1	1963, and each succeeding calendar week during which May 15 occurs
2	as "National Police Week"; and
3	WHEREAS, federal, state, local, and tribal police officers,
4	sheriffs, and other law enforcement officers in the State of
5	Oklahoma and across the United States serve with valor, dignity, and
6	integrity; and
7	WHEREAS, law enforcement officers are charged with pursuing
8	justice for all individuals and performing the duties of a law
9	enforcement officer with fidelity to the constitutional rights of
10	the public that the law enforcement officers serve; and
11	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma House of Representatives expresses strong
12	support for law enforcement officers in Oklahoma and across the
13	United States in the efforts that those officers undertake to build
14	safer and more secure communities; and
15	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma House of Representatives recognizes the
16	law enforcement community for the continual selfless acts of
17	sacrifice and bravery carried out by the members of that community;
18	and
19	WHEREAS, law enforcement officers swear an oath to uphold the
20	public trust with their lives, if need be, even though, through the
21	performance of the duties of a law enforcement officer, the officers
22	may become targets for senseless acts of violence; and

WHEREAS, within the last year, five hundred thirteen law enforcement officers from across the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, eight Oklahoma law enforcement officers died in the
line of duty within the last year, all to COVID-19, including Police
Officer Lewis Franklin Cantey, Grand River Dam Authority Police
Department; Sergeant John Arthur Harris II, Tulsa County Sheriff's
Office; Sergeant John Lee Trout Sr., Bernice Police Department;
Patrol Officer Edgar "Buddy" Pales Jr., Owasso Police Department;
Patrol Officer Howard Kritzer Smith III, Owasso Police Department;
Police Officer Bart Lane Arnold, Enid Police Department; Chief of
Police Richard Leslie Stephens, Union City Police Department; and
Lieutenant Scott Brandon Owens, Union City Police Department; and
WHEREAS, the Oklahoma House of Representatives honors the memory
of the hundreds of law enforcement officers who have given their
lives in the line of duty in this state and throughout the United
States.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT May 11 through May 17, 2022, is hereby recognized by the Oklahoma House of Representatives as "National Police Week" and recognizes May 15, 2022, as "Peace Officers Memorial Day" in Oklahoma.
