9	An Act relating to awards for meritorious service;
10	amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-108.5, which relates to the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma
11	Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal and related awards; modifying terminology; providing for creation
12	of Oklahoma Red Heart and Oklahoma Blue Heart Awards; specifying persons eligible for Oklahoma Red Heart or
13	Oklahoma Blue Heart; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-108.5, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 2-108.5 A. 1. There is hereby created the Oklahoma
19	State Award Program Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to
20	create, establish eligibility requirements and make recommendation
21	for awarding the Oklahoma Medal of Valor for meritorious service,
22	the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal for extended
23	exemplary service to the state and the Oklahoma Purple <u>Red</u> Heart <u>or</u>
24	Oklahoma Blue Heart for serious line of duty injuries for law

enforcement and public safety members employed by municipal, county,
 state and employees of federal agencies working in Oklahoma.

There is hereby established the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the 3 2. 4 Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal and the Oklahoma 5 Purple Red Heart and Oklahoma Blue Heart, along with authorized appurtenances, for award by the Governor, in the name of the state, 6 7 to any person who has demonstrated meritorious achievement, or a distinct act of courage, shown distinguished meritorious service to 8 9 the state over an extended period of service or who has incurred 10 injury or wounds, while performing or actively engaged in public 11 service activities. The Oklahoma Purple Red Heart is limited to law 12 enforcement and public safety members municipal firefighters 13 employed by cities and towns. The Oklahoma Blue Heart is limited to 14 law enforcement and public safety members employed by municipal, 15 county, state and employees of federal agencies working in Oklahoma. 16 3. The purpose of each award is to formally recognize 17 extraordinary acts of valor by public safety members and citizens of 18 Oklahoma who engage in extraordinary acts of bravery and valor and 19 to formally recognize public safety members in Oklahoma who have 20 been seriously injured in the line of duty and to acknowledge the 21 distinguished meritorious service of citizens to the state.

B. The members of the Oklahoma State Award Program (OSAP)
Committee shall have experience in the field of public safety and

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1 public service. The OSAP Committee shall be composed of nine (9)
2 members as follows:

3	1. The Lieutenant Governor, who shall serve as chair;
4	2. The Adjutant General of the Oklahoma National Guard;
5	3. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety;
6	4. The Director of the Department of Corrections;
7	5. The Director of the Department of Transportation;
8	6. The President of the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association;
9	7. The President of the Oklahoma Association of Chiefs of
10	Police;
11	8. The President of the Oklahoma State Firefighters
12	Association; and
13	9. The President of the Oklahoma Sheriffs and Peace Officers
14	Association.
15	C. Except at any meeting to select recipients of the Oklahoma
16	Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service
17	Medal, the Oklahoma Red Heart or the Oklahoma Purple <u>Blue</u> Heart,
18	each member, other than the chair, may be represented by a designee;
19	provided, the designee must be an active member in good standing
20	with the agency or association to which the appointed member
21	belongs. The Chairman reserves the right to appoint an advisory
22	board to collect, review and make initial award recommendations to
23	the OSAP committee. The advisory board will be comprised of
24	designees from the nine-member OSAP committee.

D. The Committee shall conduct its first meeting no later than ninety (90) calendar days after the appointment of the last member. The Committee shall meet at the direction of the chair, and shall normally meet not less than once each year and not more than three times each year.

6 E. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum to7 conduct business.

F. The members of the Committee shall serve without 8 9 compensation, except that the members may be reimbursed for 10 reasonable and necessary expenses arising from Committee activities or business. Such expenses shall be paid by the respective agencies 11 12 at which the member is employed at the time the expense is incurred. 13 G. No member of the OSAP Committee shall solicit, seek or 14 request individuals to submit individuals for awards. OSAP 15 Committee members may explain the program to interested individuals. 16 The Committee may secure directly from any department or agency such 17 information as the Committee deems necessary to carry out its

18 duties.

H. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety shall promulgate rules to establish the following:

Design of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma
 Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal and the Oklahoma Purple <u>Red</u>
 Heart or the Oklahoma Blue Heart and any authorized appurtenances
 proposed by the Adjutant General;

Criteria for eligibility for award of the Oklahoma Medal of
 Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal or the
 Oklahoma <u>Purple Red</u> Heart <u>or Oklahoma Blue Heart</u> proposed by the
 Adjutant General;

3. Criteria for the proper wear of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor,
the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal or the Oklahoma
Purple <u>Red</u> Heart or the Oklahoma Blue Heart proposed by the Adjutant
General;

9 4. Method of purchasing the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the
10 Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious Service Medal or the Oklahoma
11 Purple Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue Heart;

12 5. Order of precedence relating to other state awards; and
13 6. Other rules deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of
14 this section.

15 The Committee shall consider candidates for award for the Τ. 16 Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished Meritorious 17 Service Medal or the Oklahoma Purple Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue 18 Heart only from the applications received. The OSAP Committee may 19 go into executive session to deliberate and select recommended 20 recipients. The Chair shall present to the Governor the names of 21 recommendations as Medal recipients.

J. The Committee shall not disclose any information which may compromise an ongoing law enforcement investigation or information that is otherwise required by law to be kept confidential. Only the final recommendation for receipt of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the
 Oklahoma Distinguished Service Medal and the Oklahoma Purple <u>Red</u>
 Heart or Oklahoma Blue Heart shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open
 Records Act.

K. The Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished
Service Medal and the Oklahoma Purple <u>Red</u> Heart <u>or Oklahoma Blue</u>
<u>Heart</u> may not be awarded to any person who was not selected by the
Committee.

9 L. The award of the Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma
10 Distinguished Service Medal and the Oklahoma Purple Red Heart or
11 Oklahoma Blue Heart may be rescinded for suitable cause. The Chair,
12 with the consent of the Committee, shall forward the recommendation
13 for rescission to the Governor. The final decision to rescind must
14 be approved by the Governor.

M. The Oklahoma Medal of Valor, the Oklahoma Distinguished
Service Medal or the Oklahoma Purple Red Heart or Oklahoma Blue
<u>Heart</u> may be awarded posthumously and may be presented to such
representative of the deceased's family as may be deemed appropriate
by the Governor.
