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7	An Act relating to the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program;
8	amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 13-101.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 1, O.S.L. 2020 (70 O.S.
9	Supp. 2020, Section 13-101.2), which relates to eligibility for the program; modifying discrimination
10	prohibition to which participating private schools must comply; updating reference; providing an
11	effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 13-101.2, as
16	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 1, O.S.L. 2020 (70 O.S. Supp.
17	2020, Section 13-101.2), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 13-101.2. A. There is hereby created the Lindsey
19	Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program.
20	The Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities
21	Program is established to provide a scholarship to a private school
22	of choice for students with disabilities for whom an individualized
23	education program (IEP) in accordance with the Individuals with
24	Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) or an individualized service plan

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pursuant to Section 1-4-704 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes has been developed at any time prior to notifying the State Department of Education of the intent to participate in the Program and the IEP is in effect at the time the request for a scholarship is received by the State Department of Education. Scholarships shall be awarded beginning with the 2010-2011 school year.

B. The parent or legal guardian of a public school student with a disability may exercise their parental option and request to have a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship awarded for the child to enroll in and attend a private school in accordance with this section and the scholarship shall be awarded if:

12 1. The student has spent the prior school year in attendance at a public school in this state. For purposes of this section, "prior 13 school year in attendance" means that the student was enrolled in 14 15 and reported by a school district for funding purposes during the 16 preceding school year regardless of whether or not the student had an IEP at the time the student was counted for funding purposes. A 17 student who is a child of a member of the United States Armed Forces 18 who transfers to a school in this state from out of state or from a 19 foreign country pursuant to a permanent change of station orders of 20 the parent shall be exempt from the requirements of this paragraph 21 but shall be required to meet all other eligibility requirements to 22 participate as provided for in this section. A student who has been 23 provided services under an Individual Family Service Plan through 24

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1 the SoonerStart program and during transition was evaluated and 2 determined to be eligible for school district services shall be 3 exempt from the requirements of this paragraph but shall be required to meet all other eligibility requirements to participate as 4 5 provided for in this section. A student who was in out-of-home placement with the Department of Human Services, who was adopted 6 7 while in the permanent custody of the Department of Human Services or who was in out-of-home placement with the Office of Juvenile 8 9 Affairs shall be exempt from the requirements of this paragraph but 10 shall be required to meet all other eligibility requirements to participate as provided for in this section; and 11

12 2. The parent or legal guardian has obtained acceptance for admission of the student to a private school that is eligible for 13 the program as provided in subsection H of this section and has 14 15 notified the State Department of Education of the request for a 16 scholarship. Requests to participate in the program made after December 1 shall be granted, but funding for scholarships requested 17 after December 1 shall not be available until the beginning of the 18 next school year. The request shall be through a communication 19 directly to the Department in a manner that creates a written or 20 electronic record of the request and the date of receipt of the 21 request. The Department shall notify the school district upon 22 receipt of the request. For purposes of continuity of educational 23 choice, the scholarship shall remain in force until the student 24

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returns to a public school, graduates from high school or reaches the age of twenty-two (22), whichever occurs first. At any time, the parent or legal guardian of the student may remove the student from the private school and place the student in another private school that is eligible for the program as provided in subsection H of this section or place the student in a public school.

7 C. A student shall be eligible for a scholarship if the parent or legal guardian of the student made a request for a scholarship 8 9 for the 2010-2011 school year and the student transferred to an 10 eligible private school but was subsequently denied a scholarship 11 because the student did not have an IEP in effect on October 1, 12 2009, but did meet all other eligibility requirements as set forth in the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with 13 Disabilities Program Act. 14

D. A student shall not be eligible for a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship if the student is not having regular and direct contact with the private school teachers at the physical location of the private school.

E. School districts shall notify the parent or legal guardian of a public school student with a disability of all options available pursuant to this section and inform the parent or legal guardian of the availability of information about the program from the State Department of Education through the toll-free telephone number or website. The notification shall be provided with or

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included in the copy of the "Parents Rights in Special Education:
 Notice of Procedural Safeguards" document given to parents at least
 annually or as otherwise required by law.

F. 1. Acceptance of a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship shall
have the same effect as a parental revocation of consent to service
pursuant to 20 U.S.C., Sections 1414(a)(1)(D) and 1414(C) of the
IDEA.

8 2. Upon acceptance of a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship, the 9 parent or legal guardian shall assume full financial responsibility 10 for the education of the student, including but not limited to 11 transportation to and from the private school.

