Supp. 2020, 18 Section 353.30), is amended to read as follows: 19 20 Section 353.30. A. The use of agreements in the practice of pharmacy shall be acceptable within the rules promulgated by the 21 State Board of Pharmacy and in consultation with the State Board of 22 23 Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners. 24

1	B. The Board shall develop and prepare permanent rules relating
2	to training requirements and administration of immunizations and
3	therapeutic injections in consultation within the State Board of
4	Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic
5	Examiners.

- C. A pharmacist who has completed a requisite course of training as approved by the Board in consultation with the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners may administer immunizations and therapeutic injections on orders from a licensed prescriber, and may administer immunizations that have been approved or authorized by the Food and Drug Administration without a patient-specific prescription, standing order or similar arrangement.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
