14	requirement to pass the general education portion of the competency examination; amending 70 O.S. 2021,
15	Section 6-189.2, which relates to school psychologist or psychometrist certification; striking reference to
16	the general education portion of the competency examination; and declaring an emergency.

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-122.3, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	Section 6-122.3 A. The State Board of Education shall grant an
23	alternative placement teaching certificate to a person who makes
24	application to the Board and meets the following criteria:

- 1. a. holds at least a baccalaureate degree from an
 institution whose accreditation is recognized by the
 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and has
 attained a retention grade point average of not less
 than 2.50 on a 4.0 scale, or
- has successfully completed a terminal degree, such as 6 b. a doctorate of philosophy, a doctorate in education, 7 professional doctorates, a master of fine arts degree 8 9 or a master of library science degree, from an institution accredited by a national or regional 10 accrediting agency which is recognized by the 11 12 Secretary of the United States Department of Education. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 13 Education shall be consulted to verify other terminal 14 15 degrees, or
- 16 c. holds at least a baccalaureate degree from an
 17 institution whose accreditation is recognized by the
 18 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and has
 19 qualified work experience in a field that corresponds
 20 to an area of certification as determined by the State
 21 Board of Education, and
- d. in addition to the requirements of subparagraphs a, b
 and c of this paragraph, has demonstrated competency
 or completed a major in a field that corresponds to an

area of specialization for an Elementary-Secondary Certificate or a Secondary Certificate as determined by the State Board of Education or a vocationaltechnical certificate as recommended by the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education;

Declares the intention to earn standard certification by 6 2. means of an alternative placement program in not more than three (3) 7 years. The State Board of Education shall determine the subject 8 9 matter and the number of clock or semester hours required for the professional education component for each person making application 10 for an alternative placement teaching certificate based on the 11 criteria of paragraph 1 of this subsection. 12

The State Board of Education shall establish a core minimum of six (6) semester hours or ninety (90) clock hours and a maximum of eighteen (18) semester hours or two hundred seventy (270) clock hours for the professional education component.

17 The requirements set forth in this subsection shall exclude all 18 student teaching requirements pursuant to the provisions of 19 subsection E of this section;

3. Has passed the general education and subject area portions portion of the competency examination required in Section 6-187 of this title in the area of specialization for which certification is sought; and

1 4. Either presents a document from an accredited public school 2 district in this state offering employment in the area of specialization for which certification is sought on condition that 3 the person enroll in an alternative placement program approved by 4 5 the State Board of Education or declares the intention to seek employment as a teacher at an accredited public school district in 6 this state. The certificate granted pursuant to this subsection 7 shall be considered a "valid certificate of qualification" for the 8 9 purposes of Sections 6-107 and 6-108 of this title, and the holder of the certificate shall be considered an inductee for the purposes 10 of Section 6-195 of this title. 11

B. An alternative placement teaching certificate shall be renewed for not more than a maximum of three (3) years upon presentation of a document from an accredited public school district in this state offering renewed employment in the same area of specialization and a document from a teacher education institution verifying satisfactory progress in an appropriate alternative placement program.

C. Persons enrolled in an alternative placement program shall:
 1. Have never been denied admittance to a teacher education
 program approved by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education,
 the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and by the
 Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation to offer teacher
 education programs, nor have enrolled in and subsequently failed

courses necessary to successfully meet the minimum requirements of
 the program, except those persons who hold a certificate;

3 2. Have on file with the director of teacher education at an
4 Oklahoma institution of higher education a plan for meeting standard
5 certification requirements within three (3) years; and

3. Participate in an induction program as required in Section
6-195 of this title and have the same duties and responsibilities as
8 other inductees.

9 D. The State Board of Education may grant an exception to the 10 requirements for certification and, upon demonstration by an 11 individual of specific competency in the subject area of 12 specialization, may grant a certificate to the individual. The 13 State Board may establish other requirements necessary to grant 14 exceptions.

