9	An Act relating to militia; amending 44 O.S. 2021, Sections 21, 23, 24, 25, 45, 48, 49, 235, 241, and
10	243, which relate to the Oklahoma Military Code; clarifying personnel to staff joint forces
11	headquarters; providing for Adjutant General to assign necessary persons to headquarters; clarifying
12	personnel in state military forces; providing gender- neutral language; modifying eligibility criteria for
13	Adjutant General; authorizing Governor to waive certain eligibility requirements; directing certain
14	comparable rate of compensation for Adjutant General; providing gender-neutral language; modifying oath of
15	office for National Guard officers; updating gender- neutral language; clarifying personnel discharge
16	procedures by the Governor as Commander in Chief; authorizing certain personnel matters to be decided
17	according to customs and state and federal regulations; granting supervision and control of the
18	Oklahoma National Guard Museum to the Oklahoma National Guard Museum Board of Governors;
19	establishing membership of Board of Governors; providing for membership terms; prohibiting certain
20	persons from appointment; providing for appointment of vacancies; prohibiting members from certain
21	employment; directing promulgation of rules; listing specified powers and duties of Board of Governors;
22	prescribing publication of rules and regulations for operation and maintenance of Oklahoma National Guard
23	Museum; providing for legal counsel by the State
24	Judge Advocate or designee; removing reference to certain regulations prescribed by the Secretary of

1 Defense; striking requirement that personnel procedures be in conformity with certain laws, rules, 2 and regulations; amending 44 O.S. 2021, Sections 821, 875, and 905, which relate to the Oklahoma Uniform 3 Code of Military Justice; prohibiting federal officials from convening certain court-martial proceedings without prior consent of the Governor; 4 requiring consent to be in writing and published by 5 Governor; authorizing Governor to reappoint certain dismissed officers; providing for reappointment procedures; directing Governor or Adjutant General to 6 prescribe certain regulations; prohibiting act of 7 forgery; prescribing punishment for forgery; and providing an effective date. 8 9 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. 44 O.S. 2021, Section 21, is 11 AMENDATORY 12 amended to read as follows: 13 Section 21. The Military Department of the State of Oklahoma is 14 hereby established and shall be under the command and control of the 15 Governor as Commander in Chief, with the Adjutant General as the 16 executive and administrative head thereof. The Military Department 17 shall be constituted of the state military forces, as defined by 18 Section 801 of this title, and is hereby organized into a joint 19 headquarters which shall be identified as the joint forces 20 headquarters. The joint forces headquarters shall be jointly 21 staffed by Army National Guard and Air National Guard personnel of 22 the state military forces who, under the authority and direction of 23 the Adjutant General, shall support and assist the Adjutant General 24 in the exercise of command and control over state military forces

when not activated for federal duty under Title 10 of the United
States Code. There shall be assigned to the joint force
headquarters, officers, enlisted personnel, and civilian employees
as may be considered necessary by the Governor as Commander in Chief
and as may be authorized by law and Army National Guard regulations
and Air National Guard regulations the Adjutant General.

7 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 23, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 23. The Governor of the state shall be the Commander in 10 Chief of the Militia, and as such shall have supreme command of the 11 military forces of the state while in the service of the state or 12 until they are ordered and accepted into the actual service of the 13 United States within the meaning of Clauses 15 and 16 of Section 8 14 of Article I of the United States Constitution and Section 2 of 15 Article II of the United States Constitution. While in the service 16 of the state State of Oklahoma, he the Governor shall have power to 17 muster out any organization of the state military forces, discharge 18 enlisted men personnel, as provided herein, and perform such other 19 acts in keeping with the laws of the Commander in Chief, subject to 20 the laws of the United States and regulations prescribed by the 21 President of the United States. No armed military force from 22 another state or territory shall be permitted to enter the state 23 without his permission of the Governor, unless such military force 24 be a part of the United States, or is acting under the authority of

1 the United States. No independent military organization, except as 2 a corps of cadets at the educational institutions, shall be permitted to bear arms without first securing permission of the 3 Commander in Chief. 4 5 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 24, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Section 24. A. The Adjutant General shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, and 8 9 shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. 10 в. To be eligible to hold the office of Adjutant General of 11 this state, at the time of appointment the appointee: 12 1. Shall be a federally recognized and currently serving 13 officer of the Oklahoma National Guard and of the National Guard of 14 the United States for who is not presently retired nor has ever 15 previously retired from the National Guard and with no less than 16 three (3) years of service in the Oklahoma National Guard; 17 2. Shall possess at least the rank of Colonel; and 18 3. If not already a general officer, shall be eligible for a 19 Certificate of Eligibility pursuant to federal law and applicable 20 regulations issued by the Chief of the National Guard Bureau. 21 C. If the Oklahoma National Guard is in active federal service 22 and no persons having the qualifications required in subsection B of 23 this section are available within the state, then the Governor may 24 appoint, subject to the advice and consent of the Senate, any

