 whom shall be a government official who has knowledge of and 12 experience with the technology assets and operations of the Oklahoma 13 Department of Transportation, OneNet and the Oklahoma Office of 14 Management and Enterprise Services and who is not and has not been 15 previously employed by OneNet the individual serving as the 16 Executive Director of the Oklahoma Broadband Office, one of whom 17 shall be a current or past mayor of a municipality having a 18 population of less than thirty-five thousand (35,000) persons 19 according to the latest Federal Decennial Census or most recent 20 population estimate and which is not part of either the Oklahoma 21 City or Tulsa Metropolitan Statistical Area Areas, and one of whom 22 shall be a representative of a wireless telecommunications provider 23 with operations in Oklahoma and at least twenty-four other states

1 resident of this state and a wireless Internet service provider 2 (WISP);

Five members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the 3 2. 4 Oklahoma House of Representatives, one of whom shall represent the 5 interests of rural Internet service providers, one of whom shall be a private sector technology professional with expertise in broadband 6 7 connectivity, access, price and related economic factors, one of whom shall represent the interests of rural health care, one of whom 8 9 shall be a representative of a wireless telecommunications provider not affiliated with an incumbent local exchange carrier in Oklahoma 10 11 and one who shall be a resident of this state and a wireless 12 Internet service provider (WISP) representative of a wireless 13 telecommunications provider with operations in Oklahoma and at least 14 twenty-four other states;

15 Five members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore 3. 16 of the Oklahoma State Senate, one of whom shall be a professional 17 having academic expertise in large-scale information technology 18 infrastructure with emphasis on rural broadband access, one of whom 19 shall represent the interests of rural business enterprises, one of 20 whom shall be a citizen from a community of less than fifty thousand 21 (50,000) persons which is not part of either the Oklahoma City or 22 Tulsa Metropolitan Statistical Areas, one of whom shall be a rural 23 electric cooperative representative and one who shall be an Oklahoma 24 resident and Tribal Leader of a tribe recognized in this state; and

4. One nonvoting member of the Oklahoma House of

2 Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker;

3 5. One nonvoting member of the Oklahoma State Senate to be 4 appointed by the President Pro Tempore; and

6. One nonvoting member to be selected by the Oklahoma
Corporation Commission who has expertise in administration of the
Universal Service Fund, but who is not an elected member of the
Commission.

9 C. The Council shall hold an organizational meeting not later 10 than sixty (60) days from May 22, 2020, and shall select from its 11 membership a chair and vice-chair or co-chairs. The chair or co-12 chair of the Council shall be a person who is not a government 13 employee or public official, unless the person or persons are 14 legislators.

15 D. A quorum of the membership of the Council shall be necessary 16 in order to take any final action pursuant to the provisions of this 17 act.

18 E. D. The Council shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting
 19 Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

F. The Rural Broadband Expansion Council shall conduct a study of rural broadband access in the state and shall divide the state into separate geographic areas based on the information it obtains regarding existing capability for persons and businesses to access broadband telecommunication services, the cost for obtaining the

1	services from existing service providers, the estimated costs for
2	improving rural broadband access, the likelihood of changes in rural
3	broadband access in the near and intermediate future based on
4	available information regarding private or public sector plans or
5	programs to create or enhance broadband access in rural areas, the
6	need for change in state or local law or policy that impacts the
7	ability for persons or business entities in rural areas to access
8	broadband services at a reasonable price and such other information
9	as the Council may determine to be relevant in order to establish
10	the geographic areas.
11	G. The Council shall incorporate the information as described
12	in subsection F of this section into a mapping system that depicts
13	resources, broadband coverage, connectivity speeds and such other
14	features as the Council deems relevant.
15	H. The Council shall undertake a study of incentives or
16	programs that would have the effect of improving existing rural
17	broadband access and establishing broadband access to areas which
18	currently do not have such access. The incentives or programs may
19	include federal funds, tribal funds or resources, donated funds or
20	funding available from foundations, endowments or similar sources,
21	state or local tax incentives, state or local financing incentives
22	or options or federal, tribal, state or local regulatory policies
23	that would be conducive to improving existing broadband access or
24	establishing such access where it does not currently exist.