The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 15 Ε. Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability, may grant an 16 exception to the requirement to complete a subject area examination 17 for initial certification in a field which does not require an 18 advanced degree pursuant to this section if the candidate has an 19 advanced degree in a subject that is substantially comparable to the 20 content assessed on a subject area examination. The degree shall be 21 from an institution accredited by a national or regional accrediting 22 agency which is recognized by the Secretary of the U.S. Department 23

of Education. The Commission shall provide the Board with the
 necessary information to determine comparability.

F. Student teaching and a prestudent teaching field experience
shall not be required of alternative placement program participants
for standard certification.

G. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules
authorizing adjunct teachers who shall be persons with distinguished
qualifications in their field. Adjunct teachers shall not be
required to meet standard certification. Adjunct teachers shall be
limited to two hundred seventy (270) clock hours of classroom
teaching per semester.

H. Each teacher education institution shall provide the
Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation an annual report of
information as specified by the Commission regarding participation
in the alternative placement programs offered by the institution.
I. The Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation shall not

17 accredit, renew the accreditation of, or otherwise approve any 18 teacher education program of any institution of higher education in 19 this state that has not implemented alternative placement programs 20 in at least four areas of specialization, including mathematics, 21 science and a foreign language. Each institution shall allow 22 individuals who meet the criteria of subsections A and C of this 23 section to be:

Admitted to an alternative placement program without further
 qualification; and

2. Offered the opportunity to complete the requirements for
standard certification set forth in subsection A of this section
during the summer preceding and the summer following the first year
of teaching with an alternative placement teaching certificate. Any
person seeking standard certification through an alternative
placement program shall be permitted to take necessary courses
during regular semesters if offered.

J. The criteria specified in subsection I of this section can be met through a cooperative arrangement entered into by two or more institutions of higher education.

13SECTION 2.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-122.11, is14amended to read as follows:

Section 6-122.11 Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, the State Board of Education shall issue a one-year alternative teacher certificate, renewable for up to three (3) years, to teach early childhood education or elementary education to any qualified candidate who:

a. has successfully completed a terminal degree, such as
 a doctorate of philosophy, a doctorate in education,
 professional doctorates, a master of fine arts degree
 or a master of library science degree, from an
 institution accredited by a national or regional

holds at least a baccalaureate degree from an 6 b. institution whose accreditation is recognized by the 7 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and has 8 9 two (2) years post-degree-completion qualified work experience in a field that corresponds to early 10 childhood education or elementary education; and 11 12 2. Declares the intention to earn standard certification by means of the early childhood and elementary education alternative 13 certification program in not more than three (3) years and has: 14

within the first year satisfactorily completed six (6) 15 a. credit hours in classroom management and reading 16 instruction from an educator preparation program 17 approved and accredited by the Commission for 18 Educational Quality and Accountability, completed the 19 required State Department of Education approved 20 training on cognitive science of how students learn to 21 read and participated in a yearlong mentorship or 22 instructional coaching in reading and classroom 23 management provided by the employing school district 24

prior to the renewal of the provisional certificate for a second year,

within the second year satisfactorily completed six 3 b. (6) credit hours in child development and math 4 5 instruction from an educator preparation program approved and accredited by the Commission for 6 Educational Quality and Accountability, participated 7 in an additional yearlong mentorship and/or 8 9 instructional coaching in child development and math instruction provided by the employing school district 10 prior to the renewal of the provisional certificate 11 12 for a third year, and successfully completed the general education and subject area portions portion of 13 the competency examination required in Section 6-187 14 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes in the area of 15 specialization for which certification is sought, and 16 within the third year satisfactorily completed six (6) 17 с. additional credit hours of professional education 18 coursework from an educator preparation program 19 approved and accredited by the Commission for 20 Educational Quality and Accountability, participated 21 in an additional yearlong mentorship and/or 22 instructional coaching provided by the employing 23 school district, and successfully passed the 24

"Commission" means the Commission for Educational Quality 9 2. 10 and Accountability; 3. "State Regents" means the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 11 12 Education; 4. "Professional development program" means the program 13 mandated by the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act for the continuous 14 improvement and enrichment of the certified and licensed teachers of 15 this state; 16 5. Induction programs may involve a committee of one 3 or more mentor teachers, the principal or an assistant principal of 4 5 the employing school, one or more administrators designated by the school district board of education, a teacher educator in a college 6 or school of education of an institution of higher education or an 7 educator in a department or school outside the institution's teacher 8 9 education unit;

