14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-116.5 of Title 70, unless
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. On or before October 31, 2021, the Commission for
19	Educational Quality and Accountability shall issue a report to the
20	Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore
21	of the Senate and the Governor detailing factors in the public
22	education system of the state that contribute to improvements in
23	the:
24	

- 1. Common education system including, but not limited to, high school graduation rates and college and career assessment scores;
- 2. Higher education and career and technology education systems including, but not limited to, timely graduation rates and reduced remediation rates; and
- 3. State workforce including, but not limited to, career readiness and the ability for new graduates to find in-state employment.
- B. If the Commission finds there is insufficient information available to fulfill any of the report objectives specified in subsection A of this section, the report shall also contain recommendations on ways to address information gaps between state entities, such as the State Department of Education, the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.
- C. The Commission may contract with a private consultant or consultants to assist with the development of the report.
- D. The Commission may utilize any funds received including, but not limited to, any state or federal funds, grants or private donations to assist with the development of the report.
- 21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
