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11	AS INTRODUCED
12	An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, which relates to teacher
13	certification; directing State Board of Education to
14	issue teaching certificate for teacher certified by a federally recognized tribal nation; limiting teaching
15	certificate to use in certain schools; exempting teacher from additional competency examinations; requiring certain criminal history record checks;
16	providing for issuance of temporary certificate;
17	specifying applicant will pay for criminal history record checks; and providing an effective date.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 6-190. A. The board of education of each school
24	district shall employ and contract in writing, as required in

Section 6-101 of this title, only with persons certified to teach by
 the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher
 Preparation Act, except as otherwise provided for by Section 6-101
 of this title and by other law.

5 B. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person6 who:

7 1. Has successfully completed the teacher education program
8 required by the Commission for Educational Quality and
9 Accountability;

Has graduated from an accredited institution of higher
 education that has approval or accreditation for teacher education;

Has met all other requirements as may be established by the
 Board;

14 4. Has made the necessary application and paid the competency15 examination fee in an amount and as prescribed by the Commission;

16 5. Has successfully completed the competency examination 17 required in Section 6-187 of this title; and

6. Beginning November 1, 2001, has on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history

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record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible
 for the cost of the criminal history records.

3 C. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person 4 who:

5 1. Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements
6 set forth in subsection G of this section;

7 2. Holds certification from the National Board for Professional
8 Teaching Standards;

9 3. Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the
10 requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or

11 4. <u>Holds a certificate from a federally recognized tribal</u>
12 <u>nation and meets the requirements set forth in subsection H of this</u>
13 section; or

14 <u>5.</u> Has successfully completed a competency examination used in
15 the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets
16 the requirements set forth in subsection # I of this section.

17 Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial D. 18 Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current 19 Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 20 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 21 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 22 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue 23 a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of 24 the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person

applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the
 criminal history records.

E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to
January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the
Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional
development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher
Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.

8 F. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person 9 who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any 10 requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach 11 shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely 12 aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-13 of-country certificate.

14 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 15 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 16 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 17 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-country 18 certificate.

19 3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 20 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 21 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 22 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 23 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 24 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt
 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check.
 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the
 cost of the criminal history record checks.

5 4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by 6 which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for 7 purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this 8 subsection.

9 G. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person 10 who holds a valid out-of-state certificate. The certificate to 11 teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most 12 closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on 13 the out-of-state certificate.

14 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 15 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 16 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 17 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state 18 certificate.

19 3. A person who meets the requirements of this subsection shall 20 have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history 21 record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well 22 as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 23 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the 24 Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a

1 temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the 2 national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost 3 4 of the criminal history record checks. 5 Η. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person 6 who holds a certificate from a federally recognized tribal nation. 7 The certificate to teach shall only be for a school that is operated 8 by the certificate-granting tribal nation within its reservation or 9 treaty area boundaries. 10 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 11 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 12 other than those required by the certificate-granting tribal nation. 13 3. A person who meets the requirements of this subsection shall 14 have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history 15 record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 16 Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record 17 check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be 18 effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal 19 history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall 20 be responsible for the cost of the criminal history record checks. 21 I. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person 1. 22 who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority 23 of the other states. The certificate to teach shall only be for

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those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a
 certification area used in Oklahoma.

A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 3 2. subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 4 5 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 6 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 7 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 8 9 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 10 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 11 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 12 cost of the criminal history record checks.

13 I. J. The Board shall issue a lead teaching certificate to any 14 person who upon application:

15 1. Has successfully completed the requirements of this16 subsection;

17 2. Has a minimum of five (5) years of experience as a teacher;
18 3. Participates in a meaningful individualized program of
19 professional development, as provided for in Section 6-101.10 of
20 this title;

4. Has earned a "highly effective" or "superior" rating pursuant to Section 6-101.16 of this title; and

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1 5. May have a teaching load of not more than seventy-five 2 percent (75%) student instruction to allow the teacher to mentor other teachers. 3 4 1. The Board shall issue a master teaching certificate J. K. 5 to any person who upon application: 6 has successfully completed the requirements of this a. 7 subsection, b. has a minimum of seven (7) years of experience as a 8 9 teacher, and 10 has earned a "superior" rating pursuant to с. (1)11 Section 6-101.16 of this title, or 12 has earned a "highly effective" rating pursuant (2) 13 to Section 6-101.16 of this title and holds or 14 has held a National Board certification from the 15 National Board for Professional Teaching 16 Standards. 17 2. Teachers with a master teaching certificate may assume 18 leadership roles that include but are not limited to: 19 the planning and delivery of professional development a. 20 activities designed to improve instructional 21 strategies, 22 the facilitation of an instructional leadership team b. 23 within the building or school district in which the 24 lead teacher is assigned, and

1 с. the mentoring of other teachers and participation in 2 evaluations of other teachers. Teachers with a master teaching certificate may have a 3 3. 4 teaching load of not more than fifty percent (50%) student 5 instruction to allow the lead teacher to spend time on: 6 a. co-teaching, 7 b. co-planning, peer reviews, and 8 с. 9 d. other duties mutually agreed upon by the 10 superintendent and the master teacher, and may be used 11 to satisfy the qualitative evaluation component for 12 teachers as required by Section 6-101.16 of this title 13 by performing the duties set forth in this paragraph. 14 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to K. L. 15 implement a renewal schedule and associated fees for lead and master 16 teaching certificates. The rules shall allow a teacher that no 17 longer meets the requirements of a lead or master teaching 18 certificate to make application for the standard teaching 19 certificate. 20 The terms of the contracts issued to those holding lead ь. м. 21 and master teaching certificates shall include the following: 22 1. Lead: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen 23 instructional leadership. A person with a lead teaching certificate

24 shall receive an annual salary supplement of at least Three Thousand

Dollars (\$3,000.00) or the district's daily rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 of this title; and

2. Master: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to
strengthen leadership. A person with a master teaching certificate
shall receive an annual salary supplement of at least Five Thousand
Dollars (\$5,000.00) or the district's daily rate of pay, whichever
is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies
pursuant to Section 18-114.14 of this title.

10 If a person with a lead or master teaching certificate changes 11 school districts during the life of the certificate, the terms of 12 the contracts required in this subsection shall be subject to 13 approval by the new employing school district.

14 M. N. 1. Any person who is eligible for a lead or master 15 teaching certificate described in this section shall make 16 application for the following school year with the State Board of 17 Education. The application shall include a recommendation from the 18 local board of education and determination that the applicant has 19 met the statutory criteria. In reviewing an application, the local 20 school board of education and the superintendent shall consider the 21 ability of the school district to fulfill the additional 22 requirements described in subsections I and J and K of this section 23 before making a recommendation to the State Board of Education.

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2. The State Department of Education shall develop an
 application to implement the provisions of this subsection and make
 it available to school districts.

N: O. Beginning in the 2021-2022 school year, the Department
shall make the teaching certificates provided for in this section
available for any person who has received a recommendation from
their local board of education and who meets the eligibility
criteria.

9 O. P. For the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years, the
10 Department shall identify school districts to implement the teaching
11 certificates provided for in this section on a pilot program basis
12 with the assistance of public-private partnerships, funding from
13 philanthropic organizations or federal grants.

14 P. Q. The Department shall seek funding necessary for the 15 administration of this section. If funding for the administration 16 of the teaching certificates listed in subsections I and J and K is 17 not available, the Department shall not be required to fulfill the 18 requirements listed in subsections I, M, N and, O, and P of this 19 section.

20 Q. R. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to
21 implement the provisions of this act.