10 8. "Teacher" means a person defined as a teacher in Section 1-11 116 of this title;

12 9. "Inductee" means any certified teacher who is employed in an accredited school to serve as a teacher and the school district has 13 elected to place under the guidance and assistance of a mentor 14 teacher or induction committee. Inductees shall include those 15 individuals having completed the program of the college or school of 16 education of the accredited institution of higher education from 17 which the person has been graduated, and shall have successfully 18 completed the competency examination in areas of approval in which 19 the inductee seeks certification, those individuals eligible for the 20 alternative placement teaching certificate according to Section 6-21 122.3 of this title, and those individuals issued an emergency or 22 provisional certificate according to Section 6-187 of this title. 23 All teachers working in a new role, including classroom teachers 24

1 transitioning to a new role, shall be considered inductees for 2 purposes of induction programs;

3 10. "Certified teacher" means any teacher who has been issued a 4 certificate by the Board in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher 5 Preparation Act and the rules of the Board;

6 11. "Mentor teacher" means any teacher who has been appointed 7 to provide guidance, support, coaching and assistance to an inductee 8 employed by the school district. A mentor teacher shall be a 9 current or former classroom teacher and have a minimum of two (2) 10 years of classroom teaching experience as a certified teacher.

11 When possible, a mentor teacher shall have participated in 12 mentor teacher professional development and have expertise in the 13 teaching field of the inductee;

14 12. "Higher education faculty" means any individual who is 15 employed in a teaching capacity in an institution of higher 16 education, approved or accredited by the Commission for the 17 preparation of education personnel; and

18 13. "Competency examination" means the assessment required in 19 the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act for certification as a teacher 20 and shall consist of tests over general education, professional 21 education and subject areas as defined by the Commission for 22 Educational Quality and Accountability.

23 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-187, is 24 amended to read as follows:

1 Section 6-187. A. Prior to July 1, 2014, a competency 2 examination shall be adopted by the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation and beginning July 1, 2014, a competency examination 3 shall be adopted by the Commission for Educational Quality and 4 5 Accountability for the general education, professional education and various subject areas and grade levels for purposes of ensuring 6 academic achievement and competency of each teacher candidate or 7 teacher in the subject area the person is seeking certification to 8 9 teach which shall also include certification as an administrator, as 10 prescribed by the State Board of Education.

11 The Commission, consistent with the purposes of this section, 12 shall promulgate rules and procedures to guarantee the 13 confidentiality of examinations.

No teacher candidate shall be eligible for certification в. 14 until successfully completing the competency examination except 15 those candidates who make application to the State Board and meet 16 the criteria for the alternative placement program pursuant to 17 Section 6-122.3 of this title. Certification shall be limited to 18 areas of approval in which the certified teacher has successfully 19 completed the examination. Subject to the provisions of subsection 20 C of this section, testing for certification for subjects in which a 21 teacher candidate or teacher is seeking a minor teaching assignment 22 or an endorsement to teach shall be limited to the specific subject 23 24 area test.

C. 1. Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, a
teacher may be certified in as many areas as the teacher meets the
necessary requirements provided by law and has successfully
completed the subject area portion of the examination.

8 2. Except as otherwise provided for in this paragraph,
9 certification in early childhood, elementary, or special education
10 shall require completion of an appropriate teacher education program
11 approved by the Commission.

12 Any teacher who is certified to teach elementary education may be certified in early childhood education upon meeting the 13 requirements provided in law and successful completion of the 14 appropriate subject area portion of the examination. Any teacher 15 who is certified to teach early childhood education may be certified 16 in elementary education upon meeting the requirements provided in 17 law and successful completion of the appropriate subject area 18 portion of the examination. Any special education teacher who 19 becomes certified to teach through completion of an accredited 20 teacher preparation program may be certified in early childhood or 21 elementary education upon meeting the requirements provided in law 22 and successful completion of the appropriate subject portion of the 23 examination. Any teacher who becomes certified to teach through 24

1 completion of an accredited teacher preparation program or becomes 2 alternatively certified to teach through the Troops to Teachers program may be certified in special education upon meeting the 3 requirements provided in law and successful completion of the 4 5 appropriate subject area portion of the examination. Any special education teacher who has not completed a Commission-approved 6 teacher education program in elementary education or early childhood 7 education but who has successfully completed the subject area 8 9 portion of the examination may be certified in elementary education 10 or early childhood education for the purpose of providing direct instruction and serving as the teacher of record for grading 11 12 purposes in special education settings only.

