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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 698.1, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 698.1 A. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
18	Education are authorized to shall establish and maintain an
19	incentive scholarship program and teacher employment incentive
20	program, as funding is available, to encourage the preparation of
21	public school teachers for prekindergarten through twelfth grade,
22	including minority teachers, in critical shortage areas for the
23	public schools at one or more of the Oklahoma <u>all state</u> public or
24	private higher education institutions and incentivize employment as

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1	public teachers for prekindergarten through twelfth grade in the
2	state for at least five (5) years, to be known as the Oklahoma
3	Future Teacher Scholarship and Employment Incentive Program.
4	Prospective teachers , whether planning to pursue an undergraduate
5	teacher education program or to become qualified to teach after
6	earning a bachelor's degree in a critical shortage area, at an
7	accredited Oklahoma teacher preparation program shall be considered
8	if they have graduated from <u>an Oklahoma</u> high school with a grade
9	point average ranking them in the top fifteen percent (15%) of their
10	graduating class, meet the higher education admission standards, and
11	declare a major in an approved Oklahoma teacher preparation degree
12	program leading to a standard teaching certificate. To the extent
13	that funds are available, scholarships of One Thousand Five Hundred
14	Dollars (\$1,500.00) per year, renewable for up to three (3)
15	additional years for qualified students meeting satisfactory
16	academic progress standards in completing a teacher preparation
17	degree program leading to a standard teaching certificate, shall be
18	awarded to cover costs of tuition, general enrollment fees, other
19	fees, books, materials, and services provided by the institution,
20	including room and board, in the following manner:
21	1. One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per academic year for up to
22	three (3) academic years for full-time students who have earned less

23 than ninety (90) credit hours; and

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1 2. Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for the final 2 academic year for full-time students who have earned ninety (90) or more credit hours. The maximum amount of scholarship funds awarded 3 as provided in this subsection to any qualified student shall not 4 5 exceed Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00). It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature that the 6 Β. Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education create a committee 7 composed of educators, teacher educators from the participating 8 9 institutions, other professionals from the shortage area fields, and 10 representatives of the public schools and the State Department of Education to recommend provide recommendations to the State Regents 11 12 the following: 1. Further criteria for the selection of participants; 13 2. Procedures for admission; 14 3. Procedures and instruments for assessing the effectiveness 15 16 of the program; and 4. Any other criteria or procedures deemed necessary by the 17 State Regents to improve effectiveness of the program. 18 The committee shall prepare and deliver a report on the program 19 to the Legislature on or before July 1 of each year. 20 C. Each scholarship participant, prior to entry into the 21 program, shall have agreed to teach in the shortage areas in the an 22 Oklahoma public schools prekindergarten through twelfth grade school 23 of this state for a minimum of three (3) five (5) consecutive years 24

participant failing to maintain a 2.5 grade point average, changing
to an <u>inappropriate ineligible</u> area of study, <u>failing to meet</u>
<u>satisfactory academic progress standards</u>, withdrawing or otherwise
leaving school, or failing to meet requirements for licensure and
certification to teach as established by law shall be subject to
disqualification from the program.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are 8 9 authorized to make employment incentive payments pursuant to the 10 provisions of this section to program participants who are employed 11 as traditionally certified teachers in Oklahoma public 12 prekindergarten through twelfth grade schools following graduation. Incentive payments may be awarded following each consecutive year of 13 satisfactory service as documented by the employing school district, 14 up to five (5) years of service for scholarship recipients as 15 provided in subsection A of this section, upon graduation from an 16 accredited Oklahoma teacher preparation degree program. The maximum 17 amount of employment incentive payments for any qualified 18 participant shall be Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) per year for 19 up to five (5) years, not to exceed a total of Twenty Thousand 20 Dollars (\$20,000.00) per participant. 21 E. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 22 require the execution of appropriate contracts with eligible program 23 participants. Participants failing to comply with the requirements 24

1	of this section or failing to provide current contact information
2	shall not be eligible for the employment incentive payments provided
3	for in this section. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents
4	for Higher Education, with the approval of the State Regents, may
5	contract with any other appropriate organization or unit of
6	government for the administration of the provisions of this section.
7	F. If sufficient funds are not available for employment
8	incentive payments to qualified participants during any fiscal year,
9	the Chancellor may make reductions in the payments made to qualified
10	participants.
11	G. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may, at the
12	time an award is made on behalf of the Oklahoma Future Teacher
13	Scholarship and Employment Incentive Program, set aside funds for
14	the full commitment made to an eligible student.
15	H. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may utilize
16	Oklahoma Future Teacher Scholarship and Employment Incentive Program
17	designated funds for administration of the program.
18	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
19	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
20	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
21	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
22	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
