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10	An Act relating to infant mortality; requiring certain individuals to conduct certain investigation
11	and fill out certain form; requiring the State Department of Health to retain copy of form for

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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-317d of Title 63, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. When the death of an infant occurs in this state and the
21	cause of death is considered undetermined, a medical examiner shall
22	conduct a sudden unexplained infant death investigation (SUIDI) not
23	more than forty-eight (48) hours after the death has occurred. The
24	medical examiner or a medical examiner investigator currently

1	certified by the American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators
2	shall interview the parent, legal guardian or caregiver of, or
3	person who last had contact with, the deceased infant and shall fill
4	out the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's SUIDI reporting
5	form accordingly. The State Department of Health shall retain a
6	copy of each completed SUIDI reporting form in order to compile
7	accurate and reliable data on SUIDI to aid and inform the policies
8	of the Department, and the Department shall provide a copy of each
9	completed SUIDI reporting form to the Child Death Review Board.
10	B. As used in this section, "medical examiner" means the Chief
11	Medical Examiner, the Deputy Chief Medical Examiner or a medical
12	examiner appointed by the Chief Medical Examiner pursuant to Section
13	937 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
14	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
