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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10 O.S. 2021, Section 640.1, is		
16	amended to read as follows:		
17	Section 640.1. A. There is hereby re-created until July 1,		
18	2024, in accordance with the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the Oklahoma		
19	Partnership for School Readiness Board. The Board shall promote		
20	school readiness supporting community-based efforts to increase the		
21	number of children who are ready to succeed by the time they enter		
22	school. The Board shall additionally serve as the state's Early		
23	Childhood Advisory Council and fulfill the responsibilities		
24	described in the Head Start Act of 2007 (PL 110-134, Section 642B).		

1 The Board shall consist of representatives from the private and public sectors as follows: 1. Fifteen private sector representatives appointed by the 3 Governor from a list submitted by an existing private-sector school 4 5 readiness initiative that includes in its focus community mobilization and public engagement activities to include: 6 two parents of children eight (8) years of age or 7 a. younger, and 8 9 b. one representative of licensed child care providers; 2. One representative of the licensed child care industry 10 appointed by the Governor from a list submitted by an association 11 12 representing the licensed child care industry in this state; 3. One representative of a state association of federally 13 funded early childhood programs appointed by the Governor; and 14 To ensure that existing resources are being utilized 15 effectively, fifteen public sector representatives or their 16 17 designees as follows: State Superintendent of Public Instruction, 18 State Commissioner of Health, b. 19 Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and 20 C. Substance Abuse Services, 21

d. Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce,

e. Director of the Oklahoma Department of Libraries,

f. Director of the Department of Human Services,

17	B. Membe	rs appointed by the Governor shall serve terms of four
18	(4) years; pr	ovided, of those members initially appointed to the
19	Board, eight:	members shall be appointed for two-year terms,
20	beginning Sep	tember 1, 2003, and seven members shall be appointed
21	for four-year	terms, beginning September 1, 2003, as designated by
22	the Governor.	The member appointed pursuant to paragraph 2 of
23	subsection A	of this section shall be appointed for an initial term

to end on August 31, 2007. The member appointed pursuant to

- 1 paragraph 3 of subsection A of this section shall be appointed for
- 2 | an initial term to end on August 31, 2009. Appointed members shall
- 3 | continue in office until a successor is appointed by the Governor.
- 4 | The Governor shall fill all vacancies in the same manner as the
- 5 original appointment was made.
- 6 C. The Director of the Department of Human Services shall
- 7 | convene an organizational meeting of the Oklahoma Partnership for
- 8 | School Readiness Board prior to November 1, 2003, at which time
- 9 members of the Board shall elect a chair, a vice-chair vice chair,
- 10 and other officers as needed. A majority of the members of the
- 11 | Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- D. Members of the Board shall receive no compensation for
- 13 | serving on the Board but shall receive travel reimbursement as
- 14 follows:
- 1. State agency officers and employees who are members of the
- 16 | Board shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the
- 17 performance of their duties by their respective agencies in
- 18 | accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act; and
- 2. Remaining members shall be reimbursed by the Board from any
- 20 | funds received by the Board for travel expenses incurred in the
- 21 performance of their duties in accordance with the State Travel
- 22 Reimbursement Act.

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1	E. Members of the Board shall be exempt from the dual-office-
2	holding provisions of Section 6 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma
3	Statutes.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
5	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
