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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.204 of Title 62, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. As used in this act:
22	1. "State agencies that provide, contract for or otherwise fund
23	mental health and substance abuse services" includes:
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1	a. the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
2	Services,
3	b. the State Department of Health,
4	c. the Oklahoma Health Care Authority,
5	d. the Department of Human Services,
6	e. the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs,
7	f. the State Department of Education,
8	g. the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology
9	Education,
10	h. The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,
11	i. the Department of Corrections,
12	j. the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth, and
13	k. the Office of Juvenile Affairs; and
14	2. "Mental health and substance abuse services" means programs
15	or services directly or indirectly related to the research,
16	prevention or detection of mental health and substance use problems,
17	and all services necessary to treat, care for, control, supervise
18	and rehabilitate persons with mental illness and substance use
19	disorders.
20	B. On or before September 30, 2021, all state agencies that
21	provide, contract for or otherwise fund mental health and substance
22	abuse services shall report to the Office of Management and
23	Enterprise Services (OMES):
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All mental health services and substance abuse services
 provided by the agency. The name, purpose and primary funding
 source or sources of each service shall be included;

A financial summary of spending amounts by method of finance
associated with each program. The financial summary shall include
annual spending on each service in each of the last five (5) state
fiscal years; and

8 3. Outcome summaries for mental health and substance abuse
9 services. Summaries shall include target population or populations,
10 numbers served and relevant metrics associated with the performance
11 of the program.

C. On or before November 30, 2021, OMES shall compile agency 12 reports and submit a unified report to the President Pro Tempore of 13 the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the 14 15 Legislative Office of Fiscal Transparency, the Governor and the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Strategic Planning 16 17 Council created in Section 2 of this act, and make the report available to the public. The unified report shall coherently 18 organize and display agency information and provide a summary of 19 statewide spending by agency and type of service. 20

D. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall provide technical assistance to the agencies and OMES as necessary for the compilation of this report.

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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.205 of Title 62, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created until June 30, 2027, the Mental
Health and Substance Abuse Services Strategic Planning Council.

B. The Council shall be composed of eighteen (18) members
representing mental health professionals and those state agencies
that provide, contract for or otherwise fund mental health and
substance abuse services. The membership of the committee is as
follows:

The Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
 Services, or his or her designee;

The State Commissioner of Health, or his or her designee;
 The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, or
 his or her designee;

16 4. The Director of the Department of Human Services, or his or 17 her designee;

18 5. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs,
19 or his or her designee;

20 6. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or his or her21 designee;

7. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career andTechnology Education, or his or her designee;

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1 8. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 2 Education, or his or her designee; 3 9. The Director of the Department of Corrections, or his or her 4 designee; 5 10. The Director of the Oklahoma Commission on Children and 6 Youth, or his or her designee; 7 11. The Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs, or his or 8 her designee; 9 12. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint two (2) members: 10 11 a. a member of the Senate, and a director or chief executive officer of a mental 12 b. health and substance abuse service provider, or his or 13 her designee; 14 15 13. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two (2) members: 16 a member of the House of Representatives, and 17 a. a director or chief executive officer of a mental b. 18 health and substance abuse service provider, or his or 19 her designee; 20 14. The Senate Minority Leader shall appoint one member who is 21 a member of the Senate; 22 The House Minority Leader shall appoint one member who is a 23 15. member of the House of Representatives; and 24

16. The Governor shall appoint one member who is an academic
 2 specialist in mental health outcomes, research and evidence-based
 3 practices.

C. The Council shall meet regularly in order to develop a fiveyear comprehensive statewide mental health and substance abuse
services strategic plan. The plan shall be informed by the unified
report on mental health and substance abuse services, spending and
outcomes compiled by OMES. The plan shall include agency and
program goals, measurements, outcomes, budget information and
population information and address the following:

Reduce programmatic, administrative, regulatory and
 budgetary redundancies;

Maintain financial viability for providers in a cost effective manner to the State;

Ensure care is effective, efficient and appropriate
 regardless of setting in which it is provided;

17 4. Increase access to care and treatment;

18 5. Provide sufficient community-based and home services to19 provide consumers with care setting options;

Ensure quality of care in all care settings via the use of
 evidence-based best practices, appropriate clinical outcomes and
 timely care; and

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7. Ensure that crisis care, hospitalizations and
 institutionalizations, when necessary, is available to meet demand
 now and in the future.

D. On or before January 31, 2022, the Council shall meet for
the first time and hold, at minimum, a regular monthly meeting until
the completion of the mental health and substance abuse services
strategic plan.

8 E. On or before June 30, 2022, the Council shall complete the 9 strategic plan. The strategic plan shall be active from July 1, 10 2022 to June 30, 2027. The Council shall submit the strategic plan 11 to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House 12 of Representatives, the Legislative Office of Fiscal Transparency 13 and the Governor, and make the strategic plan available to the 14 public through each member agency website.

F. The strategic plan is not intended to serve as an omnibus budget request. The strategic plan is intended to identify budgetary efficiencies and create a more accountable, transparent and coordinated budget request for mental health and substance abuse services.

G. The meetings of the Council shall be subject to the OklahomaOpen Meeting Act.

H. Members of the Council shall not receive compensation nor
reimbursement for any expenses incurred in performing the duties
associated with the development of the five-year comprehensive

statewide mental health and substance abuse services strategic plan;
 however, legislative members shall be reimbursed for necessary
 travel expenses incurred in the performance of duties in accordance
 with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes.

6 I. Staffing for the Council shall be provided by the Department7 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

8 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.206 of Title 62, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. State agencies that provide, contract for or otherwise fund
mental health and substance abuse services shall align annual agency
budgets and estimates of funds needed for mental health and
substance abuse services with the plan developed by the Mental
Health and Substance Abuse Services Strategic Planning Council.

B. The Council shall convene quarterly meetings during the
implementation of the five-year strategic plan to monitor progress,
review outcomes and compile progress reports from individual
agencies that provide mental health and substance abuse services to
prepare for the unified progress report.

C. On or before June 30th of each year during the strategic plan period state agencies that provide, contract for or otherwise fund mental health and substance abuse services shall provide a unified progress report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,

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the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Legislative Office
 of Fiscal Transparency and the Governor, and make the progress
 report available to the public through each member agency website.

The unified progress report shall include updates on all 4 D. 5 state agencies that provide, contract for or otherwise fund mental health and substance abuse services, their program goals, 6 7 measurements, outcomes, budget information and population information in one document. Additionally, the unified progress 8 9 report shall include changes in the number of private service 10 providers for mental health and substance abuse services and provide 11 updated recommendations on service need to ensure the public need 12 for mental health and substance abuse services is met.

14 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 15 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 16 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 17 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