1 suitably qualified person who at any time in the preceding ten (10) 2 years would have been qualified, as above, and who has served at 3 least two (2) years in active federal service in the grade of 4 Colonel or higher pursuant to the requirements of subsection B of 5 this section. 6 D. The Governor may waive the requirements provided in 7 subsection B of this section so long as the officer to be appointed is a currently serving officer in the Oklahoma National Guard with 8 9 no less than three (3) years of service in the Oklahoma National 10 Guard. 44 O.S. 2021, Section 25, is 11 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 12 amended to read as follows: 13 Section 25. A. The Adjutant General shall have the rank of 14 Major General and devote full time to the duties of the office. 15 Regardless of whether or not the Adjutant General has been 16 recognized federally at the rank of Major General at the time of 17 appointment by the Governor, the Adjutant General shall be 18 compensated at the same rate of pay and allowances afforded to a 19 Major General serving on federal Title 10 active duty with the same 20 time in grade. 21 Β. The Governor may appoint Assistant Adjutants General for 22 Army and Assistant Adjutants General for Air to assist the Adjutant 23 General in the discharge and performance of his or her duties. When 24 appointing Assistant Adjutants General, the Governor shall take into

1 consideration the number of such positions contemplated or 2 recommended by the National Guard Bureau for manning the joint forces headquarters of a state. Such Assistant Adjutants General 3 4 shall have the qualifications prescribed by law for the Adjutant 5 General and shall have the rank of Brigadier General. The Assistant Adjutants General appointed by the Governor shall be considered 6 7 staff officers and not commanders except that, in the discretion of the Adjutant General, specific command or supervisory authority may 8 9 be delegated by the Adjutant General to an Assistant Adjutant 10 General but such delegation shall be accomplished in writing and 11 shall be considered a military publication, as defined in Section 12 801 of this title (Article 1).

13 C. Other general officers assigned to billets within the state 14 military forces, including certain billets within the joint forces 15 headquarters, shall be considered staff officers and not commanders 16 except that, in the discretion of the Adjutant General, specific 17 command or supervisory authority may be delegated by the Adjutant 18 General to such general officers but such delegation shall be 19 accomplished in writing and shall be considered a military 20 publication, as defined in Section 801 of this title (Article 1).

D. The Adjutant General may employ a state employee in the position of Executive Assistant and Programs Manager for the Military Department of the state. Said position shall be

unclassified and exempt from the Oklahoma Personnel Act and the
 Merit Rules for Employment, except leave regulations.

3 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 45, is 4 amended to read as follows:

Section 45. Oath for National Guard Officers. Each
commissioned officer, before entering upon the duties of his <u>or her</u>
office, shall take and subscribe to the following oath, or such
other oath as may be required by National Guard Regulations:

9 "I, do solemnly swear that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the 10 State of Oklahoma against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I 11 12 will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I will obey 13 the lawful orders of the President of the United States and the 14 Governor of the State of Oklahoma; that I make this obligation 15 freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion, and 16 that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office 17 of, in the National Guard of the United States and the State 18 of Oklahoma upon which I am about to enter, so help me God." 19 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 48, is 20 amended to read as follows: 21 Section 48. Enlisted men personnel discharged from service in 22 the Oklahoma National Guard of this state shall receive a discharge

24 be prescribed by National Guard regulations, and in time of peace

in writing in such form and with such classification as is or shall

1 discharges may be given prior to the expiration of terms of 2 enlistment in the following cases:

By sentence of a general court-martial; by direction of the 3 4 Governor on account of disability; on account of sentence of 5 imprisonment by a civil court whether suspended or not; on account of a bona fide permanent change of residence to another state; and 6 7 for the purpose of enlisting in regular Army, Air Force, Navy, or Marine Corps, and for such other causes as may be prescribed by 8 9 National Guard regulations or the Governor as Commander in Chief; 10 provided, that an enlisted man person who has not returned or 11 accounted for all of the public property for which he or she is 12 responsible, shall under no circumstances receive an honorable 13 discharge.

14SECTION 7.AMENDATORY44 O.S. 2021, Section 49, is15amended to read as follows:

Section 49. All matters relating to organization, commissioning and discharging of officers, enlisting and discharge of enlisted men <u>personnel</u>, discipline, and government of the National Guard, not otherwise provided in this code, shall may be decided by <u>according</u> <u>to</u> the customs, regulations, and usage of the United States Army or the United States Air Force or National Guard regulations.

