10 An Act relating to cosmetology and barbering;
11 allowing certain licensees and certificate holders to
12 provide services privately; prohibiting inspection or
13 regulation of private services; providing for
14 liability and review of license or certificate;
15 requiring license or certificate and professional
16 standards for services performed privately; requiring
17 possession of copy of license or certificate;
18 providing for codification; providing an effective
19 date; and declaring an emergency.

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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

23 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
24 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 199.18 of Title 59, unless there
25 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

26 A licensed barber, cosmetologist, hairdresser, manicurist or
27 certificate holder for hairbraiding may provide, upon request of a
28 patron or customer, barbering, cosmetology, hairdresser, manicurist
29 or hairbraiding services to the patron or customer, according to

1 such license or certificate authority, in the patron's or customer's
2 private residence. The services authorized by this section shall be
3 provided privately and shall not be subject to inspection, rules or
4 regulations by the State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering;
5 however, the licensee or certificate holder is required to provide
6 such services competently and according to professional standards
7 and in a manner deemed safe and sanitary for the patron or customer.
8 The patron or customer by requesting such service to be delivered
9 privately in their residence assumes the liability for the services
10 and any home equipment utilized by the licensee or certificate
11 holder. The patron or customer shall have the right to review the
12 person's license or certificate for validity and authority to
13 perform the services requested. The licensee or certificate holder
14 shall have in their possession a copy of their license or
15 certificate when providing services upon request in a private
16 residence.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

18 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
19 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
20 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
21 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