D. The Commission shall offer the competency examination at least four times per calendar year on dates to be established by the Commission.

Ε. If a teacher candidate or teacher is a non-native-English 16 speaker, the Commission shall offer the subject area competency 17 examination in the native language of the teacher candidate or 18 teacher only if the teacher candidate or teacher is employed or has 19 been offered employment by a school district as a teacher in a 20 foreign language immersion program offered by the school district. 21 If a non-native-English speaker who has received certification in a 22 subject area after taking the subject area competency examination in 23 the native language of the speaker seeks to add a certification area 24

1 in the future and that person is no longer employed as a teacher in a foreign language immersion program, the examination for the 2 additional certification area shall be taken in English. The State 3 Board of Education shall issue a restricted license or certificate 4 5 to any teacher who has completed a subject area competency examination in the native language of the teacher as provided for in 6 this subsection restricting the teacher to teaching only in a 7 foreign language immersion program. 8

9 F. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 10 Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability, may grant an exception to the requirement to complete a subject area examination 11 12 for initial certification in a field which does not require an advanced degree if the candidate has an advanced degree in a subject 13 that is substantially comparable to the content assessed on a 14 subject area examination. The advanced degree shall be from an 15 institution accredited by a national or regional accrediting agency 16 which is recognized by the Secretary of the United States Department 17 of Education. The Commission shall provide the Board with the 18 necessary information to determine comparability. 19

G. 1. Nothing in the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act shall
restrict the right of the State Board of Education to issue an
emergency or provisional certificate, as needed. Provided, however,
prior to the issuance of an emergency certificate, the district
shall document substantial efforts to employ a teacher who holds a

In the event a district is unable to hire an individual meeting this criteria, the district 2 shall document efforts to employ an individual with a provisional or 3 standard certificate in another curricular area with academic 4 5 preparation in the field of need. Only after these alternatives have been exhausted shall the district be allowed to employ an 6 individual meeting minimum standards as established by the State 7 Board of Education for the issuance of emergency certificates. 8

9 2. The State Board of Education may renew the emergency or 10 provisional certificate of an individual who has been employed by a 11 school district board of education for at least two (2) years if the 12 following criteria are met:

- a. the individual has been granted an emergency or
 provisional certificate pursuant to paragraph 1 of
 this subsection for two (2) years,
- b. the individual has not successfully completed the
 competency examinations required by this section,
 c. the individual submits a portfolio of his or her work
 to the State Board of Education, which shall include
 - evidence of progress toward standard certification,
- d. the employing school district board of education
 agrees to renew the individual's contract to teach for
 the ensuing fiscal year, and
- 24

e. the superintendent of the employing school district submits to the State Board of Education the reason the emergency or provisional certificate should be renewed and provides evidence of the district's inability to hire a teacher who holds a standard certificate.

3. Individuals employed by a school district under an emergency
or provisional certificate shall not be considered career teachers
and therefore not entitled to the protections of the Teacher Due
Process Act of 1990.

10SECTION 5.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-189.2, is11amended to read as follows:

Section 6-189.2 A. Any person seeking certification as a school psychologist or school psychometrist shall be exempt from the requirement to successfully complete the general education and professional education portions portion of the competency examination required pursuant to Sections 6-187 and 6-190 of this title.

B. Any person certified as a school psychologist or school psychometrist pursuant to a substitution or exemption as provided in this section shall be required to complete all portions of the competency examination as required pursuant to Sections 6-187 and 6-190 of this title if such person seeks to add certification in another subject in the future.

1	C. The Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation shall adopt
2	rules to implement the provisions of this section.
3	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
5	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