22 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 235, is 23 amended to read as follows:

1	Section 235. <u>A.</u> There is hereby created the Oklahoma National
2	Guard Museum, to be under the supervision <u>and control</u> of the
3	Oklahoma National Guard Museum Board of Governors. The Oklahoma
4	National Guard Museum Board of Governors shall consist of at least
5	five, but no more than eleven, members all of whom shall be
6	appointed by the Adjutant General and shall serve at the pleasure of
7	the Adjutant General. The Adjutant General may Each member shall be
8	appointed for a term of three (3) years, and the Board of Governors
9	shall be divided into three (3) classes which shall be staggered in
10	their terms. No person shall be appointed to the Board of Governors
11	who is related by affinity or consanguinity within the third degree
12	to any person employed by the Oklahoma National Guard Museum.
13	Members of the Board of Governors shall continue in office until the
14	expiration of their terms and until their successors are appointed
15	and enter upon the duties of their offices. Any vacancy on the
16	Board of Governors resulting from any cause shall be filled by
17	appointment by the Adjutant General for the remainder of the term
18	established pursuant to this subsection.
19	B. No member of the Board of Governors shall be employed by the
20	Oklahoma National Guard Museum during the time of his or her service
21	on the Board of Governors nor shall any person who served as a
22	member of the Board of Governors be employed by the Oklahoma
23	National Guard Museum subsequent to his or her service on the Board
24	of Governors for a period of two (2) years. Members of the Board of

1 Governors may also serve simultaneously on the Board of the Oklahoma 2 National Guard Museum Foundation.

3	C. The Board of Governors shall promulgate rules and
4	regulations as necessary for the operation and maintenance of the
5	Oklahoma National Guard Museum. In addition to its other powers and
6	duties as herein provided, the Board of Governors shall have the
7	following specific powers and duties which shall, however, not be
8	deemed to be exclusive:
9	1. To organize itself by the election of a Chair, Vice Chair,
10	and Secretary, who shall perform the duties required of them by the
11	rules and regulations, but shall not receive compensation, and to
12	provide for the time and place of meetings of the Board of Governors
13	at least four (4) times annually;
14	<u>2. To</u> appoint an Executive Director to oversee <u>of the Oklahoma</u>
15	National Guard Museum and provide for the employment of personnel as
16	may be necessary to carry out the daily operations and maintenance
17	of the museum and perform other duties as requested by the Adjutant
18	General Oklahoma National Guard Museum. Appropriate state agencies

19 are directed to make available, for display of items of historical

significance and necessary space for administration, the buildings 21 presently occupied by the Oklahoma Military Department, located in

22 the vicinity of 36th Street and North Eastern in Oklahoma City,

23 Oklahoma. The building herein referred to shall be made available

24 by the Adjutant General as soon as same is no longer needed by and

1 is vacated by the Oklahoma Military Department. <u>The salary and</u>
2 <u>tenure of the Executive Director shall be established by the Board</u>
3 <u>of Governors. The salaries and tenure of all other personnel may be</u>
4 <u>established by the Board of Governors or delegated to the Executive</u>
5 <u>Director for his or her determination;</u>

6 <u>3. To establish a budget annually or more often if needed for</u>
7 the Oklahoma National Guard Museum; and

8 <u>4. To approve all claims and expenditures arising from the</u>
 9 <u>operations and maintenance of the Oklahoma National Guard Museum,</u>
 10 <u>prior to the payment thereof, from appropriations made directly to</u>
 11 <u>the Oklahoma National Guard Museum or from funds provided by the</u>
 12 <u>Oklahoma Military Department or from funds provided by the Oklahoma</u>
 13 National Guard Museum Foundation.

14 The Executive Director, subject to the approval of the D. 15 Adjutant General Board of Governors, may lease to the 45th Infantry 16 Division Association, for periods not exceeding one (1) year and 17 with provisions for renewal from year to year, an area to be used as 18 a gift shop, if the lease does not interfere with its use by the 19 Oklahoma National Guard Museum. The proceeds of the sales from the 20 gift shop shall remain with the 45th Infantry Division Association 21 for operating purposes.

E. The Adjutant General shall cause the rules and regulations
 promulgated pursuant to subsection C of this section to be published
 as military publications as defined in Section 801 of this title.

<u>The State Judge Advocate or his or her designee shall provide legal</u>
 counsel and support to the Board of Governors.

3 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 241, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 241. The Governor, pursuant to the authority granted the states by Section 109 of Title 32 of the United States Code or a 6 7 successor provision, and under such regulations as the Secretary of Defense may prescribe for discipline in training, is hereby 8 9 authorized to enlist, organize, maintain, equip and discipline such 10 military forces other than the National Guard as he or she may deem 11 necessary to defend the state. Such forces shall be uniformed and 12 subject to Sections 1 through 117, Sections 208 through 237, and 13 Sections 800 through 946 of this title, insofar as such sections do 14 not conflict with Sections 241 through 250 of this title.