12 G. If the parent or legal guardian requests a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship and the student is accepted by the private school 13 pending the availability of a space for the student, the parent or 14 15 legal guardian of the student shall notify the State Department of Education before entering the private school and before December 1 16 in order to be eligible for the scholarship during the school year 17 when a space becomes available for the student in the private 18 school. If notification is made after December 1, payment of the 19 scholarship shall not begin until the next school year. 20

H. 1. To be eligible to participate in the Lindsey Nicole
Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program, a private
school shall notify the State Department of Education of its intent
to participate. The notice shall specify the grade levels and

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services that the private school has available for students with disabilities who are participating in the scholarship program. The State Department of Education shall approve a private school as eligible to participate in the scholarship program upon determination that the private school:

meets the accreditation requirements set by the State 6 a. 7 Board of Education or another accrediting association approved by the State Board of Education. The State 8 9 Department of Education shall list on its website all 10 accrediting associations approved by the Board, demonstrates fiscal soundness by having been in 11 b. 12 operation for one (1) school year or providing the State Department of Education with a statement by a 13 certified public accountant confirming that the 14 15 private school desiring to participate is insured and the owner or owners have sufficient capital or credit 16 to operate the school for the upcoming year by serving 17 the number of students anticipated with expected 18 revenues from tuition and other sources that may be 19 reasonably expected. In lieu of a statement, a surety 20 bond or letter of credit for the amount equal to the 21 scholarship funds for any quarter may be filed with 22 the Department, 23

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1 complies with the antidiscrimination prohibits с. 2 discrimination on the basis of race, color and 3 national origin in compliance with the provisions of 42 U.S.C., Section 2000d, 4 5 d. meets state and local health and safety laws and 6 codes, 7 will be academically accountable to the parent or e. legal guardian for meeting the educational needs of 8 9 the student, f. employs or contracts with teachers who hold 10 baccalaureate or higher degrees, or have at least 11 12 three (3) years of teaching experience in public or private schools, or have special skills, knowledge, or 13 expertise that qualifies them to provide instruction 14 15 in subjects taught, complies with all state laws relating to general 16 g. regulation of private schools, and 17 adheres to the tenets of its published disciplinary 18 h. procedures prior to the expulsion of a scholarship 19 student. 20 2. Upon approval of a private school, the State Department of 21 Education shall provide on its website all information and material 22 submitted by the private school with its application. 23

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I. 1. Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship Program participants
 shall comply with the following:

- a. the parent or legal guardian shall select the private
 school from the schools approved for eligibility
 pursuant to subsection H of this section and apply for
 the admission of the child,
- b. the parent or legal guardian shall request the
 scholarship no later than December 1 of the school
 year during which the scholarship is requested,
- 10 c. any student participating in the scholarship program 11 shall attend throughout the school year, unless 12 excused by the school for illness or other good cause, 13 and shall comply fully with the code of conduct for 14 the school,
- d. the parent or legal guardian shall fully comply with
 the parental involvement requirements of the private
 school, unless excused by the school for illness or
 other good cause, and
- e. upon issuance of a scholarship warrant, the parent or
 legal guardian to whom the warrant is made shall
 restrictively endorse the warrant to the private
 school for deposit into the account of the private
 school. The parent or legal guardian may not
 designate any entity or individual associated with the

private school as the attorney in fact for the parent or legal guardian to endorse a warrant. A parent or legal guardian who fails to comply with this subparagraph shall forfeit the scholarship.

5 2. A participant who fails to comply with this subsection6 forfeits the scholarship.

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J. Provisions governing payment of a Lindsey Nicole Henry8 Scholarship shall be as follows:

9 1. The State Department of Education shall calculate the total
10 cost of all scholarships for all eligible students in the state.
11 The State Department of Education shall then reserve or retain from
12 the total amount appropriated to the State Board of Education for
13 State Aid purposes and any other revenue available for allocation
14 for State Aid purposes the total cost for all scholarship payments;

15 2. The maximum scholarship granted for an eligible student with disabilities shall be a calculated amount equivalent to the total 16 State Aid factors for the applicable school year multiplied by the 17 grade and disability weights generated by that student for the 18 applicable school year. The disability weights used in calculating 19 the scholarship amount shall include all disability weights which 20 correspond to the disabilities included in the multidisciplinary 21 evaluation and eligibility group summary for the student at the time 22 the request for a scholarship is made by the parent or legal 23 The maximum scholarship amount shall be calculated by the 24 quardian.