1	I. The Council shall have the right to obtain information from
2	the Oklahoma Corporation Commission or other state agencies, to the
3	extent information requested is not required to be kept confidential
4	pursuant to some other requirement, regarding any of the matters as
5	specified in this section relevant to the Council's duties.
6	J. The Council shall have the right to obtain information from
7	counties, cities, towns, school districts, career technology
8	districts, public trusts, or other entities or instrumentalities of
9	local government, to the extent information requested is not
10	required to be kept confidential pursuant to some other requirement,
11	regarding any of the matters as specified in this section relevant
12	to the Council's duties.
13	K. The Council shall utilize the

12 N. The Council shall give emphasis to the prevention of 4. 13 Preventing duplication of facilities and investment when it the 14 Office makes policy grant recommendations. The With the input of 15 the Council, the Oklahoma Broadband Office shall establish objective standards in order to determine whether the construction of rural 16 17 broadband access constitutes duplication of facilities and 18 investment and also the role of any recommended incentives that 19 would benefit entities in the private sector so that public 20 resources are effectively utilized and that duplication of efforts 21 is avoided.

22 O. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall create a dedicated
 23 webpage or website in order to allow public access to the actions
 24 and recommendations of the Council. The webpage or website shall

1 contain the mapping system required by subsection G of this section
2 and its related information.

3 P. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall provide 4 administrative support to the Council and shall utilize the Digital 5 Transformation Program Revolving Fund for expenses related to such 6 administrative support as provided by Section 36 of Title 62 of the 7 Oklahoma Statutes.

Q. The Rural Broadband Expansion Council shall submit an annual 8 9 report, not later than January 31, summarizing discussions, 10 testimony, analysis, information or other actions and significant 11 events during the preceding calendar year and containing the 12 recommendations, if any, by the Council for legislation, action by 13 executive branch agencies or other actions in furtherance of the 14 mission and duties of the Council. The report shall be submitted to 15 the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives 16 and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate. 17 R. 20	G. The Council shall receive administrative support from the
21	Oklahoma Broadband Office.
22	SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9204 of Title 74, unless there
24	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 Α. There is hereby created until June 30, 2028, the Oklahoma 2 Broadband Office, to serve as the state's sole administrator of the functions, powers, and duties assigned to the Office in this act or 3 under law. Effective June 30, 2028, the Office shall terminate and 4 5 all personnel positions shall be abolished. The Office shall 6 utilize the year prior to the termination date for the purpose of 7 ceasing the Office's affairs.

The Office shall receive administrative assistance from the 8 Β. 9 Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES), which shall 10 provide through existing OMES resources, administrative assistance 11 upon request in writing or electronic correspondence from the 12 Office's Executive Director, within a reasonable time to allow the 13 performance of the Office's duties or respond in writing within ten 14 (10) days of the request providing reasons why the request cannot be 15 fulfilled. If the request cannot be fulfilled utilizing existing 16 resources, OMES may charge the Office for the actual cost to fulfill 17 the request.

18 C. The Office shall be governed by the Broadband Governing19 Board, created pursuant to Section 3 of this act.

D. The Office shall be advised by the Broadband Expansion
Council, created pursuant to Section 4 of this act.

E. The Office shall have an Executive Director who shall
oversee the operations of the Office including, but not limited to:

Overseeing the creation, maintenance, and completion of the
 Statewide Broadband Plan;

3 2. Communicating the state's progress in achieving the goals4 and implementation of the Statewide Broadband Plan;

5 3. The creation, housing, and updating of a statewide broadband6 services map;

7 4. Overseeing of grant applications and awards for connectivity
8 and affordability projects;

9 5. Making recommendations to the Board regarding procedural and10 administrative rules for the Office; and

Employment and management of Office staff subject to the
 limitations and requirements of this act and subject to the
 limitations and requirements of the Broadband Governing Board.

F. The Executive Director shall regularly report to the Council and the Board and shall submit an annual report to the Office of the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Office of the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.

SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9205 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 existing capabilities to access broadband a. 2 telecommunication services, the costs of obtaining broadband services from 3 b. 4 existing providers, 5 с. the estimated cost to improve broadband access, and the likelihood of changes in broadband access in the 6 d. 7 near and intermediate future based on available information regarding public and private programs to 8 9 enhance access and adoption; and 10 2. Maintain, update, and execute the Statewide Broadband Plan 11 as necessary. 12 Β. The Office shall incorporate the information as described in 13 subsection A of this section into a mapping system that depicts 14 resources, broadband coverage, connectivity speeds, and other such 15 features as the Office deems relevant. The Office may also purchase 16 data sets it deems necessary to complete such mapping system. 17 С. The Office shall establish policies and regulations as may 18 be necessary to implement the provisions of this act. 19 The Office shall establish policy as needed to implement a D. 20 process whereby impacted parties may challenge or protest data and 21 information published on the Office's mapping system. The process 22 shall include, but not be limited to, features that: 23 Are heard and ruled on at the Office level; 1. 24

2. Provide for a ruling by the Office within sixty (60) days of
 the submitted challenge or protest; and

3 3. Upon successful protest action, result in a timely4 correction of the map.

