21	more than forty-eight (48) hours after the death has occurred. The
22	medical examiner or a medical examiner investigator currently
23	certified by the American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators
24	shall interview the parent, legal guardian or caregiver of, or

1	person who last had contact with, the deceased infant and shall fill
2	out the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's SUIDI reporting
3	form accordingly. The State Department of Health shall retain a

5	accurate and reliable data on SUIDI to aid and inform the policies
6	of the Department, and the Department shall provide a copy of each
7	completed SUIDI reporting form to the Child Death Review Board.
8	B. As used in this section, "medical examiner" means the Chief
9	Medical Examiner, the Deputy Chief Medical Examiner or a medical
10	examiner appointed by the Chief Medical Examiner pursuant to Section
11	937 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
