15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 22 O.S. 2011, Section 1181, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1181. Any officer not subject to impeachment elected or
19	appointed to any state, county, township, city, town, or other
20	office under the laws of the state may, in the manner provided in
21	this article, be removed from office for any of the following
22	causes:
23	First. Habitual or willful neglect of duty, which, for a state
24	officer, shall include, but not be limited to, knowingly giving

1 false testimony to a committee of either house of the Legislature, 2 knowingly engaging in operations beyond the constitutional or 3 statutory authority delegated to the agency that the officer is 4 employed by or serves, or repeatedly refusing to provide information 5 to a committee, either house or a member of the Legislature in a timely manner. For the purposes of this section, "timely manner" 6 7 means no more than fifteen (15) business days from the date the request for information was received by the agency, unless extended 8 9 by written agreement. 10 Second. Gross partiality in office. 11 Third. Oppression in office. 12 Fourth. Corruption in office. Extortion or willful overcharge of fees in office. 13 Fifth. Sixth. Willful maladministration. 14 Seventh. Habitual drunkenness. 15 Eighth. Failure to produce and account for all public funds and 16 property in his or her hands, at any settlement or inspection 17 authorized or required by law. 18 SECTION 2.