15 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 243, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 243. A. The Governor is hereby authorized to prescribe 18 rules and regulations governing the enlistment, organization, 19 administration, equipment, discipline and discharge of the personnel 20 of such military forces; to requisition from the Secretary of 21 Defense such arms and equipment as may be in the possession of and 22 can be spared by the Department of Defense and to extend thereto the 23 facilities of state armories, Armed Forces Reserve Centers, 24 readiness centers, logistics, aviation, and training facilities,

1 warehouses and their equipment and such other state premises and 2 property as may be available for the purpose of drill and 3 instruction. Insofar as applicable the procedure for the 4 enlistment, organization, pay, maintenance, equipment and 5 disciplining of such forces shall be in conformity with the law and 6 the rules and regulations governing and pertaining to the National 7 Guard; provided, that the officers Officers and enlisted personnel in the Oklahoma State Guard shall not receive any compensation or 8 9 monetary allowances from the state except when activated for state 10 active duty, as defined in Section 801 of this title, by order of the Governor. 11

B. Members of the Oklahoma State Guard shall be considered part of state military forces as defined in Section 801 of this title and shall be subject to the Oklahoma Uniform Code of Military Justice.

15 C. When prescribing the rules and regulations governing 16 enlistment, organization, administration, equipment, discipline and 17 discharge of the personnel of the Oklahoma State Guard, the Governor 18 shall issue such rules and regulations in the form of an executive 19 order or in a series of such orders. An executive order or a series 20 of such orders prescribing the rules and regulations governing 21 enlistment, organization, administration, equipment, discipline and 22 discharge of the personnel of the Oklahoma State Guard shall also be 23 published by the Adjutant General as a military publication.

1	SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 821, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	Section 821. RESERVED. ARTICLE 21. Convening of court-martial
4	by federal officials.
5	In no case shall the President of the United States, the
6	Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of a military department, a
7	military officer serving on active duty within the meaning of Title
8	10 of the United States Code, or any other federal official convene
9	a court-martial proceeding pursuant to the Oklahoma Military Code
10	unless prior consent has been granted by the Governor. Such
11	consent, if granted by the Governor, shall be accomplished in
12	writing and shall be published by the Governor.
13	SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 875, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 875. ARTICLE 75. Restoration.
16	A. Under such regulations as the Adjutant General may
17	promulgate, all rights, privileges, and property affected by an
18	executed part of a court-martial sentence which has been set aside
19	or disapproved, except an executed dismissal or discharge, shall be
20	restored unless a new trial or rehearing is ordered and such
21	executed part is included in a sentence imposed upon the new trial
22	or rehearing.
23	B. If a previously executed sentence of dishonorable or bad-
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24 conduct discharge is not imposed on a new trial, the Adjutant

General shall substitute therefor a form of discharge authorized for administrative issuance unless the accused is to serve out the remainder of his or her enlistment.

4 C. If a previously executed sentence of dismissal is not 5 imposed on a new trial, the Adjutant General shall substitute 6 therefor a form of discharge authorized for administrative issue, 7 and the commissioned officer dismissed by that sentence may be 8 reappointed pursuant to Sections 875 and 12203 of Title 10 of the 9 United States Code and any applicable regulations prescribed 10 thereunder by the President of the United States or the Secretary 11 concerned solely by the Governor to such commissioned grade and with 12 such rank as in the opinion of the Governor that former officer 13 would have attained had he or she not been dismissed. The 14 reappointment of such a former officer shall be without regard to 15 the existence of a vacancy and shall affect the promotion status of 16 other officers only insofar as the Governor may direct. All time 17 between the dismissal and the reappointment shall be considered as 18 actual service for all purposes, including the right to pay and 19 allowances. 20 The Governor or Adjutant General shall prescribe D. 21 regulations, with such limitations as the Governor or Adjutant 22 General considers appropriate, governing eligibility for pay and 23 allowances for the period after the date on which an executed part 24 of a court-martial sentence is set aside.

1	SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2021, Section 905, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	Section 905. RESERVED. ARTICLE 105. Forgery.
4	Any person subject to the Oklahoma Uniform Code of Military
5	Justice who, with intent to defraud:
6	1. Falsely makes or alters any signature to, or any part of,
7	any writing which would, if genuine, apparently impose a legal
8	liability on another or change his or her legal right or liability
9	to his or her prejudice; or
10	2. Utters, offers, issues, or transfers such a writing, known
11	by him or her to be so made or altered is guilty of forgery and
12	shall be punished as a court-martial may direct.
13	SECTION 14. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
