6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to offenders; providing for extension  
8 of certain driver licenses; providing for certain  
9 eligibility; providing for certain agreement and  
10 issuance of provisional license; authorizing rule  
11 promulgation; providing for codification; and  
12 declaring an emergency.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-205.3 of Title 47, unless  
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. Any person:

18 1. Who has been convicted of an offense other than an offense  
19 requiring mandatory revocation of the individual's driver license,  
20 pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-205 of Title 47 of the  
21 Oklahoma Statutes; and

22 2. Who held a valid, unexpired driver license upon imprisonment  
23 in the custody of the Department of Corrections, regardless of  
24 expiration date, shall not be considered to have an expired driver  
25 license during the duration of imprisonment for a period of one

1 hundred eighty (180) days after discharge from incarceration. This  
2 law shall not be construed to confer driving privileges in any  
3 jurisdiction other than Oklahoma.

4 B. A person qualifying for extension of the driver license, as  
5 provided for in subsection A of this section, shall be eligible to  
6 obtain a REAL ID Noncompliant driver license prior to discharge from  
7 an institution of the Department of Corrections from the Department  
8 of Public Safety pursuant to the provisions of Section 513.3 of  
9 Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The REAL ID Noncompliant driver  
10 license will be valid for a period of one hundred eighty (180) days.

11 C. The Department of Corrections may utilize any funds  
12 available to cover the costs associated with the implementation and  
13 administration of this section and the purchase of REAL ID  
14 Noncompliant driver licenses including, but not limited to, inmate  
15 trust funds, existing funds of the Department of Corrections and  
16 donations. The fee charged for the issuance of a REAL ID  
17 Noncompliant driver license pursuant to this section shall be  
18 deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund. No  
19 person sixty-five (65) years of age or older shall be charged a fee  
20 for a REAL ID Noncompliant driver license.

21 D. Prior to the expiration of the one hundred eighty-day  
22 license, the person shall be eligible to enter into an agreement  
23 with the Department of Public Safety for issuance of a provisional  
24 license as provided for in subsection D of Section 6-212 of Title 47

1 of the Oklahoma Statutes, with the condition that such person pays a  
2 minimum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per month toward the satisfaction of  
3 outstanding fees and fines including, but not limited to,  
4 provisional license fees, warrant fees, court costs or fees, driver  
5 license or commercial driver license reinstatement fees. The  
6 Department may suspend or revoke a provisional license if the person  
7 fails to honor the payment plan.

8 E. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to promulgate  
9 rules and procedures to implement the provisions of this section.

10 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
11 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
12 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
13 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