5 Ε. The Office shall perform and maintain a study of existing grants, incentives, and programs that may improve physical access to 6 7 broadband along with adoption of broadband technologies. The grants, incentives, and programs may include federal funds, state 8 9 funds or resources, tribal funds or resources, donated funds, or 10 funding available from foundations, endowments or similar resources, 11 state or local tax incentives, state or local financing incentives 12 or options, or federal, tribal, state or local regulatory policies 13 that would be conducive to improving existing broadband access or 14 establishing access where it does not currently exist. The Office 15 shall regularly report on the currently available grants, 16 incentives, and programs and how best to utilize each.

17 Ε. The Office shall create, and update no less than biannually, 18 The Plan shall detail what areas are a Statewide Broadband Plan. 19 served, underserved, or unserved according to the prevailing 20 definitions of the FCC, and how best to improve the infrastructure 21 and connectivity in underserved and unserved areas. The Plan shall 22 include, but shall not be limited to, detailing a pathway for 23 ninety-five percent (95%) of the state's population to be adequately 24 served by June 30, 2028.

1 G. The Office shall create the Capital Projects Fund Grant 2 Report or provide the necessary information to the state entity drafting the Report. The Report shall be submitted to the 3 4 Department of the Treasury no later than September 24, 2022. The 5 Office shall maintain the Report and submit any and all additional information as required. The Office shall work with the Joint 6 7 Committee to ensure all approved broadband projects utilizing funds from the Capital Projects Fund follow the correct reporting 8 9 requirements based on Department of Treasury guidance.

H. Additionally, the Office is authorized to seek, apply for, and administer funding through grant opportunities. The Office is also authorized to administer grant funding awards to recipients and subrecipients.

14 I. On or before October 31, 2022, the Office, with the advice 15 of the Council, shall develop a set of broadband grants or incentive 16 awards guidelines to be approved by the Board. The grants and 17 incentive awards shall be for unserved and underserved areas. The 18 Office shall submit a copy of the guidelines to the Office of the 19 Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the Office of the 20 President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, and to the 21 offices of the chairs of the appropriate legislative committees. 22 The quidelines shall:

23 1. Consider a weighted approach for awards based upon the 24 following:

18 3. Include annual reporting requirements of award recipients to 19 assess effectiveness of such incentives which, shall include, but 20 not be limited to, changes in coverage resulting from implementing 21 awarded grants and incentives.

22 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9206 of Title 74, unless there 24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: A. State agencies, counties, cities, towns, school districts,
career technology districts, institutions of higher education,
public trusts, other entities or instrumentalities of local
government, and Internet service providers shall, at the request of
the Oklahoma Broadband Office, provide information to the Office
regarding any matters as specified in this act relevant to the
Office's duties.

B. The Office shall maintain confidentiality as required by law
for all information provided under the provisions of this section.
SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9207 of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. By December 31, 2022, the Executive Director of the Oklahoma
Broadband Office shall identify all programs, personnel, and assets
within state government that are duplicative or complementary to the
mission of the Office and of such recommend which programs,
personnel, and assets the Executive Director identifies as needing
to be transferred to the Office, except as provided in subsection C
of this section.

B. Upon the receipt of the recommendation provided for in
subsection A of this section, the Director of the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services is authorized to transfer such
programs, personnel, and assets to the Office.

C. The following shall be exempt from the provisions of
 subsections A and B of this section:

Those assets or personnel associated with the regulation of
 broadband and Internet connectivity at the Oklahoma Corporation
 Commission;

6 2. Those assets or personnel associated with the Oklahoma
7 Universal Service Fund located at the Corporation Commission; and
8 3. Assets owned by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation
9 and the staff required to operate said assets.

10 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9208 of Title 74, unless there 12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

No funds received by the State Treasury dedicated to broadband through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021, Public Law 117-58, by earlier federal legislation, by state appropriation, or any subsequent federal funding dedicated to broadband shall be expended by the state, except as authorized by the Oklahoma Broadband Office.

SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9209 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Office, with the participation and advice of the
Broadband Expansion Council and approval from the Board, shall
establish the State Broadband Grant Program. The Program shall

include development of competitive grants to be awarded to
applicants seeking to expand access to broadband Internet services
in this state, focusing on areas considered unserved and underserved
by the FCC. The Office, Council, and Board shall examine best
practices in other states to facilitate the framework of the
Program. The Office shall administer the Program.

