10	An Act relating to the 9/11 Freedom Flag; authorizing certain flag to be flown commemorating the September		
11	11, 2001, terror attacks on the United States; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 375, which relates to flag placement prohibitions; authorizing placement of certain commemorative flag; providing for		
12			
13	codification; and declaring an emergency.

16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified		
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 93.3 of Title 25, unless there		
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:		
20	In memory of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on the		
21	World Trade Center, Pentagon, and the plane crash victims of the		
22	United Airlines Flight 93, the 9/11 Freedom Flag that commemorates		
23	this day in American history, shall be authorized to be flown on		
24	flagpoles throughout the state in remembrance.		

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 375, is amended to read as follows: 2

Section 375. A. It shall be unlawful and constitute a 3 misdemeanor for any person to place, hoist, raise or display any 4 5 flag, standard, colors or ensign upon or over any publicly owned tax-supported property or premises except roads, streets, highways, 6 stadiums or arenas in the State of Oklahoma, except: 7

1. The flag, standard, colors or ensign of the United States of 8 9 America;

2. The flag of any nation formerly having dominion over the 10 land now comprising the State of Oklahoma or any portion of said 11 12 land;

3. The official flag of any of the fifty states of the United 13 States; 14

15	4.	An Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building commemorative flag;
16	5.	The official flag of any municipality in this state;
17	6.	The Boy Scouts of America flag;

The Girl Scouts United States of America flag; 7. 18

8. The American Red Cross flag; 19

9. The American Ex-Prisoner of War flag; 20

10. The POW/MIA flag; and 21

11. The 9/11 Freedom Flag; and 22

Such other flags as may be approved by the governing board 23 12. 24 or agency having control over said public property.

1	B. Any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be
2	punished by a fine <del>of</del> not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more
3	than Five Hundred Dollars ( $\$500.00)$ or by imprisonment in the
4	county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6)
5	months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
6	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
