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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-133, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1-133. A. As used in this section:
20	1. <u>"Health care entity" means:</u>
21	<u>a.</u> <u>a health plan that, either as an individual or group,</u>
22	provides for, or pays the cost of, medical care,
23	b. a health care provider that offers or renders medical
24	or health services, or

1	c. any further individual or association defined as a
2	covered entity under 45 C.F.R., Section 160.103;
3	2. "Health information exchange" means the electronic movement
4	of health-related information among organizations according to
5	nationally recognized standards for purposes including, but not
6	limited to, payment, treatment, and administration; and
7	$\frac{2}{2}$. "Health information exchange organization" means an
8	entity whose primary business activity is health information
9	exchange; and
10	3. "Oklahoma State Health Information Network and Exchange" or
11	"OKSHINE" means a health information exchange organization charged
12	with facilitating the exchange of health information to and from
13	authorized individuals and health care organizations in this state
14	and.
15	B. The State of Oklahoma shall serve as or shall designate the
16	state-designated state designated entity for health information
17	exchange.
18	B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) shall establish a
19	health information exchange certification with input from
20	stakeholders. Such certification shall be required in order for a
21	health information exchange organization to qualify as an Oklahoma
22	Statewide Health Information Exchange (OKHIE). Until such time as
23	the health information exchange certification is established by

an OKHIE shall mean either OKSHINE or a health information

1 exchange organization that was previously certified by the Oklahoma 2 Health Information Exchange Trust. C. The Oklahoma State Health Information Network and Exchange 3 (OKSHINE) shall be organized for the purpose of improving the health 4 5 of residents of this state by: 1. Promoting efficient and effective communication among 6 multiple health care providers including, but not limited to, 7 hospitals, physicians, payers, employers, pharmacies, laboratories, 9 and other health care entities or health information exchange 10 networks and organizations; 2. Creating efficiencies in health care costs by eliminating 11 12 redundancy in data capture and storage and reducing administrative, 13 billing, and data collection costs; 3. Creating the ability to monitor community health status; and 14 4. Providing reliable information to health care consumers and 15 purchasers regarding the quality of health care. 16 C. Beginning July 1, 2023, all health care entities licensed by 17 and located in this state shall report data to and utilize the state 18 designated entity. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority may, as 19 provided by rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority 20 Board, allow exemptions from the requirement provided by this 21

subsection on the basis of financial hardship, size, or

as may be provided by rules promulgated by the Board.

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- D. 1. A person who participates in the services or information provided by OKSHINE or an OKHIE the state designated entity shall not be liable in any action for damages or costs of any nature that result solely from the person's use or failure to use either an OKHIE or OKSHINE information or data from the state designated entity that was entered or retrieved under relevant state or federal privacy laws, rules, regulations, or policies including, but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
 - 2. A person shall not be subject to antitrust or unfair competition liability based on participation in OKSHINE or an OKHIE with the state designated entity as long as the participation provides an essential governmental function for the public health and safety and enjoys state action immunity.
 - 3. Participating in an OKHIE shall qualify as meeting any requirement to send data to OKSHINE.
 - E. 1. A person who provides information and data to OKSHINE the state designated entity retains a property right in the information or data, but grants to the other participants or subscribers a nonexclusive license to retrieve and use that information or data under relevant state or federal privacy laws, rules, regulations, or policies including, but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.

1	2. All processes or software developed, designed, or purchased
2	by OKSHINE shall remain the property of OKSHINE subject to use by
3	participants or subscribers.
4	F. Patient-specific protected health information shall only be
5	disclosed in accordance with the patient's authorization or in
6	compliance with relevant state or federal privacy laws, rules,
7	regulations $\underline{\hspace{0.1cm}\prime}$ or policies including $\overline{\hspace{0.1cm}\prime}$ but not limited to $\overline{\hspace{0.1cm}\prime}$ the Health
8	Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
9	G. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate
10	rules to implement the provisions of this section.
11	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
12	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
13	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
14	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
15	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