B. No grants shall be developed or awarded under the provisions
of this program that would duplicate existing broadband Internet
services in this state.

10 C. In the administration of the grant program authorized by 11 this section, the Office shall secure service testing data to ensure 12 grant recipients provide the service or services proposed by such 13 recipients when applying for such grants.

D. All grant awards authorized pursuant to the provisions of this section shall include a claw-back provision. For purposes of this subsection a "claw-back provision" shall mean a condition precedent to participate in the program whereby a grant recipient formally agrees to reimburse the program all or part of a grant award upon the failure of the recipient to fulfill contract terms included in the grant award.

E. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Office to be designated the "State Broadband Grant Program Revolving Fund". The revolving fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies designated for deposit to said fund. All monies accruing
to the credit of said revolving fund are hereby appropriated and may
be budgeted and expended by the Office for purposes of awarding
grants by and through the Office, pursuant to subsection A of this
section and for the operating expenses of the Office.

6 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 17 O.S. 2021, Section 139.203, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 Section 139.203 A. On or before October 31, 2021 2022, and 9 annually thereafter, in accordance with the FCC Data Collection and 10 Methodology, private broadband service providers operating in this 11 state and satellite-based broadband private providers that have been 12 designated as an eligible telecommunications carrier pursuant to 47 13 U.S.C., Section 214(e)(6) for any portion of Oklahoma, hereinafter 14 referred to as "private providers", shall submit to the Oklahoma 15 Department of Commerce and the Rural Broadband Expansion Council 16 Oklahoma Broadband Office the broadband network area coverage map 17 data the private providers are required to submit to the Federal 18 Communications Commission FCC pursuant to the federal Broadband 19 Deployment Accuracy and Technological Availability Act, 47 U.S.C., 20 Section 641 et seq. The map data shall be updated annually through 21 a supplemental submission by the private providers that reflects 22 changes in area coverage from the preceding year, including updates 23 that are the result of incentives and grants created, administered, 24 or awarded by the Office. The Department Office is authorized to

promulgate rules for the collection of the broadband network area
 coverage map reports from the private providers.

On or before October 31 of each year, OneNet, the Office of 3 в. 4 Management and Enterprise Services, the Oklahoma Corporation 5 Commission, and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, 6 hereinafter referred to as "public entities", shall submit to the 7 Oklahoma Department of Commerce Office and the Rural Broadband Expansion Council broadband network area coverage map data of all 8 9 assets and network coverage in the format requested by the Oklahoma 10 Department of Commerce and Council Office.

11 C. Private providers and public entities shall disclose to the 12 Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Rural Broadband Expansion 13 Council Office the properties they serve and the maximum advertised 14 download and upload speeds at which they provide any Internet 15 services to those properties, and shall be afforded by the Oklahoma 16 Department of Commerce and the Council a process to petition for 17 correction of potential inaccuracies in the map.

18 The reports and information required to be disclosed D. 19 pursuant to this section by private providers shall remain 20 confidential pursuant to Section 24A.10 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma 21 Statutes. The Council Office shall determine the required 22 submission format of the data submitted under the provisions of this 23 act. In no instance shall private providers be required to submit 24 any data, in substantive content or form or schedule, beyond or in

advance of the data described in subsection A of this section, or
any data containing customer information, such as names, addresses
or account numbers. The Department shall use a third party to
collect the data submitted by private providers under the provisions
of this act. The third party shall deliver data to the Department
following a white label process to remove information identifying
specific providers.

E. On or before December 1 of each year, the Department and the 8 9 Council Office shall update the statewide broadband services map 10 required by subsection G E of Section 139.202 of Title 17 of the 11 Oklahoma Statutes 5 of this act using the data collected under the 12 provisions of this act in a manner that identifies the assets and 13 service areas of the public entities while displaying anonymized 14 information, without reference to any specific private provider, of 15 the assets and service areas of private providers.

F. After the FCC completes the national Broadband Serviceable Location Fabric and accompanying National Broadband Availability Map, the Rural Broadband Expansion Council shall annually evaluate whether the State of Oklahoma needs to continue producing an annually updated statewide broadband map in accordance with the provisions of this section.

RECODIFICATION 17 O.S. 2021, Section 8 139.203, as amended by Section 11 of this act, shall be recodified 9 as Section 9210 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering. 11 SECTION 15. 17 O.S. 2021, Section 139.204, is REPEALER 12 hereby repealed. SECTION 16.
