16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-187, as
17	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 139, O.S.L. 2020 (70 O.S. Supp.
18	2020, Section 6-187), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 6-187. A. Prior to July 1, 2014, a competency
20	examination shall be adopted by the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher
21	Preparation and beginning July 1, 2014, a competency examination
22	shall be adopted by the Commission for Educational Quality and
23	Accountability for the general education, professional education and
24	various subject areas and grade levels for purposes of ensuring

 teacher in the subject area the person is seeking certification to
 teach which shall also include certification as an administrator, as
 prescribed by the State Board of Education.

5 The Commission, consistent with the purposes of this section, 6 shall promulgate rules and procedures to guarantee the 7 confidentiality of examinations.

B. No teacher candidate shall be eligible for certification 8 9 until successfully completing the competency examination except 10 those candidates who make application to the State Board and meet 11 the criteria for the alternative placement program pursuant to Section 6-122.3 of this title. Certification shall be limited to 12 areas of approval in which the certified teacher has successfully 13 completed the examination. Subject to the provisions of subsection 14 15 C of this section, testing for certification for subjects in which a teacher candidate or teacher is seeking a minor teaching assignment 16 or an endorsement to teach shall be limited to the specific subject 17 18 area test.

A teacher candidate or teacher may take the general education, professional education or subject area portions of the examination subject to any limit imposed by the Commission.

C. 1. Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, ateacher may be certified in as many areas as the teacher meets the

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necessary requirements provided by law and has successfully
 completed the subject area portion of the examination.

2. Except as otherwise provided for in this paragraph,
4 certification in early childhood, elementary, or special education
5 shall require completion of an appropriate teacher education program
6 approved by the Commission.

7 Any teacher who is certified to teach elementary education may be certified in early childhood education upon meeting the 8 9 requirements provided in law and successful completion of the 10 appropriate subject area portion of the examination. Any teacher 11 who is certified to teach early childhood education may be certified 12 in elementary education upon meeting the requirements provided in law and successful completion of the appropriate subject area 13 portion of the examination. Any special education teacher who 14 becomes certified to teach through completion of an accredited 15 teacher preparation program may be certified in early childhood or 16 elementary education upon meeting the requirements provided in law 17 and successful completion of the appropriate subject portion of the 18 examination. Any teacher who becomes certified to teach through 19 completion of an accredited teacher preparation program or becomes 20 alternatively certified to teach through the Troops to Teachers 21 program may be certified in special education upon meeting the 22 requirements provided in law and successful completion of the 23 appropriate subject area portion of the examination. Any special 24

education teacher who has not completed a Commission-approved teacher education program in elementary education or early childhood education but who has successfully completed the subject area portion of the examination may be certified in elementary education or early childhood education for the purpose of providing direct instruction and serving as the teacher of record for grading purposes in special education settings only.

D. The Commission shall offer the competency examination at
least four times per calendar year on dates to be established by the
Commission.

If a teacher candidate or teacher is a non-native-English 11 Ε. 12 speaker, the Commission shall offer the subject area competency examination in the native language of the teacher candidate or 13 teacher only if the teacher candidate or teacher is employed or has 14 been offered employment by a school district as a teacher in a 15 foreign language immersion program offered by the school district. 16 If a non-native-English speaker who has received certification in a 17 subject area after taking the subject area competency examination in 18 the native language of the speaker seeks to add a certification area 19 in the future and that person is no longer employed as a teacher in 20 a foreign language immersion program, the examination for the 21 additional certification area shall be taken in English. The State 22 Board of Education shall issue a restricted license or certificate 23 to any teacher who has completed a subject area competency 24

examination in the native language of the teacher as provided for in
 this subsection restricting the teacher to teaching only in a
 foreign language immersion program.

4 F. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability, may grant an 5 6 exception to the requirement to complete a subject area examination 7 for initial certification in a field which does not require an advanced degree if the candidate has an advanced degree in a subject 8 9 that is substantially comparable to the content assessed on a 10 subject area examination. The advanced degree shall be from an 11 institution accredited by a national or regional accrediting agency 12 which is recognized by the Secretary of the United States Department of Education. The Commission shall provide the Board with the 13 necessary information to determine comparability. 14

15 G. 1. Nothing in the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act shall restrict the right of the State Board of Education to issue an 16 emergency or provisional certificate, as needed. Provided, however, 17 prior to the issuance of an emergency certificate, the district 18 shall document substantial efforts to employ a teacher who holds a 19 provisional or standard certificate. In the event a district is 20 unable to hire an individual meeting this criteria, the district 21 shall document efforts to employ an individual with a provisional or 22 standard certificate in another curricular area with academic 23 preparation in the field of need. Only after these alternatives 24

 individual meeting minimum standards as established by the State
 Board of Education for the issuance of emergency certificates.

2. The State Board of Education may renew the emergency or
provisional certificate of an individual who has been employed by a
school district board of education for at least two (2) years if the
following criteria are met:

- a. the individual has been granted an emergency or
 provisional certificate pursuant to paragraph 1 of
 this subsection for two (2) years,
- b. the individual has not successfully completed the
 competency examinations required by this section,
- c. the individual submits a portfolio of his or her work
 to the State Board of Education, which shall include
 evidence of progress toward standard certification,
- 16 d. the employing school district board of education
 17 agrees to renew the individual's contract to teach for
 18 the ensuing fiscal year, and
- e. the superintendent of the employing school district
 submits to the State Board of Education the reason the
 emergency or provisional certificate should be renewed
 and provides evidence of the district's inability to
 hire a teacher who holds a standard certificate.
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1	3. Individuals employed by a school district under an emergency
2	or provisional certificate shall not be considered career teachers
3	and therefore not entitled to the protections of the Teacher Due
4	Process Act of 1990.
5	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
