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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1928, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1928. A. As used in this act <u>section and Sections 1-</u>
17	280.1 through 1-280.3 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes:
18	1. a. "Applied behavior analysis" means the design,
19	implementation, and evaluation of instructional and
20	environmental modifications to produce socially
21	significant improvements in human behavior through
22	skill, acquisition, and the reduction of problematic
23	behavior. An applied behavior analysis program shall:
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1			(1) be based on empirical research including the
2			direct observation and measurement of behavior as
3			well as a functional behavior assessment, and
4			(2) utilize antecedent stimuli, positive
5			reinforcement, and other consequences to produce
6			behavior change.
7		b.	Applied behavior analysis does not include cognitive
8			therapies or psychological testing, neuropsychology,
9			psychotherapy, sex therapy, psychoanalysis,
10			hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as treatment
11			modalities;

"Licensed behavior analyst" "Board Certified Behavior 4 5 Analyst" or "BCBA" means an individual who is certified by the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst Certification Board as a 6 7 Board-Certified Behavior Analyst Board and licensed by the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Department; and 8 9 6. "Registered Behavior Technician" or "RBT" means a paraprofessional who is certified by the Board and practices under 10 11 the close, ongoing supervision of a Board Certified Behavior 12 Analyst. The Registered Behavior Technician is primarily responsible for the direct implementation of behavior-analytic 13 services designed and prescribed by a Board Certified Behavior 14 15 Analyst; and 7. "Supervisee" means a person who acts under the extended 16 authority of a licensed behavior analyst to provide applied behavior 17 analysis services or a person who is in training to provide such 18 services Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst or Registered 19 Behavior Technician who acts under the authority and supervision of 20 a Board Certified Behavior Analyst to provide applied behavior 21 analysis services, or a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst 22 or Registered Behavior Technician applicant to provide such services 23 24 as defined by the Board.

1 B. Each person wishing to practice as a licensed behavior 2 analyst or a certified assistant behavior analyst Board Certified 3 Behavior Analyst or a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst shall apply to the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of 4 5 the Department of Human Services using a form and in a manner prescribed by the Division Developmental Disabilities Services and 6 shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Division Developmental 7 Disabilities Services that such person: 8

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1. Is of good moral character;

10 2. Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

Has passed the Board examination and is certified by the Board as a Board-Certified Board Certified Behavior Analyst or a Board-Certified Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst, as applicable; and

4. 2. Has not had a professional license or certification 15 refused, revoked, suspended, or restricted and does not have a 16 complaint, allegation, or investigation pending in any regulatory 17 jurisdiction in the United States or in another country for reasons 18 that relate to unprofessional conduct unless the Division finds, to 19 its satisfaction, that the conduct has been corrected or that 20 mitigating circumstances exist that prevent its resolution; and 21 5. Has at least the minimum graduate or undergraduate degree, 22 appropriate for the level of certification, from an accredited 23 24

1 institution of higher learning in a qualifying field of study, as
2 determined by the Board.

C. A person holding a state license or state certification shall apply for renewal of the state license or state certification on or before April 30 of each odd-numbered year. The application shall be accompanied by a renewal fee to be set by the Division <u>Developmental Disabilities Services</u> in accordance with paragraph 3 of subsection F of this section.

9 D. A person licensed or certified by the Developmental
10 Disabilities Services Division of the Department under this section
11 shall:

Maintain active status and fulfill all requirements for
 renewal of national certification or recertification with the Board;
 and

2. Conduct professional activities in accordance with accepted 15 standards such as the Guidelines for Responsible Conduct and 16 Professional Disciplinary Standards of the Board Board's 17 Professional and Ethical Compliance Code for Behavior Analysts. 18 E. 1. No person shall claim the title of licensed behavior 19 20 analyst or certified assistant behavior analyst Board Certified Behavior Analyst or Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst 21 unless that person meets the applicable requirements in this 22 section. No person shall practice applied behavior analysis without 23 obtaining a license or certification in accordance with this 24

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section. Supervisees may only provide applied behavior analysis under the supervision of a licensed behavior analyst Board Certified <u>Behavior Analyst</u>. This section shall not restrict the practice of applied behavior analysis by human services professionals, provided such individuals are working within the scope of their professions and the practice of applied behavior analysis is commensurate with their level of training and experience.

8 2. A violation of this subsection shall be punishable by a fine 9 of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), the suspension or 10 revocation of a license or certification issued pursuant to this 11 section, or both such fine and loss of licensure or certification.

F. The Division state licensure board operated by the Developmental Disabilities Services shall:

14 1. Investigate all complaints relating to:

15	a.	the practice or supervision of applied behavior
16		analysis by any person licensed by the Developmental
17		Disabilities Services Division of the Department as a
18		behavior analyst or certified by the Division as an
19		assistant behavior analyst Board Certified Behavior
20		Analyst or certified as a Board Certified Assistant
21		Behavior Analyst, or
22	b.	any person alleged to be practicing or providing
23		supervision without a state license or state
24		certification;

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2. Refer any substantiated complaints to the Board; and

2 3. Charge reasonable fees for a license or for certification $_{\tau}$

3 not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

G. 1. A person having a qualifying degree, as provided for in
paragraph 5 of subsection B of this section, and participating in
the applied behavior analysis treatment pilot project established in
Section 3 of this act shall be exempt from the requirements of this
section while such person is actively participating in the project.

9 2. Persons employed by a school district in this state who
10 provide services solely to the school district under the Individuals
11 with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 U.S.C., Section 1400 et
12 seq., shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.

13 H. The supervisee shall not design intervention or assessment

14 plans. It shall be the responsibility of the supervising Board

15 Certified Behavior Analyst to determine which other tasks the

16 supervisee may perform as a function of the supervisee's training,

17 experience and competence. The Board Certified Behavior Analyst

18 shall be responsible for the work performed by the supervisee on the

19 cases overseen by the Board Certified Behavior Analyst.

<u>I. A Board Certified Behavior Analyst, Board Certified</u>
 <u>Assistant Behavior Analyst or Registered Behavior Technician who is</u>
 <u>a guardian or parent shall not provide services to his or her own</u>
 child or ward.

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1	J. The Department <u>Director of Human Services</u> shall promulgate
2	rules to implement the provisions of this section.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
