7 AS INTRODUCED

8 An Act relating to pharmacists; authorizing
9 administration of COVID-19 vaccinations; providing
10 qualifications and requirements; providing for
11 codification; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 375 of Title 59, unless there is
15 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. Licensed pharmacists are authorized to administer certain
17 vaccinations including:

18 1. A coronavirus vaccine or vaccine that contains a coronavirus
19 vaccine in combination with other vaccines, that is approved by the
20 United States Food and Drug Administration, to an adult patient; or

21 2. A coronavirus vaccine or vaccine that contains a coronavirus
22 vaccine in combination with other vaccines, that is approved by the
23 United States Food and Drug Administration for use in patients under
24 eighteen (18) years of age.

1 B. Licensed pharmacists shall be acting within the scope of
2 their profession when administering vaccinations related to COVID-
3 19.

4 C. Licensed pharmacists must comply with recordkeeping and
5 reporting requirements of the state, including reporting adverse
6 events and submitting the required immunization information to local
7 and state entities.

8 D. Licensed or registered pharmacy interns are authorized to
9 administer certain vaccinations including:

10 1. A coronavirus vaccine or vaccine that contains a coronavirus
11 vaccine in combination with other vaccines, that is approved by the
12 United States Food and Drug Administration, to an adult patient; or

13 2. A coronavirus vaccine or vaccine that contains a coronavirus
14 vaccine in combination with other vaccines, that is approved by the
15 United States Food and Drug Administration for use in patients under
16 eighteen (18) years of age.

17 E. Licensed or registered pharmacy interns must follow certain
18 requirements when administering vaccinations related to COVID-19.

19 F. The licensed or registered pharmacy intern must complete a
20 practical training program approved by the Accreditation Council for
21 Pharmacy Education. The training program must include the
22 following:

23 1. Hands-on injection technique;
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1 2. Clinical evaluation of indications and contraindications of
2 vaccines; and

3 3. The recognition and treatment of emergency reactions to
4 vaccines.

5 G. The licensed or registered pharmacy intern must have current
6 certification in basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
