16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 9-101, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 9-101. A. Any <u>A</u> school district may provide
19	transportation for any <u>a</u> child who is participating in any <u>a</u>
20	prekindergarten or early childhood program operated by the school
21	district or any <u>a</u> child who is participating in any <u>a</u> Head Start
22	program offered within the school district.
23	B. Upon a request for a student transfer pursuant to the
24	provisions of the Education Open Transfer Act, if the parent $\underline{\mathrm{or}}$

SENATE FLOOR VERSION - SB1620 SFLR (Bold face denotes Committee Amendments) 1 legal guardian of the student requests that the receiving district provide transportation for the student, and if the receiving 2 district grants the transfer, then the receiving district may 3 provide such transportation only within the boundaries of the 4 5 receiving school district. A receiving school district shall not cross school district boundaries to transport a kindergarten through 6 eighth-grade student transferred pursuant to the Education Open 7 Transfer Act except as otherwise authorized in Section 9-105 of this 8 9 title.

10 C. Any <u>A</u> school district may provide transportation for each 11 student who should attend any <u>enrolled in a</u> public elementary or 12 secondary school when, and only when, transportation is necessary 13 for accomplishment of one of the following purposes:

To provide adequate educational facilities and opportunities
which otherwise would not be available, which shall include those
purposes provided in the Education Open Transfer Act; and

2. To transport students whose homes are more than a reasonable walking distance, as defined by regulations of the State Board of Education, from the school attended by such student. Provided, that no state funds shall be paid for the transportation of a student whose residence is within one and one-half (1 1/2) miles from the school attended by such student.

23 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-141, is 24 amended to read as follows:

Transportation shall be provided by the charter school in accordance with Sections 9-101 through 9-118 of 2 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and only within the transportation 3 boundaries of the school district in which the charter school is 4 5 located this title. 6 B. A charter school shall provide the parent or legal guardian information regarding transportation at the time the student enrolls 7 in the charter school. 8 SECTION 3. 9 REPEALER 70 O.S. 2021, Section 9-105, is 10 hereby repealed. SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022. 11 12 SECTION 5.
