12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
14 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

15 A. There is hereby established the William S. Key Multi-County  
16 Feasibility Commission until December 31, 2023.

17 B. The Commission shall be composed of seventeen (17) members  
18 as follows:

19 1. One person representing the Oklahoma Historical Society;

20 2. The current elected State Senator for Senate District 27, or  
21 designee;

22 3. The current elected Representative for House of  
23 Representatives District 61 or designee;

1 4. Three members who shall be the elected County Commissioners  
2 for Woodward County, or designees;

3 5. One member who shall be the Woodward County Sheriff, or  
4 designee;

5 6. One member who shall represent the Woodward Industrial  
6 Foundation;

7 7. One member who shall represent the Woodward Chamber of  
8 Commerce;

9 8. One member chosen by the elected State Senator for Senate  
10 District 27 from Beaver County, Cimarron County, Dewey County, and  
11 Ellis County; and

12 9. One member chosen by the elected Representative for House of  
13 Representatives District 61 from Harper County, Major County, Texas  
14 County, and Woods County.

15 C. The members of the Commission shall elect a chair and vice  
16 chair from among the members of the Commission at the first meeting  
17 of the Commission.

18 D. The Commission shall hold its first meeting not later than  
19 ninety (90) days after effective date of this act.

20 E. The Commission is authorized to meet as often as required to  
21 perform the duties imposed upon it.

22 F. The Commission shall study the feasibility of creating a  
23 multi-county trust to oversee the exchange of the state-owned  
24 William S. Key Correctional Facility, surrounding acreage, and

1 property in the Northwest Oklahoma region. The Commission shall  
2 develop recommendations for utilizing the existing facility to  
3 facilitate job stability, economic growth, and business and industry  
4 recruitment in the area.

5 G. Members of the Commission shall not receive reimbursement  
6 for any travel related to the meetings of the Commission.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