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State Board of Education for each year the student is participating
 in the scholarship program;

3 3. The amount of the scholarship shall be the amount calculated in paragraph 2 of this subsection or the amount of tuition and fees 4 5 for the private school, whichever is less, minus up to two and onehalf percent (2 1/2%) of the scholarship amount which may be 6 7 retained by the State Department of Education as a fee for administrative services rendered. The amount of any assessment fee 8 9 required by the private school and the amount associated with 10 providing services and therapies to address the disabilities of the 11 student may be paid from the total amount of the scholarship. The 12 amount of the scholarship shall be prorated to reflect the number of days remaining in the current school year, if the scholarship 13 request is granted after the beginning of the school year; 14

15 The State Department of Education shall notify the private 4. school of the amount of the scholarship within ten (10) days after 16 receiving the request for a scholarship, when the total State Aid 17 factors have been determined for the current fiscal year. 18 The initial payment shall be made after the Department verifies 19 admission acceptance and enrollment. Quarterly payments shall be 20 made upon verification of continued enrollment and attendance at the 21 private school. Payment shall be made by the Department with an 22 individual warrant made payable to the parent or legal guardian of 23 24 the student and mailed by the Department to the private school that

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1 the parent or legal guardian chooses. The parent or legal guardian 2 shall restrictively endorse the warrant to the private school for 3 deposit into the account of the private school;

5. The State Department of Education shall not be responsible
for any additional costs associated with special education and
related services incurred by the private school for the student
including the cost of teachers, equipment, material, and special
costs associated with the special education class;

9 6. The State Department of Education shall establish a toll-10 free telephone number or website that provides parents or legal 11 guardians and private schools with information about the program;

12 7. The State Department of Education shall require an annual, 13 notarized, sworn compliance statement by participating private 14 schools certifying compliance with state laws and shall retain all 15 records received from a participating private school. The State 16 Department of Education shall post on its website the annual 17 compliance statement for each participating private school; and

8. The State Department of Education shall cross-check the list
 of participating scholarship students with the public school
 enrollments prior to each scholarship payment to avoid duplication.

K. 1. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall deny, suspend, or revoke the participation of a private school in the scholarship program if it is determined that the private school has failed to comply with the provisions of this section. However,

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in instances in which the noncompliance is correctable within a
reasonable amount of time and in which the health, safety, or
welfare of the students is not threatened, the Superintendent may
issue a notice of noncompliance which shall provide the private
school with a time frame within which to provide evidence of
compliance prior to taking action to suspend or revoke participation
in the scholarship program.

2. If the Superintendent intends to deny, suspend, or revoke 8 9 the participation of a private school in the scholarship program, 10 the Department shall notify the private school of the proposed 11 action in writing by certified mail and regular mail to the private 12 school's address of record with the Department. The Department shall also notify any parents or legal guardians of scholarship 13 students attending the private school. The notification shall 14 15 include the reasons for the proposed action and notice of the timelines and procedures set forth in this subsection. 16

17 3. The private school that is adversely affected by the 18 proposed action shall have fifteen (15) days from receipt of the 19 notice of proposed action to file with the Department a request for 20 an administrative hearing proceeding pursuant to the Administrative 21 Procedures Act.

4. Upon receipt of a request for a hearing, the State Board ofEducation shall commence a hearing within sixty (60) days after the

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receipt of the formal written request and enter an order within
 thirty (30) days after the hearing.

5. The Board may immediately suspend payment of scholarship funds if it is determined that there is probable cause to believe that there is an imminent threat to the health, safety, or welfare of the students or fraudulent activity on the part of the private school.

8 L. No liability shall arise on the part of the state, the State 9 Board of Education, the State Department of Education or a school 10 district based on the award or use of any scholarship provided 11 through the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with 12 Disabilities Program.

M. The inclusion of private schools within options available to public school students in Oklahoma shall not expand the regulatory authority of the state or any school district to impose any additional regulation of private schools beyond those reasonably necessary to enforce the requirements expressly set forth in this section.

N. If the State Department of Education determines that a school district prior to the effective date of this act August 26, <u>2011</u>, has failed to comply with the provisions of the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program Act and has failed to make full or partial scholarship payments for eligible students, the Department shall have authority to reduce the amount

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of State Aid allocated to the school district or require the school district to make repayment to the Department of State Aid allocations in an amount equal to the amount of scholarship payments the school district failed to make. The Department shall make payment to the parent or legal guardian in the amount the school district failed to make in the manner as provided for in subsection J of this section.

8 O. The State Department of Education shall annually prepare and 9 post on its website a report of Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships 10 for Students with Disabilities Program. The annual report shall 11 include, but not be limited to, the following information:

The total number and amount of scholarships awarded and
 reported for each participating private school;

14 2. The total number of scholarships denied;

The total number and amount of scholarship payments
 suspended for each participating private school; and

Data on participating students, disaggregated by years of
 participation in the program, grade level, economically
 disadvantaged status, racial and ethnic groups and disability
 category.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
