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12	An Act relating to schools; creating the Oklahoma Play to Learn Act; declaring legislative intent;
13	defining terms; allowing instruction in early childhood education to foster certain development and
14	learning; providing certain learning environment; authorizing educators to provide certain learning
15	opportunities; authorizing certain professional development for teachers; disallowing school
16	districts from prohibiting teacher use of play-based learning; providing for codification; and declaring
17	an emergency.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.2a of Title 70, unless
23	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
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1 A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma 2 Play to Learn Act".

It is the intention of the Oklahoma State Legislature 3 в. through this act to focus on the importance of child-centered, play-4 5 based learning as the most rigorous and most developmentally appropriate way for children in the early childhood grade levels to 6 learn literacy, science, technology, engineering, art and math 7 academic concepts. 8

9 C. As used in this section:

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"Child-directed" means interaction in which the child is 10 1. 11 helped to direct and lead the play in any way the child wishes, unless there is harmful or destructive activity; 12

2. "Domain" means a specified sphere of activity or knowledge; 13 3. "Early childhood education" means prekindergarten, 14 kindergarten, first grade, second grade and third grade; 15

"Play" means the spontaneous activity of children; 4.

5. "Play-based learning" means any learning activities that are 17 performed by a child for self-amusement that have behavioral, social 18 and psychomotor rewards. Play-based learning shall also mean 19 activities that are child-directed, joyful and spontaneous whereby 20 the rewards come from within the individual child; 21

"Professional development" means any of a wide variety of 6. 22 specialized training, formal education or advanced professional 23 learning intended to help administrators, teachers and other 24

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1 educators improve their professional knowledge, competence, skill
2 and effectiveness;

3 7. "Reading for pleasure" means reading that is freely chosen 4 or that readers freely and enthusiastically continue after it is 5 assigned; and

8. "Socialization" means social interaction with others. 6 Instruction in support of early childhood education 7 D. standards may be engaging and may foster children's development and 8 9 learning in all domains including physical, social, emotional, 10 cognitive and language. To the best of their ability, educators may 11 create a learning environment that facilitates child-directed 12 experiences based upon developmentally appropriate early childhood practices and intentional, sustained, play-based learning 13 opportunities including, but not limited to, movement, creative 14 15 expression, exploration, socialization, reading for pleasure, art, music and dramatic play. The art instruction may adhere to 16 prekindergarten standards for fine arts, which include dance, drama, 17 music and visual arts, as approved by the State Department of 18 Education. Educators may develop physical, social, emotional, 19 cognitive and academic learning opportunities in all curricular 20 domains, which may include unstructured time for the discovery of 21 each child's individual needs, abilities and talents. 22

E. In support of play-based learning in Oklahoma publicschools, school districts may provide ongoing early childhood

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1	professional development for early childhood educators and
2	administrators, which may include existing early childhood
3	professional development programs from the State Department of
4	Education.
5	F. A school district shall not prohibit a teacher from
6	utilizing play-based learning in early childhood education.
7	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
8	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
9	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
10	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
